Dear Broad Run Friends and Neighbors,

I want to start off this newsletter by announcing COVID-19 vaccines in Loudoun are now available to all individuals aged 12+ without the need to register ahead of time! You can now directly schedule an appointment online for yourself or your child to receive a shot at

Dulles Town Center. Please encourage everyone you are close with to receive their vaccine, especially since it is now much easier and streamlined to do so. The steps on how to schedule an appointment are explained in the newsletter below or by visiting [Loudoun.gov/covid19vaccine](https://loudoun.gov/covid19vaccine).

The Board of Supervisors is undertaking [an initiative](#) to rename Routes 7 and 50, removing the names Harry Byrd Highway and John Mosby Highway, respectively. As part of the process to rename these roadways, a renaming task force is being created to field public input, perform research, and create a list of recommendations to the Board. Each supervisor has the opportunity to appoint one person to the task force. If you are interested in serving as the Broad Run representative to the Routes 7 and 50 renaming task force, please [send me an email](#) explaining your interest in serving and/or any relevant experience you have.

Two development applications in the Broad Run District were before the Board of Supervisors at our May 12th public hearing. Both applications were forwarded to the June 1st business meeting for action. The first application is the Oak Grove residential rezoning application to build 50 townhouses on vacant land in the Oak Grove area of Sterling. The second application is Dulles 2000, which is to allow for the development of two data centers along the east side of Route 28 south of Old Ox Road, also in Sterling. Links to both of these items and more description can be found below in the land use section of the newsletter.

On June 8th, the Democratic Primary for Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and Attorney General will take place. There is no Republican Primary this year as the Republican party picked its candidates through the convention method. Virginia does not recognize party affiliation in voting, so all eligible voters in the Commonwealth are able to vote in the Democratic primary. Information on the candidates and options on how to submit a ballot are explained below.

There is also a newly available seat as the Broad Run District Representative on the Loudoun Transit Advisory Board. If you are interested in applying to this position, please read more and fill out the linked application in the newsletter below.

Lastly, as we celebrate Memorial Day this Monday, let us remember all the valiant men and women who perished while serving our country. May their legacies continue to live and may their stories continue to be told.

Loudoun County Vaccinating Adolescents Ages 12 to 15; Streamlines Appointment-Making Process

The Loudoun County Health Department is offering COVID-19 vaccinations by appointment to adolescents ages 12 to 15, following [approval by the Virginia Department of Health](#) (VDH). Vaccinations are free of charge for everyone regardless of immigration or health insurance status.

"The safety of people who are receiving the COVID-19 vaccine continues to be our highest priority," said Loudoun County Health Director Dr. David Goodfriend. "Our nation's top public health experts have carefully evaluated the data and we have great confidence in the safety and effectiveness of this vaccine for everyone age 12 years and older. I encourage parents to get their kids vaccinated as soon as possible because vaccinating this age group is another important step toward getting back to normal." The VDH approval for use of the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine for individuals in this age group follows [endorsements by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention](#) (CDC), the CDC's [Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices](#) (ACIP), and the [Food and Drug Administration](#) (FDA).

How to Make an Appointment

The Loudoun County Health Department has streamlined the appointment-making process to make it easier for parents and others to schedule their own appointments online in one single step. Residents may now make appointments in real time without first registering in the Vaccine Administration Management System (VAMS). The system no longer requires users to wait for an email that prompts them to schedule an appointment.

To schedule an appointment for your child or yourself, simply visit Loudoun County's website: loudoun.gov/COVID19vaccine and then click on "**Schedule A Vaccine Appointment**" and follow the "Step 1" instructions. On the VAMS appointment page, [submit a request](#) for an appointment by following the prompts in the online form.

Anyone who needs assistance making an appointment, such as those who do not have access to the internet, should call the COVID-19 Information Line at 703-737-8300 between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Monday to Friday. Individuals ages 12 to 17 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. The vaccination site continues to operate by appointment only. All individuals who would like to be vaccinated must have an appointment.

Other Vaccination Opportunities

Other vaccine providers in Loudoun County, such as retail pharmacies, may also begin to offer COVID-19 vaccine to individuals ages 12 to 15. These providers operate independently of Loudoun County. Visit vaccines.gov to find other COVID-19 vaccine providers in our community.

