Dear Broad Run Friends and Neighbors,

September has been a difficult month for us here in the Broad Run District. On Tuesday, August 31, our School Board Member, Leslee King, passed away after complications from a heart procedure she had earlier this summer.



I was devastated by Leslee's passing, as she and I were more than just colleagues representing Broad Run, we were dear friends as well. She and I met during our campaigns in 2019, but grew much closer over the last two years and talked frequently (more so this summer). I remember knocking on doors during my campaign and regularly hearing people say "Leslee King stopped by earlier and she has told me all about you." I think Leslee knocked on almost every door in the district, as she truly wanted to gain a sense of what the community was feeling in order to adequately serve on the School Board.

Although the School Board has had a difficult and controversial two years, Leslee was always a burst of positivity and a joy to be around. I will miss Leslee for her warmth, kindness, friendship, and for her tireless efforts on the School Board. I was pleased to sponsor [a resolution](#) from the Board of Supervisors honoring her life and service. She will be missed by her family and all of us in the Broad Run District.

To fill the Broad Run District School Board seat, the eight remaining School Board members must appoint a resident of the Broad Run District to serve through December, 31, 2022. This process is already underway, with the formal announcement from LCPS on the process for filling the vacancy found [here](#). Any resident of Broad Run who is a qualified voter was eligible to apply for the vacancy. Applications were due by 12 noon today (September 24) and will be made public for School Board and community review.

A Public Hearing will then be held on Tuesday, October 5th at 6:30pm in the School Board meeting room at the LCPS Administrative Building. At this public hearing, the School Board members will be given an opportunity to ask questions of the applicants and allow

the general public to provide comments as well. The School Board members will then vote for one of the applicants to fill the term through December 31, 2022.

That being said, Leslee King's uncompleted term expires on December 31, 2023. A special election will be held on November 8, 2022 (the general election day) to permanently fill the seat by voters. The winner of that election will serve the remainder of the term, through December 31, 2023. While it is likely that the applicant chosen to fill the term through 2022 will run in the special election, there is a possibility that Broad Run could have a different School Board Member beginning in January 2023.

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Broad Run School Board Member Leslee King Passes Away

Leslee M. King, the Broad Run District representative on the Loudoun County School Board, passed away on Tuesday, August 31, 2021.

"As a school board member, Ms. King was a positive force for good," said Superintendent Dr. Scott A. Ziegler. "Her voice for all children never wavered and she always spoke her mind in the kindest way possible. I looked forward to her wit and wisdom at our meetings. She will be missed."

"Leslee was a dedicated board member and fierce advocate for every student," said Brenda L. Sheridan, Chair of the Loudoun County School Board. "She prepared, researched and spoke unapologetically to her positions. Her support and friendship throughout this most difficult and challenging term was unwavering. I will miss my colleague and ally, and most importantly, my friend."

Ms. King was elected to the School Board on November 5, 2019, receiving 61 percent of the vote, and sworn in on January 6, 2020. She chaired the Finance and Operations and Student Services committees and was a member of the Equity and Communication and Outreach committees.

Ms. King was born in Portsmouth, Virginia, and raised in Portsmouth, Front Royal, Richmond and the Washington, D.C., area. She was the third child of seven who learned a strong work ethic from her loving parents. Ms. King taught sixth, seventh and eighth grades before moving west to support her husband's career. She returned to Virginia in 1986 and moved into the technology field to support her three young children.

Ms. King performed site assessments for companies and government agencies. As part of the improvement process, she would often develop and teach technical classes tailored to the needs of the customer. Those she worked for included all branches of the military as well as the U.S. Central Command, Defense Information Systems Agency (DISA), Department of Homeland Security, Department of State, the U.S. Senate, various intelligence agencies, several colleges and state and local governments.

Beyond her official duties, Ms. King was known as a thoughtful, cheerful presence at Loudoun County Public Schools functions. In

June, she attended seven LCPS graduations in-person and congratulated more than 3,500 members of the Class of 2020. Ms. King posted this message to the graduates on her Facebook page: "Don't ever let anyone tell you you cannot do something because you persevered and made it through the worst health crisis our country has ever known...You have a fantastic future ahead of you!"

