

REMINDER: Portion of Potomac View Road to Close for Construction Thursday, June 16



Construction teams with associated the Montebello Farms and Mount Sterling housing communities on Potomac View Road are scheduled begin work complete roadway improvements associated with their housing applications

beginning on Thursday, June 16, 2022. As a result, a portion of Potomac View Road will be closed between Cascades Parkway and Benedict Drive to through traffic for approximately four weeks for crews to widen Potomac View Road to four lanes.

Following the four-week closure, one eastbound lane will be opened from mid-July 2022 to the end of September 2022. Work is expected to be completed, with all four lanes open and operational, by early October 2022.

Those needing to reach properties along Potomac View Road will have access via Route 7 and Cascades Parkway or Potomac View Road; however, traffic will

not be able to go beyond Cascades Overlook on the eastern end of Potomac View Road and just past the First Baptist Church of Sterling on the western end of Potomac View Road in either direction.

Appropriate signage will be installed to direct traffic during this work.

SCOPE OF WORK

Improvements being implemented include:

- Widening Potomac View Road from two lanes to four lanes from the current taper just past the Church to Cascades Overlook.
- Installing an additional right turn lane at the intersection of Potomac View Road and Route 7 to better address queuing issues that frequently limit access to and from both Benedict Drive and Connemara Drive.
- Installing dedicated right and left turn lanes to Potomac View Road at the communities' entrances to allow for the consistent passage of through traffic.
- Construction of shared-use paths, including connections to the existing sidewalks, along Potomac View Road.
- Installation of fencing, landscaping, and buffers along Potomac View Road.

MORE INFORMATION

Additional updates on the status of the project will be released to the community as needed over the course of work being completed.



Board of Supervisors Adopts New Election Districts



During its June 7, 2022 meeting, the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors adopted amendments to the Codified Ordinances of Loudoun

County, <u>Chapter 207 – Election Districts</u>, which updates the county's election districts. The Board adopted the <u>LT-Revised 1 Plan</u>, which

was developed through a thorough public process over the past year.

New Election Districts Balance Population/Representation

The county's new election districts are the result of a process that was informed by the 2020 census and input from the public. The redrawing of election districts each decade is required by law. The redrawn districts were designed by the Board and members of the public to help maintain districts in which the number of residents is balanced over the next decade. Based on the 2020 census, the population of each adopted district ranges between 50,468 and 54,881 residents. Increases and decreases in the populations of each adopted district are forecasted to range between one and 17 percent of the forecasted 2030 target population of each district of 63,300 over the next ten years.

New District Name

The Board previously voted to name one newly redrawn district as the Little River District. The Blue Ridge District name will be retired. The names of the county's seven other election districts, also redrawn, will remain the same.



LCPS Summer Meals Program

Loudoun County Public Schools will expand the summer food program serving food-insecure students and families to include a distribution site at Leesburg Elementary School and the ability to pick up a week's worth of meals. LCPS officials worked closely with the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) to



receive waivers allowing expansion of the summer feeding program and allowing meals to be picked up by parents or quardians rather than consumed on-site.

The new program is as follows:

- Meal kits can be picked up at Park View High School, Leesburg Elementary School, Rolling Ridge Elementary School, Sterling Elementary School and Sugarland Elementary School on Mondays, from June 27 - August 8 between 9:30 and 11 a.m. (while supplies last). Meal kits, distributed for children ages 18 and younger, will include breakfast and lunch for 7 days.
- There is no requirement that the food be consumed on-site it is for pick-up only. This new program replaces previously announced times and information.
- Please note Leesburg Elementary has been added as a pick-up location.

Loudoun is 'Stroke Smart' County; Residents Encouraged to Know Warning Signs of a Stroke



Loudoun County is launching public awareness campaign residents, aimed at visitors and county employees about the importance of recognizing symptoms of a stroke and the need to call 911 immediately.

At its June 7, 2022, meeting, the Board of


Supervisors adopted a proclamation declaring Loudoun to be a "Stroke Smart County," joining a <u>regional</u> and <u>statewide effort</u> to improve the outcomes for people suffering a stroke.

The Board's proclamation encourages members of the community to participate in the "Stroke Smart: Spot-a-Stroke, Stop-a-Stroke, Save-a-Life" campaign to help reduce the deaths and disabilities caused by strokes. The proclamation was presented to members of the Loudoun County Combined Fire and Rescue System, Northern Virginia Emergency Medical Services, Inova Health and Dilworth, who advocates for early stroke recognition and access to treatment to prevent others from a difficult recovery such as his.

Public Encouraged to Participate in Naming of Historic Loudoun County Courthouse

Members of the public are encouraged to participate in the process for naming the historic Loudoun County Courthouse building in downtown Leesburg. The courthouse, constructed in 1895, is located at the southwest corner of the courthouse grounds at the corner of King and Market streets in Leesburg.

The county's Heritage Commission has reviewed the historic significance of the courthouse grounds and developed recommendations, presented to the Board of Supervisors in 2020, on how the county can fully reflect the history of the grounds and Loudoun County.

