Dear Broad Run Friends and Neighbors,

I hope everyone had an enjoyable and relaxing holiday season. As tomorrow is the last day of 2022 and we wish this year farewell, I hope you all have a very Happy New Year. May this coming year bring you many adventures, possibilities, and successes.

At this Tuesday's Business Meeting the Board will consider various [organizational matters](#) for the new year. This includes confirming our meeting schedule and committee assignments. Our meeting schedule is anticipated to remain largely the same with Board Business Meetings occurring on the first and third Tuesday of each month and Public Hearings being held on the second Wednesday of each month, however, there may be slight adjustments to start times with Business Meeting beginning at 4:00pm instead of 5:00pm. I will continue to serve as Co-Chair of the Board of Supervisors' Joint Board and School Board Committee and as a member of the Transportation and Land Use Committee.

There are also three items coming before the Board this upcoming month that I would like to highlight. The Board will hear at its January 11th Public Hearing proposed changes to the county's zoning ordinance for short-term rental properties in Loudoun. The zoning ordinance amendments makes clarifications between short-term rentals that are for the entire property or for only a portion of the house. At its January 17th Business Meeting, the Board will vote whether to approve or deny proposed changes to the Airport Overlay District (AOD), including clarifying whether a property owner is required to disclose the overlay district of the home at the time of a sale. Also scheduled for the January 17th Business Meeting is the Hyde Park residential rezoning application. No more deferrals of the Hyde Park application will be granted. Lastly, I have received several questions from constituents about three pre-applications that have been featured in local media: Ashburn Crossing Residential (outside Ashby Ponds), Amazon Distribution Facility (near Ashburn Village at Route 7), and Jenkins Lane Residential (on Jenkins Lane in Old Ashburn). I want to explain

what a pre-application (PRAP) is and the general process of a land use application. A PRAP is a meeting for any legislative land use proposal (rezonings, special exceptions, sign development plans, etc.) in which a developer can receive feedback from County staff on their proposal at no cost. A PRAP does not mean that an official land use application has been submitted with the County. If an applicant (developer/property owner) chooses to move forward with their proposal, they will then file an official land use application and move to the staff review stage where licensed planners and engineers work with the applicant to address areas of the application that should be improved. This includes reviews for traffic, environmental standards, general community planning, and more. After several back-and-forth discussions between the applicant and county staff, the application will then be moved to the Planning Commission. It is at the Planning Commission where the application will appear for the first of two public hearings. After hearing public input and having discussion on the application, the Planning Commission will then forward the application to the Board of Supervisors with a recommendation of approval or denial. Once the application comes to the Board of Supervisors, it appears for another Public Hearing and then is formally approved or denied by the Board. All large, official/formal land use applications being reviewed in the Broad Run District are included in the newsletter below. I do not include PRAPs as they are too early in the process. If you have any questions about these three PRAPs or any other land use projects in the Broad Run District, please contact the Broad Run Office.

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Loudoun Offers Christmas Tree Recycling at Several Locations

Loudoun County is offering five locations for residents to recycle their Christmas trees now through January 20, 2023. Only natural cut trees and wreaths will be accepted: no artificial trees or artificial wreaths. The trees will be converted into mulch, which is available free of charge to Loudoun County residents year-round at the Loudoun County landfill.

Residents who receive curbside recycling service may contact their homeowners association, town office or recycling service provider for Christmas tree collection schedules.

Whether dropping off at one of the county's Christmas tree collection sites or at the curb, remember to remove all ornaments, lights, tinsel, wire, stand and tree bag. If the tree is in a tree bag, remove and dispose of the bag with your regular trash. To recycle a natural wreath, remove and dispose of all wire, bows, twine, lights and ornaments before recycling the wreath. If removal of these items is not possible, then dispose of the tree or wreath with your regular garbage.

The Christmas Tree Recycling Program is a public service for Loudoun County residents only. Tree vendors operating in Loudoun County with leftover trees may recycle them at the Loudoun

County landfill for \$68 a ton. Netting, rope, wire, tags and other items must be removed and disposed of prior to recycling. Visit loudoun.gov/landfill or call 703-771-5500 for more information.

