

Hello, Loudoun

Effective yesterday, Loudoun County expanded COVID-19 vaccination opportunities to include all residents who are 16 years of age and older and encourages them to preregister for a COVID-19 vaccine if they have not already done so. Please note that anyone under 18 receiving the vaccine must be accompanied by a parent or guardian at their vaccination appointment or they will be turned away.

How to Pre-Register

Anyone 16 years of age and older who lives or works in Virginia can pre-register for a COVID-19 vaccine in one of two ways:

- Online: Visit <u>vaccinate.virginia.gov</u> to submit a pre-registration form. The fastest method for receiving a vaccination appointment is to include a unique e-mail address in separate pre-registration forms for each individual who will receive a vaccine.
- Phone: Individuals who do not have access to the internet can pre-register by calling 1-877-829-4682.

Already Pre-Registered, But Have Not Heard from the County?

The Health Department encourages anyone who has already pre-registered for a vaccine and is in the Phase 1a, 1b or 1c priority groups, but has not yet been contacted by the County for a vaccination appointment, to take two actions:

- First, check your spam or junk e-mail folder for an e-mail from the CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention), which is used to pre-register, to ensure the invitation for an appointment was not sent there.
- Second, if you have not received an e-mail, contact the County by calling 703-737-8300, Monday through Friday, between the hours of 9:00 am and 5:00 pm.

In addition to receiving a vaccine from the County, residents can also look for available vaccination appointments at pharmacies and other locations in the region by visiting **vaccinefinder.org**. These entities do not coordinate their registrations with the Health Department.



On April 6th, I received my COVID-19 vaccine. There is a lot of misinformation about the vaccinations. I would not take the vaccine, nor would I encourage family members, to include my husband and sons to take the vaccine, if I had not conducted my own independent research. After researching, I decided taking the vaccine was right for me.
