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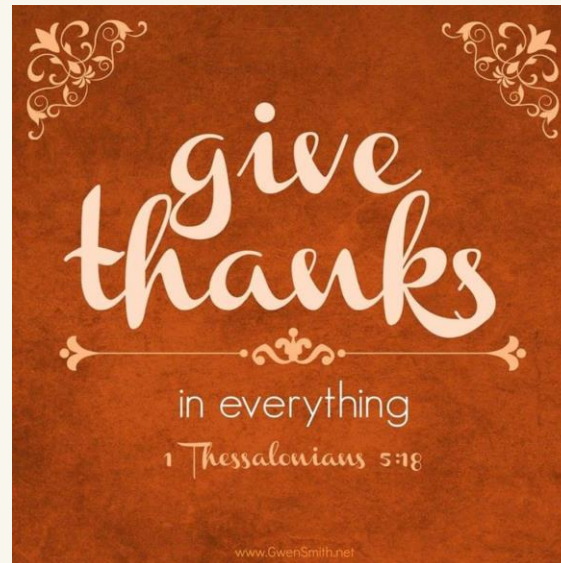

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Emergency Broadband Plan Moving Ahead

As I mentioned in my email last week, the Board's business meeting on Tuesday, November 17 covered a *lot* of important ground. Our Emergency Broadband proposal got a unanimous vote of support from the Board! (It was an 8-0-1 vote with Supervisor Letourneau absent for the vote.)

Broadband connectivity in Western Loudoun has been a chronic issue for years. Tuesday night's action by the Board was a major milestone for the Catoctin and Blue Ridge districts, as the Board voted unanimously to implement a practical set of plans that will extend real broadband coverage further into Western Loudoun.

Flawed Gun Control Measures Approved by the Board

The Board supported a proposal to ban guns in all County buildings, facilities, and parks.

I cannot overstate how terrible an idea this is. Supervisor Buffington and I both spoke in opposition to this proposal and voted against it, but we simply got outvoted. Supervisors Buffington and Umstattd also tried to add an exemption for concealed carry permit holders, but both of their efforts were defeated.

I have heard from constituents that support this measure and from many who oppose this measure. I appreciate views from both sides but I cannot fathom individuals not being able to protect themselves.

You only need to look at the Virginia Beach Municipal Shooting last year to see how this type of ban makes law-abiding citizens unsafe.

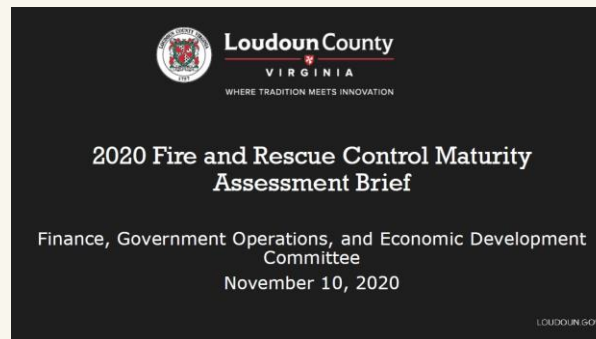
school children sitting on a computer for hours is much different than high school students on a computer.

Well Done, Hamilton and Lovettsville Volunteer Companies!

This update comes with a deeply personal note. The Hamilton Volunteer Rescue Squad responded to our home on the day that we lost our infant daughter, Adriana. They did an incredible job in a difficult, heart-wrenching situation. Whitney and I are grateful to the whole squad for how they took care of us.

So it is my great pleasure to report that the Hamilton Volunteer Rescue Squad, and their colleagues over at Lovettsville Volunteer Fire and Rescue, got some well-earned professional praise at a recent FGOEDC meeting.

Progress on Financial Controls

Over the last three years, Loudoun County has worked with the volunteer fire and rescue companies to strengthen their financial controls. These are the procedures that cover key transactions, like cash receipts and disbursements. We've retained a team from Cherry Bekaert to help evaluate the companies' progress on these controls.