- Sterling: Claude Moore Park, 46150 Loudoun Park Lane, Sterling, 20164 (Use Loudoun Park Lane entrance, follow signs for ball fields.), Open daily, 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Loudoun County Resumes Silver Line Bus Fares Beginning Jan. 3

On Tuesday, January 3, 2023, Loudoun County will resume collecting fares on its Silver Line bus routes, including the paratransit bus service. Board Committee to Consider Prohibiting Certain Exotic and Venomous Animals Dec. 13

Loudoun County Animal Services will host a virtual public meeting at 6:00 pm on Thursday, January 6 on the proposed ordinance changes to ownership of certain exotic and venomous animals. If approved, the ordinance would prohibit private ownership and breeding of certain types of exotic and venomous animals, such as wolf hybrids, kangaroos, scorpions, baboons, venomous snakes and other venomous reptiles, and non-native venomous spiders. New Dulles Toll Road Rates Take Effect January 1, 2023

Effective January 1, 2023, the toll rate for passenger vehicles at the Main Toll Plaza on the Dulles Toll Road will increase to \$4.00 at the main toll plaza and \$2.00 at ramp plazas.

The 2023 toll increase was approved by the Metropolitan Washington Airports Authority board of directors following a public comment period in 2022. 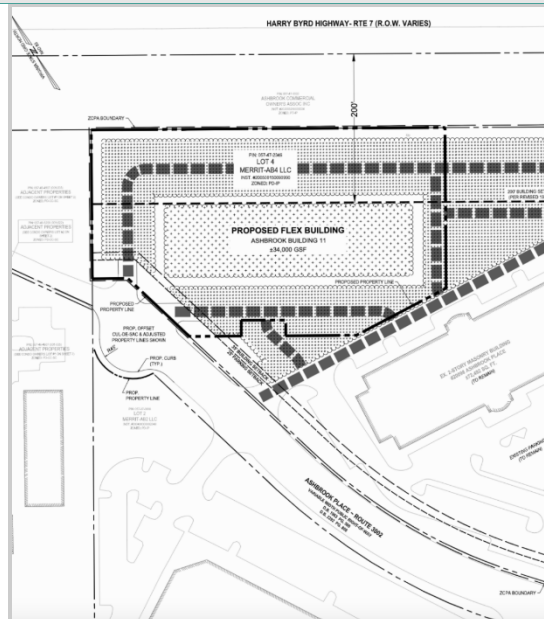

**Ashbrook Place
ZMAP-2018-0004**

No Change

This project, at the eastern corner of Ashbrook Place and Russell Branch Parkway, was approved by the Board of Supervisors in December 2019. The approval was for a rezoning from industrial park to residential to allow for the construction of 190 multifamily units. Sewer installation and road construction have begun. The developer will construct the remaining asphalt path on the northeastern side of Russell Branch Parkway from Savin Hill Drive to Ashbrook Place. Unit construction and sales are currently underway.



**Ashbrook Place Lot 4
ZCPA-2021-0006**

No Change

This project consists of reducing a building setback along Route 7 from 300 feet to 200 feet in order to construct an already allowed flex-industrial office building. The proposed building would be built over an existing parking lot between Route 7 and 20098 Ashbrook Place, Ashburn.

This application was approved by the Board of Supervisors at its September 14th Public Hearing after receiving a unanimous Planning Commission recommendation of approval and having no outstanding land use issues from Loudoun County planning and zoning staff.



Ashburn Crossing Phase II No Change

This project, on land bound by Loudoun County Parkway to the east, Gloucester Parkway to the south, and Ashby Ponds to the west, is being constructed by-right (without Board of Supervisors approval). The project consists of building three flex-industrial buildings and a gas station on the vacant land at the site. The flex-industrial buildings will be identical to the existing buildings directly to the north. Two of the three buildings are currently in the framing process with foundation pouring underway for the third building along Gloucester.



Ashburn Station / The Regency ZMAP-2018-0010

No Change

This project, at the southwest corner of Ashburn Village Boulevard and Waxpool Road, was approved by the Board of Supervisors in December 2019 as a rezoning from 1 residential unit per acre to 24 residential units per acre. Up to 254 residential units will be built. The developer is installing a series of sidewalks and trails to connect the area to the Metro station, and dedicating around 70 acres of parkland to the County. Sidewalk installation, road construction, and building framing is currently underway.