Ms. King was noted for giving gifts – such as hand-knit scarves – to staff and for her entertaining stories about her parents' unusual courtship during World War II. She is survived by her three children and their families and she will be missed by so many that had the gift of knowing her in their life.

November 2, 2021 General Election Information

Board of Supervisors Endorses Study of Impact of Segregated Schools and 1940 Forced Sale of Douglass School Property

The Loudoun County Board of Supervisors has voted in favor of studying the harm caused by Loudoun County's past discrimination against Black students and to seek out ways to rectify disparities. In addition, the Board approved a review of the forced sale of land to the county for a school to identify possible recommendations for addressing that injustice. The Board's action begins dialogues on the topics but does not indicate reparations or any other remedy. Instead, the Board will consider recommendations prepared by the Joint Board and School Board Committee in the future.

The initiative was introduced by Algonkian District Supervisor Juli E. Briskman following the September 2020 letter of apology for the operation of segregated schools, which was issued by the Loudoun County School Board and the Board of Supervisors.

"I said at the time that the letter was just a start of how the county can right these wrongs," said Supervisor Briskman. "I believe that racial disparities are not a result of individual failings but due to systemic racism over generations, which we now have an opportunity to address through this careful study of our history of discrimination of Black students in Loudoun County."

Board Chair Phyllis J. Randall introduced a specific initiative for the Joint Committee to study: a review of the forced sale of eight acres of property in 1940 by the County-Wide League, a group comprising the parent-teacher associations of all the Black schools in Loudoun County. The league raised funds to purchase land for a Black high school and had purchased property in Leesburg for \$4,000. In

December 1940, that property was conveyed to Loudoun County for the nominal sum of \$1 for the purpose of building the Douglass High School. The Board requested the identification of possible recommendations for addressing the injustice contained in that property transaction.

"These initiatives will start an important community conversation," said Chair Randall. "Systematic racism has existed in Loudoun County, and we have a moral duty to acknowledge it and to examine how we as a Board and we as a greater community can appropriately respond to the injustices of our past."

The next steps include bringing these initiatives the Joint Board and School Board Committee, which will determine how to study these topics in the coming months and to develop recommendations responsive to the Board's request. The joint committee will return its recommendation to the Board of Supervisors in the future for consideration. The Joint Board and School Board Committee is currently scheduled to meet next on November 1, 2021, at 5:00 p.m., at the Loudoun County Public Schools administration building. Documents prepared for the meeting will be posted in advance at loudoun.gov/bosdocuments.

Effective at 6:00 a.m., September 13, 2021, the Sterling Park Safety Center, located at 104 Commerce Street, will close to allow for the construction of a new 22,000 square foot replacement station in the same location. Loudoun County Achieves Compliance with Virginia's Marcus Alert Legislation through RapidSOS

Loudoun County has established a voluntary database that provides emergency responders with important health information in compliance with Virginia's Marcus-David Peters Act, which was signed into law in December 2020. The law aims to provide behavioral health responses when an individual is experiencing a crisis related to mental health, substance abuse, or developmental disability in the state of Virginia. Loudoun County to Hold Two Virtual Public Meetings on Renaming Route 7 and Route 50 on September 29

Loudoun County is hosting two online meetings to gain input from the public on the renaming of Harry Byrd Highway (Route 7) and John Mosby Highway (Route 50). The public information meetings will be held on Wednesday, September 29, 2021, at 1:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. These two meetings will be identical and have been scheduled to provide added flexibility for the public. Members of the public are invited to attend either of the virtual meetings to receive an overview of the project, information about the Renaming Route 7 and Route 50 Task Force's work to review submitted names and comment on proposed names for each roadway.

Login information and meeting materials are available for review at loudoun.gov/renaming7and50 and loudoun.gov/remoteparticipation, including a speaker sign-up form. Members of the public must sign up in advance to speak during the event by 12:00 p.m., Tuesday, September 28, 2021. Online participants may also send questions to the project team as chat messages, which will be answered during the meeting as time allows.

