Dear Algonkian,

This past Tuesday night at the Board of Supervisors meeting, I was proud to present our Pollinator Week Resolution to Ron Circe of Banshee Reeks Nature Preserve!

Worldwide, approximately 1,000 plants are grown for food, beverages, fibers, spices, and medicines need to be pollinated by animals in order to produce the goods on which we depend.

Foods and beverages produced with the help of pollinators include blueberries, chocolate, coffee, melons, peaches, pumpkins, vanilla, and almonds. Plants that depend on a single pollinator species, and likewise, pollinators that depend on a single type of plant for food are interdependent. If one disappears, so will the



other which is why it is so important to celebrate and better understand the importance they play in our ecosystem everyday.

That is why I have made it a point of my time in office to work with and support the Planning Commission who has been regularly asking developers to commit to pollinator-friendly native plant landscaping and to install and maintain pollinator gardens in new development or redevelopment projects throughout the County. To date, this has resulted in at least 50 projects which will have 70% or more native plants in the landscaped areas and 4 pollinator gardens or meadows across the county.