No Change

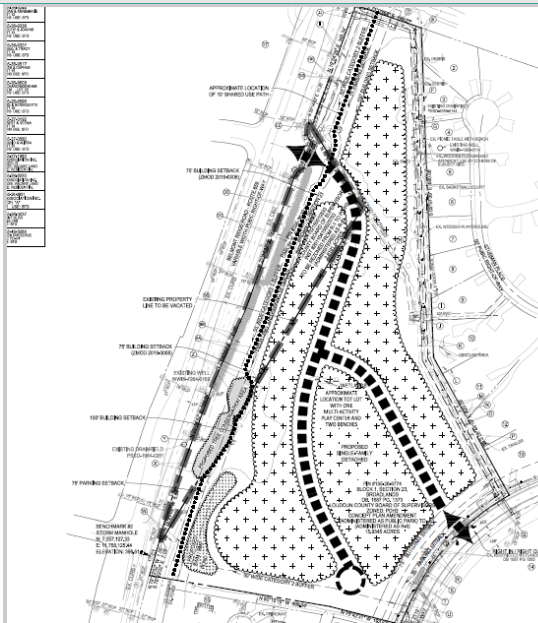
This project, on land in between Claiborne Parkway, Ashburn Road, and Russell Branch Parkway, was approved by the Board of Supervisors in March 2018, and allows for 105 age restricted townhomes, along with 34,000 square feet of retail space. The developer has also submitted two special exception applications for a gas station and a drive-thru restaurant to be built in the commercial section. The application is in the planning staff review stage and is not yet scheduled for a public meeting.



**Broadlands Demott & Silver
ZMAP-2016-0010
ZMOD-2021-0018**

No Change

This project, on land between Demott Drive, the Dulles Greenway, Waxpool Road, and Old Ryan Road, was approved by the Board of Supervisors in December 2019. The application allows Van Metre to construct townhomes and multifamily units, office space, retail space, a hotel site, and educational spaces. Unit construction is currently underway, with home occupancy occurring soon. Sidewalks, signals, and other road improvements will be installed in the nearby area.



Broadlands Hillside ZMAP-2019-0005

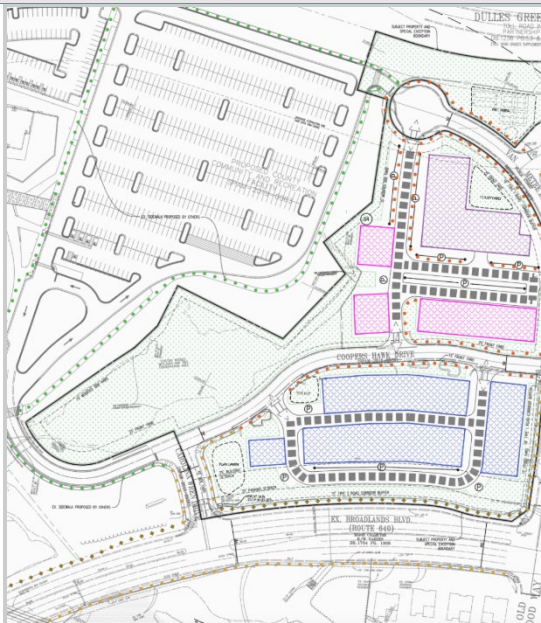
No Change

This project, on land in between Belmont Ridge Road and Truro Parish Drive, south of the two water towers, was approved by the Board of Supervisors in November 2019. The approved rezoning provides for the construction of 60 single family homes by Van Metre that will become part of the Broadlands community. Tree clearing and site preparation has been completed, with utility, road, and building construction currently underway. Home sales are anticipated this spring with occupancy this winter.