Following the public meetings, on September 30, 2021, a survey will be available for the public to rank a short list of proposed roadway names in order of preference. Members of the public will be encouraged to visit loudoun.gov/renaming7and50 to rank each name. The Board of Supervisors is scheduled to review the public's recommendations and consider the new names in December. The approved name for each roadway will be sent to the Virginia Department of Transportation and the Commonwealth Transportation Board for ultimate approval.

In December 2020, the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors initiated the process of renaming Harry Byrd Highway (Route 7) and John Mosby Highway (Route 50) in collaboration with regional jurisdictions. Route 7 extends across the entire county and connects with Clarke County to the west and Fairfax County to the east. Route 50 also extends across the entire county and connects with Fauquier County to the west and Fairfax County to the east with portions of it weaving in and out of Fauquier County.

The renaming of these two roadways is one of two projects that have resulted from the Board's initiation, in September 2020, of a [review of Confederate and segregationist symbols](#) in the county.

COVID-19 Resources and Updates

Loudoun County COVID-19 Vaccine Booster Update

On Friday, September 17, 2021, a Food and Drug Administration (FDA) advisory panel endorsed COVID-19 booster doses of the Pfizer vaccine for those who are 65 or older or run a high risk of severe disease. This does not mean, however, that a booster dose is recommended or that Loudoun County can begin offering booster doses. [Read More](#).

COVID-19 Vaccination Site at Dulles Town Center Reopened September 17 by Appointment Only

In preparation for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and Virginia Department of Health (VDH) recommendations for COVID-19 vaccine booster doses and for vaccinating children ages 5-12, Loudoun County will resume vaccination operations by appointment only at its Dulles Town Center site, located at 21090 Dulles Town Circle in Sterling.

Sterling Elementary School Vaccination Site Closed

In addition, because the Dulles Town Center site will reopen, the Health Department will cease operation of the COVID-19 vaccination clinic at Sterling Elementary School at this time. Anyone with an existing appointment at the school site will be contacted to transfer their appointment to the Dulles Town Center site.

COVID-19 Vaccine Providers

All residents who need a COVID-19 vaccine may receive one from many providers in the community, such as medical offices and pharmacies including, but not limited to, CVS, Giant Food, Harris Teeter, Safeway, Walgreens, Walmart and Wegmans. Visit vaccines.gov to find a vaccination site near you.

"While Loudoun County provided more than 300,000 vaccinations this year, residents have many more options now," said Dr. Goodfriend. "You don't have to come back to the Dulles Town Center to get your booster dose if there is a more convenient option for you."

This project, on the southwest side of Russell Branch Parkway across from the intersection with Ashbrook Place, was approved by the Board of Supervisors in 1996. It includes the construction of one flex-industrial office building and the associated parking lot. The building will be similar to those on the north side of Russell Branch Parkway along Ashbrook Place and Atwater Drive. Construction is scheduled to begin in the coming months with the building opening by the end of the year. Building Information can be found [here](#).

No Change

This project, at the eastern corner of Ashbrook Place and Russell Branch Parkway, was approved by the Board of Supervisors in December 2019.

The approval was for a rezoning from industrial park to residential to allow for the construction of 190 multifamily units. Sewer installation and road construction have begun.

Building construction will commence in the near future.

The developer will construct the remaining asphalt path on the northeastern side of Russell Branch Parkway from Savin Hill Drive to Ashbrook Place.