Vaccine Safety and Efficacy

COVID-19 vaccines continue to be safe and effective. New vaccines are typically studied in adults first, and then gradually include younger age groups. This is a standardized process intended to study a new vaccine in the safest way possible. Pfizer-BioNTech's request to expand use of the vaccine to 12- to-15-year-olds is based on data from [a clinical trial of 2,260 adolescents that showed](#) that the vaccine was safe and effective in this age group. Requesting a Vaccination Record

It is important that parents and everyone who receives a COVID-19 vaccine keep the vaccination card received at the time of vaccination. The Loudoun County Health Department does not provide vaccination records. If you lose the vaccination card and need a record of your vaccination, individuals who created VAMS accounts may obtain a copy of your record in the VAMS system by logging into your account at vams.cdc.gov. In addition, you can contact VDH for a record by [submitting a request form online](#).

After Vaccination

The CDC has published [guidance for fully vaccinated people](#); however, the CDC also recommends that even people who are fully vaccinated keep taking precautions in public places. The Loudoun County Health Department encourages Loudoun residents who received a COVID-19 vaccine to continue taking the steps that help prevent the spread of COVID-19, including:

- Avoid crowds of people.
- Stay 6 feet away from others who do not live in your household at all times until the CDC and VDH change these recommendations.
- Wear a face covering when in public to protect yourself and others until the governor's office lifts this requirement.
- Wash hands frequently.
- Avoid non-essential travel, particularly with unvaccinated people who do not live in your household.
- Avoid visiting unvaccinated people who are at [increased risk of severe illness or death from COVID-19](#).

House Fire Attributed to HVAC System

The Loudoun County Fire Marshal's Office determined last night's house fire in Ashburn was accidental, resulting from a mechanical malfunction in the air handler system, a component of the heating,

ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) system located in the attic. [Read More](#).

As we move quickly into the summer season and temperatures change, it is important to inspect and maintain the HVAC equipment in your home.

- Have a licensed contractor do annual pre-season check-ups of the cooling system in the spring and the heating system in the fall. During the inspection, your HVAC contractor should also clean your system and ensure there are no carbon monoxide or refrigerant leaks.
- Inspect, clean, or change air filters once a month in your central air conditioner, furnace, and/or heat pump according to manufacturer's instructions. A dirty filter can increase energy costs and damage your equipment, leading to early failure.
- Ensure any window air conditioning units are tested by a recognized, independent testing laboratory and follow the manufacture's recommendations when installing and operating the device. Do not plug your air conditioner into an extension cord or power strip. Your window unit should have its own dedicated outlet.
- Lastly, have working smoke alarms in each bedroom, outside sleeping areas and on every level of the home. Carbon Monoxide alarms should also be installed on each level and in hallways outside of sleeping areas.

2021 Virginia Democratic Primary Election

Tuesday, June 8, 2021 Democratic Primary Election

A Democratic Party primary election will be held in Loudoun County on Tuesday, June 8, 2021. Offices on the ballot will include Democratic Party nominees for Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and Attorney General. The Republican Party has chosen to conduct a

convention process to select their candidates, so there will not be a Republican Primary on this date. Read more about the election: [Loudoun.gov/JunePrimary](https://loudoun.gov/JunePrimary).

Virginia does not recognize party affiliation in voter registration; therefore, all registered Virginia voters are eligible to vote in the Democratic primary. There is no Republican primary taking place in any part of the Broad Run District.

Three Ways to Vote: Pick the Option that Works Best for You

All registered voters in Virginia now have the option to vote at home, vote early or vote on election day. No excuses required no matter your choice. Just click on the underlined title of the voting option you would like to visit that page for more information.

- **Vote at Home**: We'll mail your ballot and important information to you. You'll fill it out following the instructions enclosed, and send it back.
 - Last day to request ballot be mailed to you: Friday, May 28, 2021, at 5:00 p.m.
- **Vote Early**: Early voting will be available for all registered Loudoun County voters at the Office of Elections in Leesburg starting April 23, 2021 and at additional early voting centers in the final week before the election. There is no pre-application required to vote early in-person, simply check the locations, dates and times and go vote when it's most convenient for you!
 - Last day to vote absentee in-person: Saturday, June 5, 2021 (office will be open 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.)
 - Note that if you have requested a ballot to be mailed to your home and you decide you'd rather vote early you must bring the ballot with you and trade in for a new one.
- **Vote on Election Day**: Polls will be open from 6:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, June 8, 2021. Voters are

encouraged to verify their registration information, and to double check their voting precinct at vote.virginia.gov to ensure they know their precinct number and are viewing the correct ballot.

