She was advised to purchase two Apple gift cards and then text the number provided with pictures of the information on the cards to activate them. After doing so, she realized she was the victim of a scam. SO240006867
04/17/2024	Aldie	Microsoft Scam: Complainant reported that her computer showed a pop-up message from what she thought was Microsoft. The message stated her computer was hacked. The complainant called the number provided and was advised her bank account had been hacked and she needed to withdraw a large sum of money. She was advised that the bank would send someone to her house to pick up the money and would provide her with the secret password she was previously told. After turning over her money to the person picking it up, she checked her bank account and it showed all of her money was there. When she checked her account again the next day, she found her money was gone and realized she was the victim of a scam. The case is under investigation. SO240006837

Safety Tips / Announcements



DEALING WITH STRANGERS

Discuss what a stranger is. A stranger is a person whom you have never met. You may have seen the person before, but do not know anything about him or her. Strangers do not look like monsters, aliens, or bad people you see on television. They look like ordinary people.

Know where your child is at all times. Make a rule that your child must ask permission or check with you before going anywhere.

Point out safe places in the neighborhood. Walk through the neighborhood with children and show them safe places to play, safe roads and paths to take, and safe neighbors to go to if they are scared.

Teach your child to trust their instincts. Explain that if they ever feel scared or uncomfortable they should get away from the situation and tell a trusted adult.

Teach "No, Go, Yell, Tell". Teach your child to say no, run away, yell as loud as they can, and tell a trusted adult if they think they are in a dangerous situation.