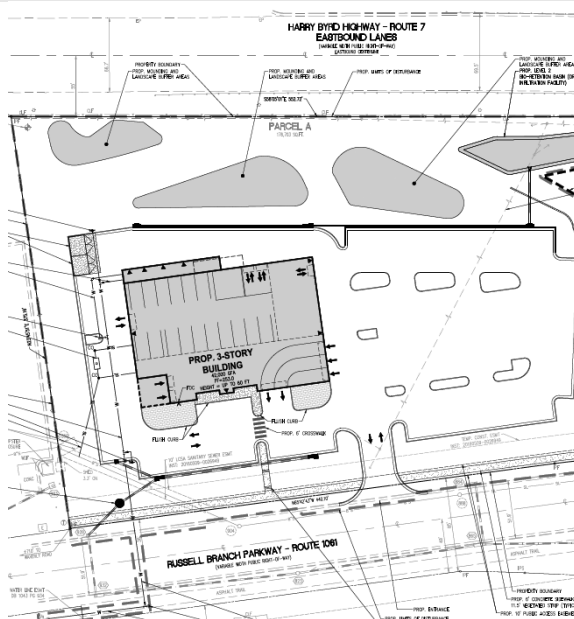


Ashburn Station / The Regency ZMAP-2018-0010

No Change

This project, at the southwest corner of Ashburn Village Boulevard and Waxpool Road, was approved by the Board of Supervisors in December 2019 as a rezoning from 1 residential unit per acre to 24 residential units per acre. Up to 254 residential units will be built. The developer is installing a series of sidewalks and trails to connect the area to the Metro station. The developer also dedicated around 70 acres of parkland to the County.

Clearing of existing site vegetation has begun. Utility installation and road construction will commence soon.

The application was a rezoning from Office Park to Commercial Center to allow for the construction of a car dealership for vehicle sales and services. The official groundbreaking was held on Wednesday, February 17, 2021.

Building framing and construction has begun and should last for several months, with the dealership opening soon.

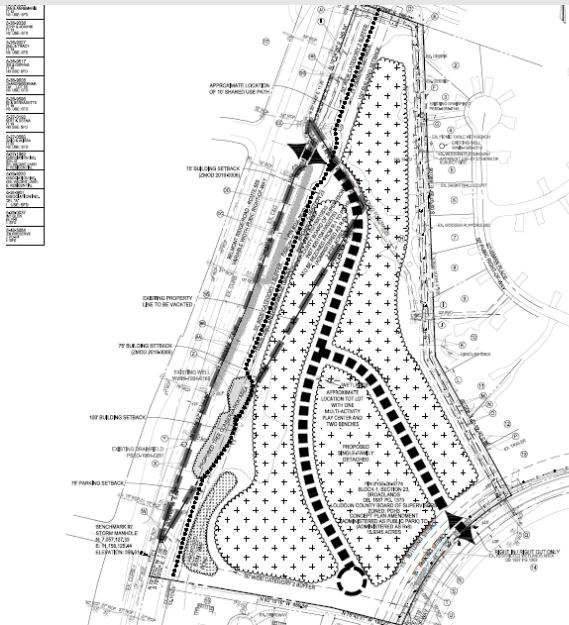

The multifamily units are open and residents have moved in; construction and sales of the townhomes has begun. The developer has installed sidewalks and crosswalks in the area. Site construction has begun and sales are anticipated to begin in summer 2021. Traffic signals are being installed at Demott Drive/Waxpool Road and Demott Drive/Mooreview Parkway, and will be operational in late 2021.