The commission has recommended the historic courthouse building be named in honor of Charles Hamilton Houston, who assembled and led an all-African American legal defense team for a murder trial there in 1933. The defense team, which included assistance from law student and future Supreme Court Justice Thurgood Marshall, challenged the all-white jury selection process, setting a historic legal precedent. Two years later, the Supreme Court ruled biased jury selection unconstitutional.

Individuals can comment on the proposed honoring of Houston or suggest additional names through an <u>online form</u>. Suggested names should have a demonstrated connection to the history of the courthouse; submissions will be reviewed for compliance with the county's naming standards. <u>The comment form is open now through Friday</u>, June 24, 2022.

Loudoun County will host a virtual public input session on the development of an updated energy strategy for the county Wednesday, June 29, 2022, 6:30 – 7:30 p.m.

Links to login information for the virtual session are available for review at loudoun.gov/energy.

Members of the public are encouraged to watch a video presentation and submit an <u>online comment form</u> prior to the meeting. Members of the public must sign up in advance by 12:00 p.m., June 28, 2022, to provide comments during the meeting.

The county is in the process of updating the <u>Loudoun County Energy Strategy</u> (<u>PDF</u>) adopted in 2009 and is seeking comments from members of the community in three major topic areas.

- Supporting Renewable Energy Development in Loudoun County: Facilitating greater solar and other types of renewable energy use.
- Stimulate Communitywide Actions: Ensuring energy equity and reducing emissions from the transportation, residential and commercial sectors.
- Government by Example: Includes actions the Loudoun County government can undertake with its own energy practices.

The public input session follows a <u>Board of Supervisors' Energy Strategies</u> <u>Planning workshop in 2021</u>, which featured a facilitated discussion on the priorities, process and approach for updating the county's current energy strategy, which provides a comprehensive, 30-year road map of energy strategies for the Loudoun County government and community. The discussion included the role of the county government in energy sustainability, possible funding mechanisms for implementing the energy strategy, and the identification of new programs and initiatives that can benefit all residents and businesses.

Loudoun County will host an electronics recycling event on Saturday, June 18, 2022, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the Leesburg Park and Ride commuter parking lot, Road, 19730 Sycolin Leesburg the (at intersection of Gourley Transit Drive and Sycolin Road).

Fees will be charged for televisions, computer monitors, and hard drive destruction services (upon request). Only credit cards will be accepted; no cash, no checks.

Items Accepted

Typical electronics that will be accepted: Televisions, desktop computers, computer monitors, laptops, servers, mainframes, circuit boards, hard drives, modems, printers, fax machines, scanners, copiers, network cables, power cables, extension cords, electrical wire, holiday lights, uninterruptible power supply (UPS), surge protectors, answering machines, microwave ovens, calculators, iphones, smart phones, desk phones, pagers, stereo and video receivers, DVR/CD/DVD/VHS players, video game consoles, cables, stereo speakers, radios, small household appliances such as vacuum cleaners, toaster ovens, coffee makers, blenders, hair dryers, curling irons and clothes irons.

Items Not Accepted

 Electronics that will not be accepted include household appliances such as refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners, stoves, washers and dryers, fluorescent light bulbs, smoke alarms, mercury thermostats, household batteries and vehicle batteries, ballasts, light bulbs, smoke detectors, equipment that contains chemicals, asbestos, radioactive components, or liquid fuels, microwave glass plates, PCBs, aerosols and equipment that contains mercury.

Loudoun County sells selected items online through Public Surplus, which was created specifically for public agencies. Anyone interested in bidding on the items must be registered with publicsurplus.com. Registration is free; however, a 9.75% buyer's premium is charged to all purchases. Loudoun County government and school employees are subject to bidding limitations under the auction terms and conditions, which are available on the Public Surplus site.

Loudoun County has specific hours for buyers to pick up their items at 14 Cardinal Park Drive, Suite 106, in Leesburg. Items must be picked up by appointment, 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. or 1:00 - 3:00 p.m. The dates for items to be picked up are noted on each auction item listed on the Loudoun County auction site.

Loudoun County Announces Winners of 'I Voted' Sticker Contest

The Loudoun County Office of Elections and Voter Registration pleased to announce the winners of its first-ever "I Voted" Sticker Contest. The three winning designs will be used as "I Voted" stickers distributed voters who cast their ballots at early voting and Election Day polling

locations in Loudoun as well as those who vote by mail for the November 2022 general election.

The winners are:

- Election Day Sticker by Torrey McGlenn: This green, yellow, blue and white sticker features the words "I Voted! Loudoun County" with representations of Dulles Airport and Loudoun's agricultural community.
- In-Person, Early Voting Sticker by Julie Beacham: The word "Early" will be added to the words "I Voted" which appear in red and white script over an outline of Loudoun County against a blue background.
- Voting by Mail Sticker by Nicole McGee: The words "I Voted by Mail" appear in a circle around an outline of Loudoun County with a U.S. flag motif.

The contest was open to all Loudoun County residents. The guidelines called for the basic sticker design to be a circle, two inches in diameter, that included the phrase "I Voted" or a variation of the theme and no more than 4 colors.

Eight finalists were selected from a total of 84 submissions. An online vote was held to determine the three winning entries.

Mental Health First Aid

Mental Health First Aid offers training that teaches people how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental illness and substance use disorders. The trainings are usually held over a two-day period, with the class lasting for about three hours each day.