Member Sought for Loudoun Board of Zoning Appeals

Are you a Loudoun County resident who is interested in zoning? Loudoun County is seeking applicants to serve on the Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA). There is one opening for an alternate member whose term would begin immediately upon appointment by the Loudoun County Circuit Court.

The duties of the BZA include hearing and deciding:

- Appeals of administrative decisions and notices of violations made in accordance with the zoning ordinance;
- Applications for variances as authorized by the zoning ordinance;
- Appeals from the decisions of the Loudoun County Zoning Administrator regarding interpretation of the zoning map where there is uncertainty as to the location of a zoning district boundary; and
- Applications for special exceptions when buildings or structures have inadvertently encroached into a yard or setback.

The BZA has five members and two alternates who are appointed by the chief judge of the Loudoun County Circuit Court for staggered terms of five years. BZA members must be residents of Loudoun County.

The BZA meets approximately once a month for a public hearing. More information, including a link to the online application form, is available at loudoun.gov/bza. The deadline to apply for a seat on the BZA is May 31, 2021.

The USA Swimming Foundation reports nearly 90 children younger than 15 drowned in a pool or spa from January 2018 through May 2018, and every year about 19 children drown during the July 4 holiday alone. VDOT 2021 Repaving and Resealing

VDOT has released their [map of roads that will be resurfaced in 2021](#). The exact dates for the road work are unknown at this time, as it is dependent on weather and contractor schedules. Resurfacing projects can last from a few days to a few weeks, depending on the size of the project.

Building construction will commence in the near future.

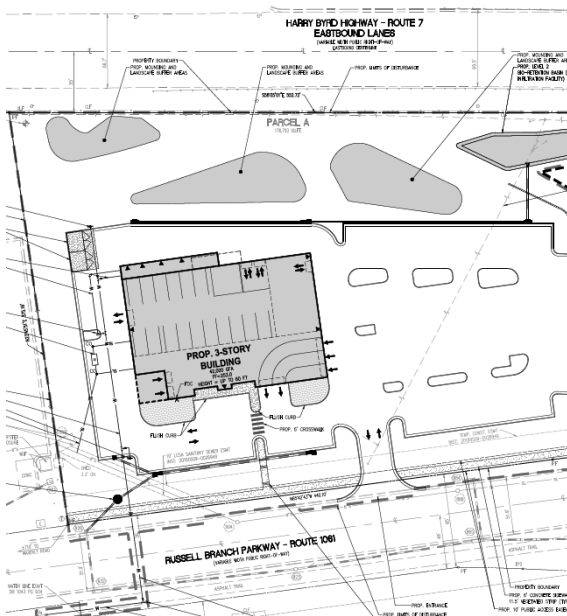
The developer will construct the remaining asphalt path on the northeastern side of Russell Branch Parkway from Savin Hill Drive to Ashbrook Place.

