New Broadband Agreement

Under an agreement announced today, All Points Broadband and Northern Virginia Electric Cooperative (NOVEC) have reached an agreement to extend fiber-to-the-home broadband service to more than 1,000 homes in northern Loudoun County. The initial locations targeted for service are within or adjacent to NOVEC's service territory. This initiative aims to extend fiber-optic broadband into areas of Loudoun where there is relatively lower population density and challenging terrain from a deployment perspective. All Points intentionally selected areas where consumers do not have access to cable or fiberoptic broadband.

Between now and September 15th, eligible households in the project area will be contacted by mail and encouraged to pre-register online. Doing so allows All Points to evaluate demand and determine whether construction of the last-mile fiber network can proceed. If there is sufficient customer demand, All Points would commence construction in early 2021. Route 15 South Safety and Operational Study:

The deadline for the public to complete the online survey and mapping exercise has been extended through August 14th; both items are located on the Route 15 South public Input website link below. Route 7 Bypass Closures:

The eastbound Route 7 Bypass bridge over Route 15/Business Route 15 will have nighttime single-lane closures (weather permitting) now through Thursday night, August 13th, and Sunday night, August 16th through Thursday night, August 20th for bridge repair work, according to VDOT. Drivers can expect delays and are advised to use alternate routes.

The work will occur according to the following schedule:

- Left Lane Closed: now through Thursday night, August 13th from 8 pm each night until 5 am the following morning.
- Right Lane Closed: Sunday night, August 16th through Thursday night, August 20th from 8 pm each night until 5 am the following morning.

Loudoun Workforce Resource Center to Host Virtual Job Fair:

The Virtual Job Fair on Wednesday, August 19th from 9:00 am through 3:00 pm will feature local employers with full-time, part-time and temporary job openings in Loudoun County and the region. Employers attending include: Amazon, Hertz, Inova Health System, Northwest Federal Credit Union, Potomac Falls Health & Rehab Center, Premier Staffing Source, Remedy Staffing, and Robert Half. Some of the open positions include accounting clerk, bus mechanic, car transporter, caregiver (certified nursing assistant/personal care assistant), collateral clerk, companion caregiver, housekeeping aide, registered nurse, sales associates and stockers, and staff accountant. Voters Encouraged to Apply Online Now to Vote Absentee in November:

Loudoun County election officials encourage voters to apply now to cast an absentee ballot by mail in the upcoming November general election. All registered voters are eligible to vote absentee in the November 3rd election. While some third-party organizations are distributing vote-by-mail application forms, Loudoun County election officials encourage voters to apply online through the Virginia Department of Elections. Applications may also be downloaded from the Virginia Department of Elections and, once completed, mailed, faxed or e-mailed to the Loudoun County Office of Elections and Voter Registration. The ballots will not be available to be mailed to voters until September 18th. Voters who have already applied for an absentee ballot do not need to submit a new application.

Pilot Glass Recycling Program:

Glass bottles and jars are now being collected separately at the following recycling centers:

- Landfill Recycling Center, 21101 Evergreen Mills Road in Leesburg
- Central Western Loudoun Recycling Center, 38159 Colonial Highway in Hamilton
- Sterling Park Recycling Center, 400 W Laurel Avenue in Sterling

The program is designed to increase recycling opportunities for glass. Glass that is commingled with other materials in the recycling process is often contaminated after the sorting process, limiting the extent to which the glass can be recycled. The glass collected in the Loudoun pilot program will be sent to Fairfax County to be used in construction projects and may also be sent to other facilities that are able to recycle glass bottles into new products. Visitors to the recycling center will see large purple bins (see picture below) labeled "Glass Recycling," where glass bottles and jars are to be placed. Please follow these guidelines:

- Only glass bottles and jars are accepted.
- The glass bottles and jars must be empty and rinsed out.
- · No lids or caps.
- Deposit bottles and jars loosely in the recycling containers provided, not in bags.