At our recent FGOEDC meeting on November 11, our evaluators gave us an update, and it was uniformly good news. Here's what they reported to us:

- **Improved communication** between the volunteer companies, County staff, the Administrative Operations Committee (AOC), and the Cherry Bekaert team.
- **Consistent engagement** from the company points of contact throughout the assessment.
- **Increased assistance** by Cherry Bekaert to address questions from the companies about observations, best practices, and company responses to reports.
- **A significant increase in the maturity of controls for all companies in the cash receipts process.** As of now, all companies have a defined process for handling these transactions, and have made progress in implementing them and following them consistently.

This is a big deal. Cash receipts is an area that has a higher risk of fraud for any organization. So the fact that all our volunteer companies now have stronger, more mature controls for this process is a positive development indeed.

Hamilton & Lovettsville Did Wonderfully

The Lovettsville and Hamilton companies both were specifically praised by the evaluation team. Lovettsville Volunteer Fire and Rescue saw improvement in its cash receipts and bank reconciliations controls, and held steady on its cash disbursement controls, while Hamilton improved in all three.

Our evaluators reminded us that internal controls tend to wear down over time. There's a natural sort of friction that occurs as people leave and new hires take over, and as processes and technologies change or are upgraded. This causes a degree of variation in even the best internal controls.

In light of that, the evaluators were very pleased with both the Hamilton and Lovettsville companies' progress and achievements. They are confident that the companies are taking the right actions. Their main recommendation was to convert this evaluation into a continuous improvement program, with ongoing contact between the Cherry Bekaert team and the companies, rather than a check-in once every three years.

Well done, Hamilton and Lovettsville!

Recent Updates

**DESIGN PUBLIC INPUT
COMMENTS NEEDED**

Input on the design of Route 15 North is a critical part of the process that determines the important details of the project. Your input at this stage of the project is critical. If you were not able to attend the October 29 public input meeting you can still submit your views online until **November 30.**

Staff is hoping to bring the project to the Board early next year for design approval. Although we are still in the design phase, we are taking steps to expedite the project to construction.

So far a number of measures have already been implemented to expedite the project;

- task order consultants have been utilized for the project instead of procuring one prime consultant saving 9-12 months in the procurement process;
- the project has been divided into two phases so Phase 2 (White's Ferry to Montresor) right-of-way (ROW) challenges do not hold up Phase 1 (Leesburg to White's Ferry) progress;
- focus on property owner input/discussion early in design process in order to facilitate future ROW discussions

Steps to expedite the project from design to construction include:

- decisions on roadway alignment and major design elements,
- anticipate and prepare separate plan packages for bike and pedestrian trails additions/supplements that are not adjacent to Route 15 but where connectivity is desired,
- proceed directly to 60% plan submission to B&D (Building & Development) and VDOT (Virginia Department of Transportation),
- Utility Coordination - Begin designations and contact utilities while developing 60% plans and include utility design as a part of regular design coordination meetings

SPINKS FERRY/NEW VALLEY CHURCH ROAD ROUNDABOUT

Spinks Ferry road and Route 15 is a very dangerous intersection in Lucketts. Motorists often use the shoulder as a passing lane and the median at this intersection as a turn lane.

Thankfully, on [December 17, 2019](#) the Board approved use of \$2.7 million of unassigned FY 2019 General Fund Balance from the allocation for Economic Development Projects to the

Roundabout at the intersection of Route 15 Spinks Ferry Road and the realignment of New Valley Church Road to advance design.

I have requested that this project be included in the FY 2022 CIP and that funds be identified for completion of the roundabout.



The Route 9 Safety and Operational Study (SOS) is reviewing Route 9 from the West Virginia border to Route 7 to identify safety and traffic operational issues along the corridor. As with the Route 15 South Safety and Operations Study, public and focus group meeting will be held.

- **Ongoing Evaluation:** Work is currently underway to evaluate existing conditions along Route 9, including roadway and intersection safety, roadway design and traffic.
- **Focus Group Meetings:** The [first Route 9 focus group meeting](#) was held on February 13, and more meetings

were held virtually on July 16 and September 30. There will be up to 2 more focus group meetings, which will wrap up in the summer of 2021.