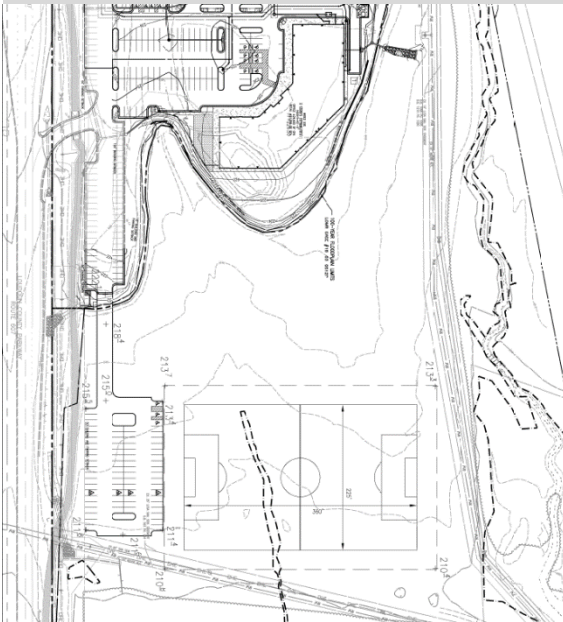

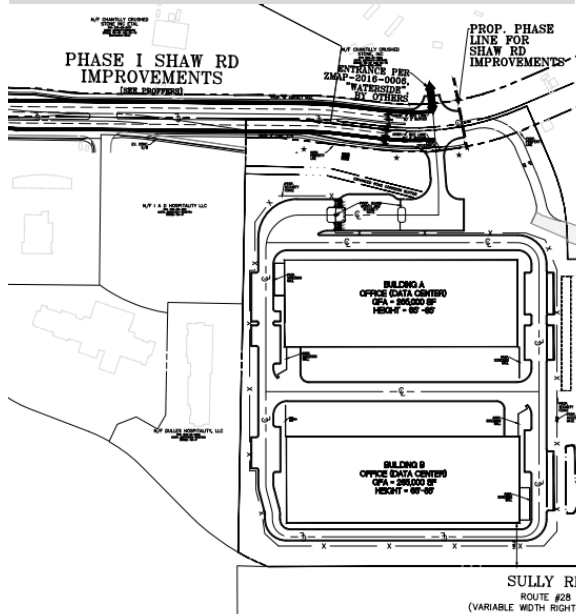

[This project](#), located at the southwest corner of the Route 7/Route 28 interchange, was approved by the Board of Supervisors on April 20, 2021. The project is an alteration to the previously approved Kincora zoning and consists of allowing an additional 1,000 multi-family housing units (158 of which are attainable housing units), an additional 575,000 square feet of non-residential uses, approval of

the Board of Supervisors. Building exterior shell and retaining wall/site work construction is underway and will continue for the foreseeable future.



Moorefield Station ZMAP-2001-0003

This project, approved by the Board of Supervisors in December 2002, allows for the construction of up to 6,000 residential units and up to 9,750,000 square feet of non-residential uses. The newest section of the project to be developed is near the intersection of Croson Lane and Old Ryan Road. There, Toll Brothers is building three bedrooms, two bathroom condos. Over the course of this project's build-out, the developers will install

the two museum uses (NMISO and NVSC), and moves the Children's Science Center to a larger, 5-acre site backing to the Broad Run.



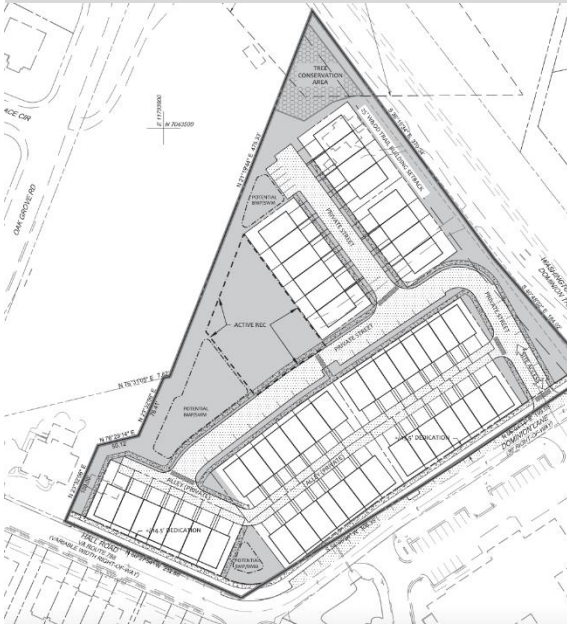

The current plans for the Loudoun section of Rivana include: Nearly 2,000 multifamily housing units; 1.8 million square feet of Class-A office space; A 185,000-square-foot retail village; A 265-room boutique hotel; A network of green and public spaces, including an 11-acre park. Phase 1A is scheduled to open for tenants in 2024. The property is bounded by Route 28, the Dulles Toll Road, Innovation Avenue, and the county line with Fairfax.