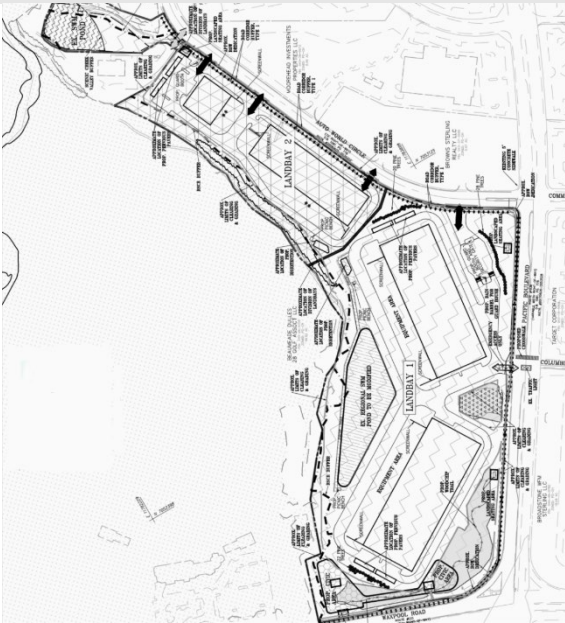

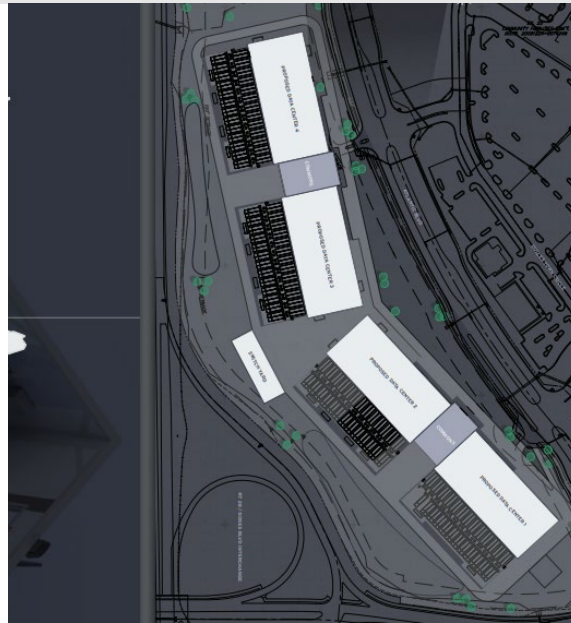

The applicant is proffering to construct sidewalks and trails along the property road frontages. This application is currently in the Loudoun County planning and zoning staff review process. The application is scheduled to appear before the Planning Commission at its October 26 Public Hearing.



Edgecore Dulles STMP-2018-0014

No Change

This project is to build four data centers, with one supporting out building on land in between Route 28 (Sully Road), Atlantic Boulevard, and Nokes Boulevard. The land was zoned for office park as part of application ZMAP-2007-0001, approved by the Board of Supervisors in 2011. Data centers are an approved, by-right use on land zone for office park. By-right uses are allowed without approval from the Board of Supervisors. Building exterior shell and retaining wall/site work construction is underway and will continue for the foreseeable future.



Kincora Village Center ZMAP-2018-0014

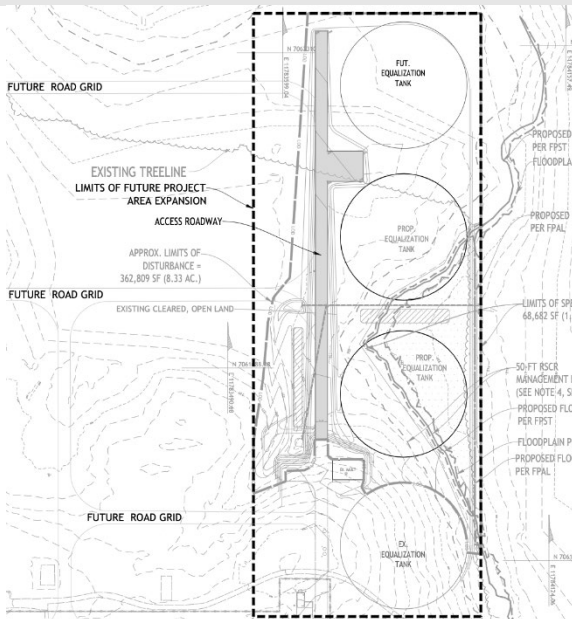
This project, located at the southwest corner of the Route 7/Route 28 interchange, was approved by the Board of Supervisors on April 20, 2021. The project is an alteration to the previously approved Kincora zoning and consists of allowing an additional 1,000 multi-family housing units (158 of which are attainable housing units), an additional 575,000 square feet of non-residential uses, approval of the two museum uses (NMISO and NVSC), and moves the Children's Science Center to a larger, 5-acre site backing to the Broad Run.

This application is on land at the Loudoun Water headquarters and treatment facility on Loudoun County Parkway in Ashburn. Loudoun Water seeks to receive approval from the Board of Supervisors to build two water storage tanks partially in the floodplain of the Broad Run. This application is currently in the Loudoun County planning and zoning staff review process. The application has not yet been scheduled to appear before the Planning Commission nor the Board of Supervisors.