Safety and Operational Study Leesburg to Prince William County

The purpose of the Route 15 South Safety and Operational Study (SOS) is to identify safety and traffic operational issues along the corridor. The goal of the proposed improvements is to ensure that this segment of Route 15 continues to carry local and commuter traffic safely and efficiently while still preserving the unique context of the historical roadway.

Work is underway to evaluate existing conditions along Route 15 South, including roadway and intersection safety, as well as roadway design and traffic.

The latest Route 15 South virtual public input meeting was held on July 30. And the most recent focus group meeting was held via Webex on October 1. The focus groups are intended to allow discussion with property owners whose use or activity

generates significant traffic, business owners, and representatives of civic organizations located in the area.

There will be up to five focus group meetings throughout the study. The study is expected to wrap up in summer 2021.

Road Project Updates

The latest on County and VDOT projects that impact Catoclin District residents

Crosstrail Boulevard

Segment B - the design and construction from Kincaid Boulevard to Russell Branch Parkway. A contract award for construction of this proffer item was approved at the Board Business Meeting on December 3, 2019.

Blasting will continue through November. Bridge crews have been tackling the cut and fill operations and construction work on the west abutment/casing.

Route 7 & Route 287

This project provides for the planning, design, and construction of improvements for the Route 7 and Berlin Turnpike (Route 287) interchange. The project is funded using local tax funding and VDOT Smart Scale funding.

As of September, the land acquisition was about 15% complete. DTCI's design consultant, Dewberry, is preparing the design plats and coordinating with utility providers. Plats denoting the proposed easements and right-of-way dedication, which are needed for this project, have been submitted to Loudoun County and the Town of Purcellville for review. The project plans are in the final stages of design review.

VDOT Smart Scale funding is expected to begin in fall 2022. Construction should then begin in 2023, and will take from 36 to 48 months.

Route 7 & Route 690

This project funds the design, right-of-way acquisition and construction of an interchange at Route 7 and Route 690 in Purcellville.

No change since last time. The Limited Access control panel is still being reviewed, as are the right of way and easement plats, and coordination is being done for the utility field inspection (UFI).

John G. Lewis Memorial (Featherbed Lane) Bridge over Catoctin Creek

The purpose of this project is to develop conceptual bridge alternatives to address the existing historic truss bridge. VDOT presented three options to the State Department of Historic Resources. The DHS chose option 2A: building a new structure from the deck down, allowing the trusses to remain as ornamental.

John G. Lewis Memorial Bridge (Route 673 - Featherbed Lane) over Catoctin Creek is a single span steel pin connected Pratt through truss with a timber deck and asphalt overlay, supported on stringers and floor beams. The bridge was listed in the National Register of Historic Places on June 25, 1974. It

is 157 feet long, has an overall width of about 14 feet and clear roadway width of 11.16 feet. It carries one alternating traffic lane. The bridge was originally erected in 1889 on the Leesburg & Alexandria Turnpike (Route 7) over Goose Creek, to replace a bridge destroyed by flooding. In 1932 the bridge was dismantled and moved to its current location. The bridge was posted 15 tons in 2004 and reduced to 3 tons in 2013 due to insufficient capacity. The existing bridge has an average traffic count of 57 vehicles per day with daily truck traffic less than 3 trucks.

Bid letting for this project was held on October 21.

Route 7 & Battlefield Parkway

This project will replace the traffic signal at Route 7 (East Market Street) and Battlefield Parkway with a grade-separated interchange, and remove or modify the signalized intersection at Route 7 and Cardinal Park Drive to reduce congestion and improve traffic operations. Other improvements include accommodations for cyclists and pedestrians, and new interchange lighting. The Town of Leesburg has executed an agreement with VDOT to administer this project on the Town's behalf. The Town has also executed a reimbursement agreement with NVTa.

No change since last time. Work is still being done on road construction, right of way acquisition, and utility relocations.

Route 9 & Route 287 Roundabout

This project includes design and construction of a roundabout at the intersection of Charles Town Pike (Route 9) and Berlin Turnpike (Route 287).

A meeting was held with the Loudoun County B&D Floodplain group to discuss comments received for the Floodplain

alteration. The 100% plans should be submitted by the end of November. And work is being done on utility coordination.

