| 04/22/2024 | Sterling | Law Enforcement Scam: Complainant reported that someone called his phone identifying themselves a U.S. Federal Marshals. The caller told the complainant he needed to withdraw money from his bank account due to changes in his Social Security Number. The complainant initially refused to withdraw money but ultimately did after being told he would be arrested if he did not comply with their request. He was told to provide them with all bank accounts he had and the amount of money in each account. He was then told to purchase gift cards and provide them with the gift card numbers and the codes to for the gift cards. After providing them with the information, he realized he was the victim of a scam. The case is under investigation. SO240007189 |