Moorefield Station ZMAP-2001-0003

No Change

This project, approved by the Board of Supervisors in December 2002, allows for the construction of up to 6,000 residential units and up to 9,750,000 square feet of non-residential uses. The newest section of the project to be developed is near the intersection of Croson Lane and Old Ryan Road. There, Toll Brothers is building three bedrooms, two bathroom condos. Over the course of this project's build-out, the developers will install transportation and pedestrian improvements in the area.



Multifamily at Innovation ZMAP-2021-0007

This application is on land bound by the Fairfax County line to the east, Innovation Avenue to the south, and other parcels to the west and north. The application consists of rezoning almost 5 acres from one residential unit per acre to Planned Development-Transit Center to allow for the construction of 415 multifamily residential units. The application is still in the county planning and zoning staff review stages. It has not yet been scheduled to appear before the Planning Commission nor scheduled before the Board of Supervisors.



Project NOVA & Loudoun Center & Digital Loudoun (Left to Right) ZMAP-2019-0002 & ZRTD-2018- 0001 & ZRTD-2017-0005 **No Change**

These projects, located throughout Loudoun's "Data Center Alley," were approved by the Board of Supervisors in 2018 and 2019. All are to allow for the construction of data centers at the identified sites. Construction of most of the data centers is either underway or near completion. Sidewalks and/or asphalt trails have been installed along the road frontages as part of these projects. Construction will last for the next several months.

This project, at the southwest corner of Marblehead Drive and Loudoun County Parkway, was approved by the Board of Supervisors in November 2019 as a rezoning from commercial center to residential, to allow for the construction of 44 two-over-two multifamily units. The developers of One Loudoun have submitted a zoning amendment application to add an additional 1,954 multi-family residential units (including 98 attainable housing units) in the currently undeveloped sections of the community south of Route 7 and west of Loudoun County Parkway. The application is currently in the county planning and zoning staff review process and has not yet been scheduled to appear before the Planning Commission nor the Board.



**Rivana at Innovation Station

This application is for a 103-acre transit-oriented development on the border of Loudoun and Fairfax counties.

The current plans for the Loudoun section of Rivana include: Nearly 2,000 multifamily housing units; 1.8 million square feet of Class-A office space; A 185,000-square-foot retail village; A 265-room boutique hotel; A network of green and public spaces, including an 11-acre park. Phase 1A is scheduled to open for tenants in 2024. The property is bounded by Route 28, the Dulles Toll Road, Innovation Avenue, and the county line with Fairfax.