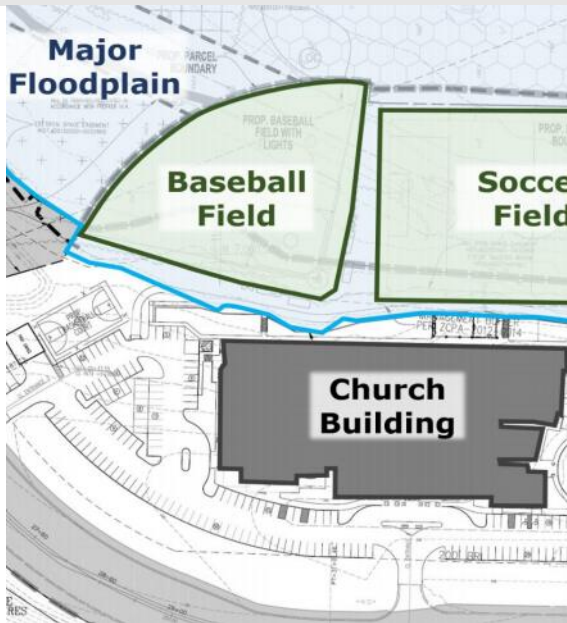

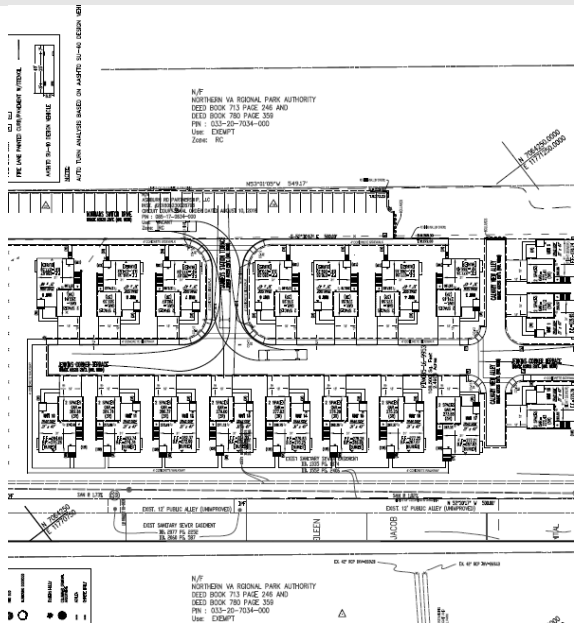

Temple Baptist Church ZCPA-2019-0005

This project, located on the west side of Russell Branch Parkway, just north of Gloucester Parkway (across from the Kincora fire station), was approved by the Board of Supervisors on January 19, 2021. The application is to allow for the construction of a baseball field and a soccer field in the floodplain of the Broad Run, along with an associated church and school building located outside of the floodplain. The church is prohibited from using pesticides & excess fertilizers on the fields, and conveyed an acre of land to the county to be used for a future trail connection.



Trailview Ashburn STPL-2016-0023

No Change

This project is located in Old Ashburn on land in between Ashburn Road, Jenkins Lane, and the Washington and Old Dominion trail. The project includes the construction of 18 single family homes with associated parking spaces, roadways, and sidewalks. This project was allowed by-right, which means a property owner has the right to construct and subdivide their land into certain uses without having to submit an application before the Board of Supervisors for approval. Current building demolition has occurred at the project location and site clearing/preparation has begun.



**Waterside / Waterside North
ZMAP-2012-0006
ZCPA-2020-0014**

No Change

This project was approved by the Board of Supervisors in 2015 and encompasses most of the land bordered by the Innovation Avenue to the south, Route 28 (Sully Road) to the west, Old Ox Road to the north, and the Loudoun-Fairfax county line to the east. The project consists of filling in the recently closed quarry to create a centerpiece lake surrounded by high-density, high-rise spaces of residential, retail, commercial, cultural, and office uses. An application is under review to amend proffer triggers and the development layout.



**Waxpool Crossing
ZMAP-2019-0020**

This project, at the northwest corner of Ashburn Village Boulevard and Waxpool Road, was approved by the Broad of Supervisors on January 19, 2021 as a rezoning from a church property to high-density residential. The developer will build 384 multifamily units, including 44 attainable housing units. In addition to trails along Ashburn Village Boulevard and Waxpool Road, a roundabout will be constructed at the intersection of Waxpool Road and Faulkner Parkway. If, for some reason, the developer is unable to construct the roundabout, they must pay the county \$9.6 million.

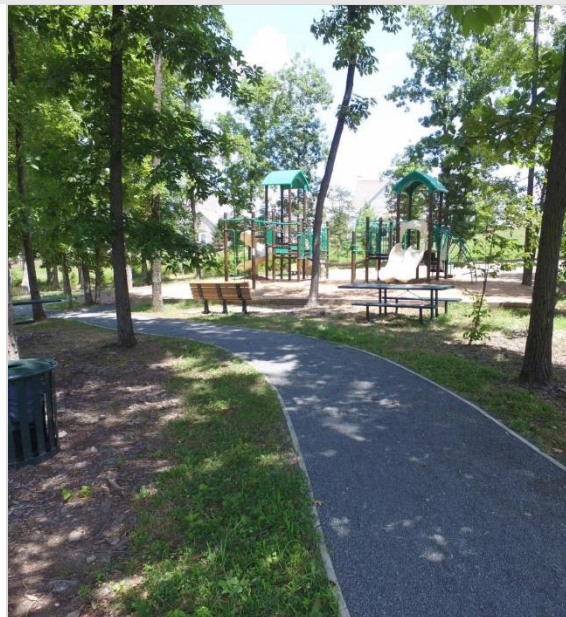
Metro Station Area Pedestrian Improvements