Route 15 - Route 15 Interchange at Edwards Ferry/Fort Evans Road

This project includes the design and construction of grade separated interchanges at Route 15/Edwards Ferry Road and Route 15/Fort Evans Road.

The design consultant sent back an updated proposal, which is being processed. A purchase order should be issued by the end of November.

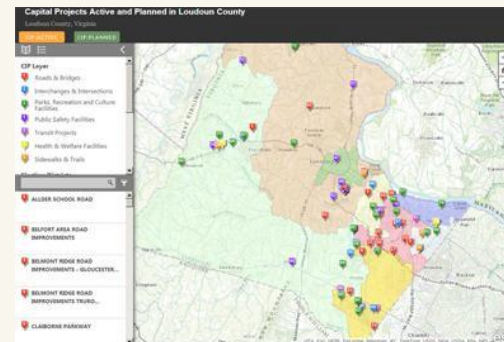
Town of Hamilton Pedestrian Improvements

This project provides drainage improvements and repair to the existing pedestrian sidewalks along Route 7- Colonial Highway adjacent to the Town's western limits. This is a Transportation Alternatives project managed by the Town of Hamilton. A Notice to Proceed was issued and construction began in 2019.

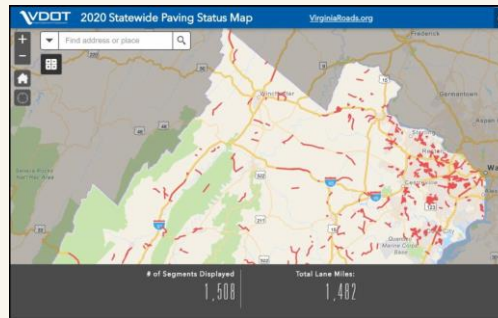
The last bits of landscaping work have been finished. This project is now complete!

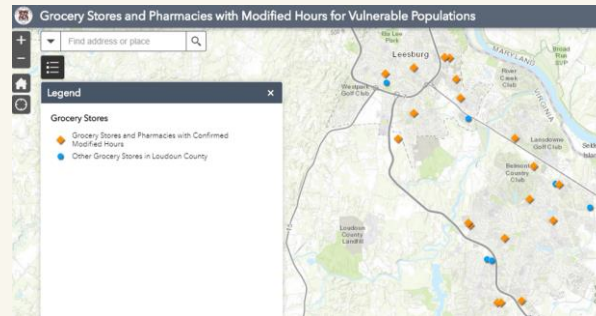

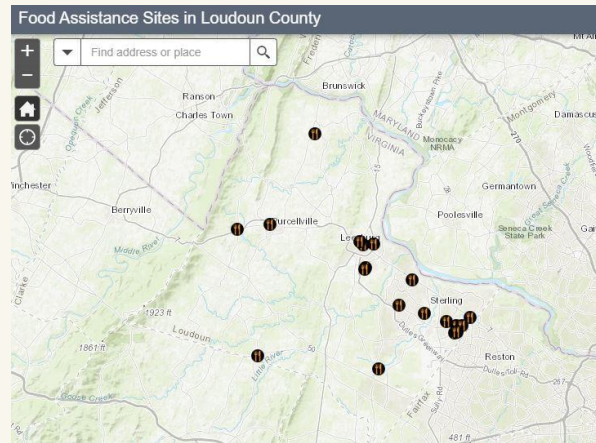

The Virginia 30 Day Fund

The Virginia 30 Day Fund has [given forgivable loans to over 700 businesses](#) to help them through this pandemic. If you own a small business in Virginia, I recommend that you check them out - they are a nonprofit, founded when COVID-19 first struck, and their goal is to help 1,000 businesses by the end of 2020.

To qualify for one of these forgivable loans, a business must be:

- A small businesses that employs 3 to 30 people,
- Based in Virginia and have been operating for at least one year, *and*
- Owned and operated by a Virginia resident.

The funds from these loans don't need to be repaid. But if businesses who receive the Fund's assistance do, later on, want to "pay it forward" to another Virginia small business that needs the help, they can do so by directing those dollars back to the Fund, which will disburse the funding to another Virginia business in need.
