




LCSO DASHBOARD — (Nov. 8 – Dec. 7)

CFS By Day of Week For the Last Month




Avg. Dispatch to Arrived Time (in Minutes)

SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS



Between August 27 – September 5, multiple Western Loudoun residents in the Stoneleigh and Waterford areas reported their vehicles had been entered and items stolen, to include a firearm, electronics, identification documents, credit cards, cash, and other miscellaneous items.

Detectives have obtained leads regarding related activity of the suspects in Temple Hill, MD.

These incidents are believed to be connected to other incidents within Loudoun County and throughout the region. The investigation is ongoing.

SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS - BURGLARY & GRAND LARCENY



Between October 11-27, three Western Loudoun farm markets were burglarized and safes containing thousands of dollars of revenue were stolen.

Two persons of interest have been identified.

Ongoing investigation revealed the same subjects are involved in other incidents throughout the DMV region.

MOTOR UNITS SAFE Op

S-Saturated
A-Areas

The Motor Unit conducted a S.A.F.E. Op in the Western Loudoun Station area of the county on Tuesday 10/24 and Thursday 10/26.

Locations for enforcement ops are chosen in areas where there is a known situation such as increased crashes or citizen complaints. The motor unit is instructed to conduct their enforcement in a high visibility manner. The hope is that driving behavior will improve in those areas where drivers see an increased LE presence.

The targeted roadway was Leesburg Pike from the Town of Leesburg line to the Clarke County line.

89 Traffic Stops were conducted over the two days of the operation, and 95 citations were issued:

- 84 for moving violations
- 9 for non-moving violations
- 2 for distracted driving