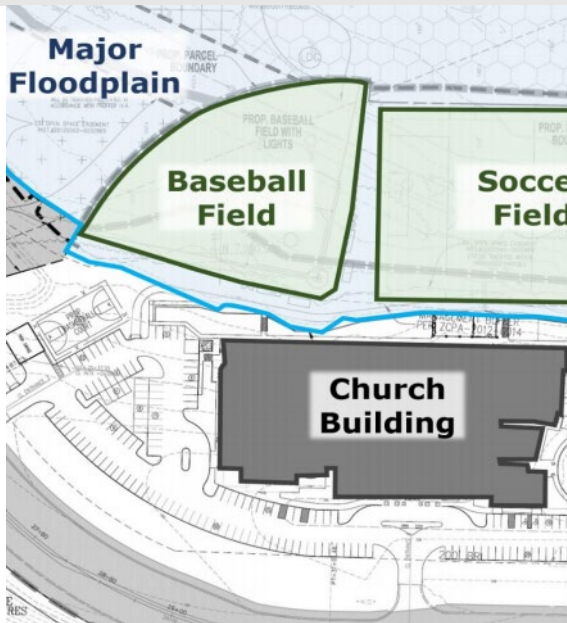

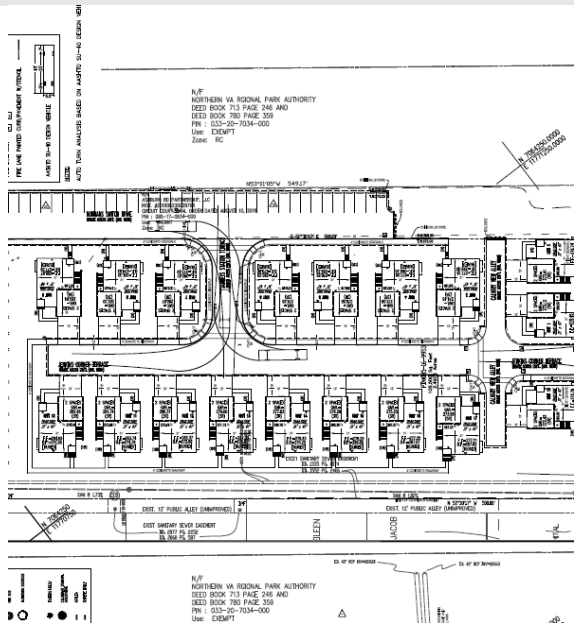

The church is prohibited from using pesticides & excess fertilizers on the fields, and conveyed an acre of land to the county to be used for a future trail connection.



Trail View STPL-2016-0023

No Change

This project is located in Old Ashburn on land in between Ashburn Road, Jenkins Lane, and the Washington and Old Dominion trail. The project includes the construction of 18 single family homes with associated parking spaces, roadways, and sidewalks. This project was allowed by-right, which means a property owner has the right to construct and subdivide their land into certain uses without having to submit an application before the Board of Supervisors for approval. Current building demolition has occurred at the project location and site clearing/preparation has begun.



**Waterside / Waterside North
ZMAP-2012-0006
ZCPA-2020-0014**

This project was approved by the Board of Supervisors in 2015 and encompasses most of the land bordered by the Innovation Avenue to the south, Route 28 (Sully Road) to the west, Old Ox Road to the north, and the Loudoun-Fairfax county line to the east. The project consists of filling in the recently closed quarry to create a centerpiece lake surrounded by high-density, high-rise spaces of residential, retail, commercial, cultural, and office uses. The application to amend a proffer to widen Old Ox Road will be at the September 28 Planning Commission Public Hearing.



**Waxpool Crossing
ZMAP-2019-0020
No Change**

This project, at the northwest corner of Ashburn Village Boulevard and Waxpool Road, was approved by the Broad of Supervisors on January 19, 2021 as a rezoning from a church property to high-density residential. The developer will build 384 multifamily units, including 44 attainable housing units. In addition to trails along Ashburn Village Boulevard and Waxpool Road, a roundabout will be constructed at the intersection of Waxpool Road and Faulkner Parkway. If, for some reason, the developer is unable to construct the roundabout, they must pay the county \$9.6 million.

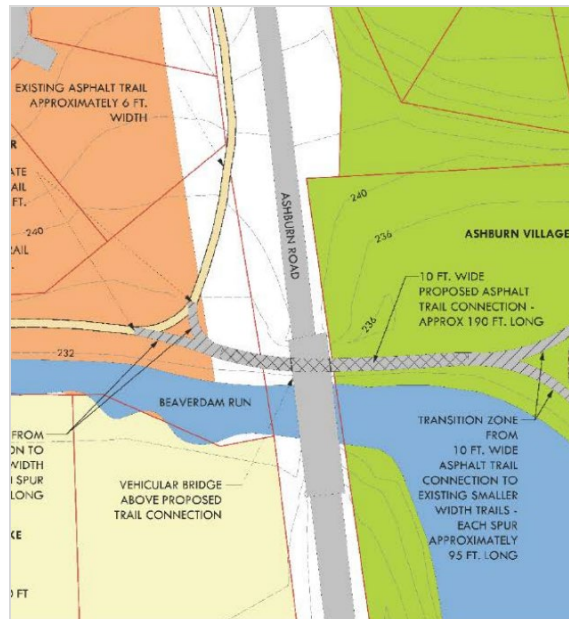

signal at Demott Drive and Waxpool Road has begun. The Board allocated up to \$300,000 to install a four-way stop at the intersection of Ashburn and Waxpool Roads. Signage and brush trimming will occur at the intersection of Shellhorn and Waxpool Roads. A roundabout is slated to be installed at the Faulkner Parkway intersection by the Waxpool Crossing developer.