Broadlands Hyde Park ZMAP-2021-0006

This application, on land bounded by Broadlands Boulevard to the south, Belmont Ridge Road to the west, the Dulles Greenway to the north, and the LCPS Admin Building to the east, is a rezoning request from office to residential. The proposal consists of 779 townhouse and multi-family units. The Hyde Park application is currently scheduled to appear at the January 17th Board of Supervisors' Business Meeting for a final vote of approval or denial (no more deferrals will be granted). **Broadlands Section 104
ZCPA-2021-0011**

No Change

This application, on land at the northeast corner of the Broadlands Boulevard and Van Metre Drive intersection, is to rezone 10 acres from office and industrial to residential. The proposal consists of 45 townhouse units, 30 condo units, and 88 apartment units, for a total of 163 residential housing units. The application is currently in the Loudoun County planning and zoning staff review and analysis stage and has not been scheduled for an appearance at public meetings.



**Colonnade
ZMAP-2021-0004**

No Change

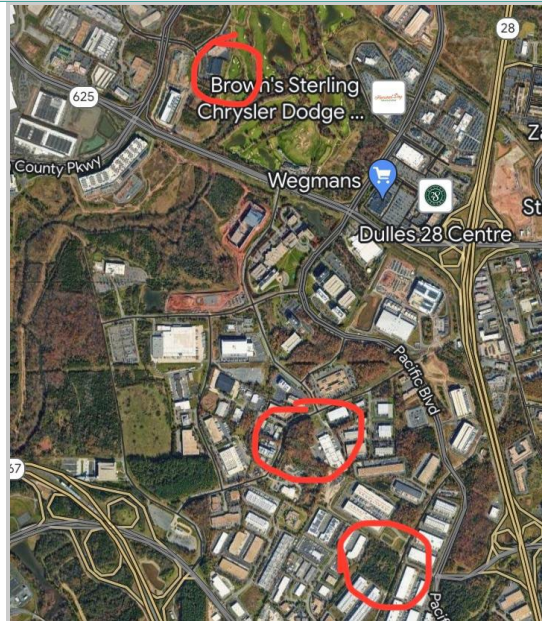
This project is to rezone a 4.15-acre parcel of vacant land, located at the northeast corner of City Center Boulevard and Stefanie Drive in Sterling, from commercial to residential to allow for the construction of up to 61 townhouses. The application was approved by the Board of Supervisors on September 6th, 2022. As part of the project, the developer will construct a sidewalk on the west side of City Center Boulevard from Dulles Center Boulevard to Mirage Way.



Commonwealth Center ZMAP-2020-0013

No Change

This project, bounded by Route 7 to the north, Loudoun County Parkway to the west, Russell Branch Parkway to the south, and Commonwealth Center Drive to the east, consists of constructing up to 507 multifamily condo and apartment units on the remaining vacant land at the Commonwealth Center site. The project was approved by the Board in an 8-1 vote on April 19th, 2022. The developer will construct a missing trail link to Marblehead Drive and construct a crosswalk at Thorndike Street and Loudoun County Parkway.



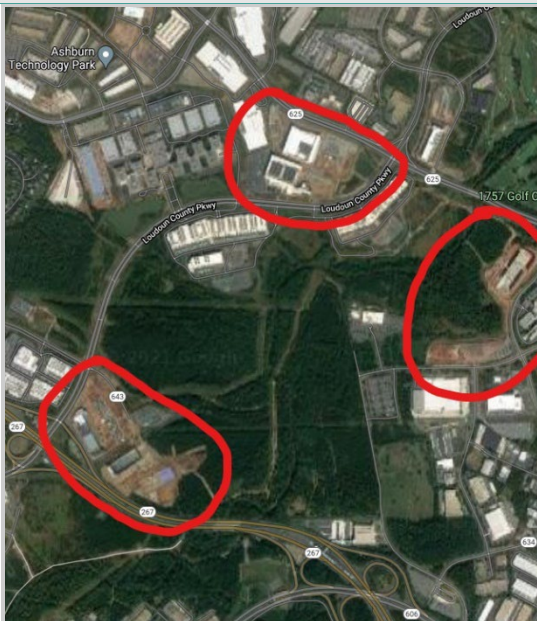
Data Center Applications (21800 Beaumeade Circle & 1501 Moran Road & Aligned Energy Data Center)

These applications, located throughout Loudoun's "Data Center Alley," have all been submitted for rezoning to allow for a data center or to expand for for a larger already existing data center.

Moran Road will appear before the Board at its July 14th Public Hearing with an approval recommendation from the Planning Commission. The Beaumeade Circle application was approved by the Board at its October 12th Public Hearing.

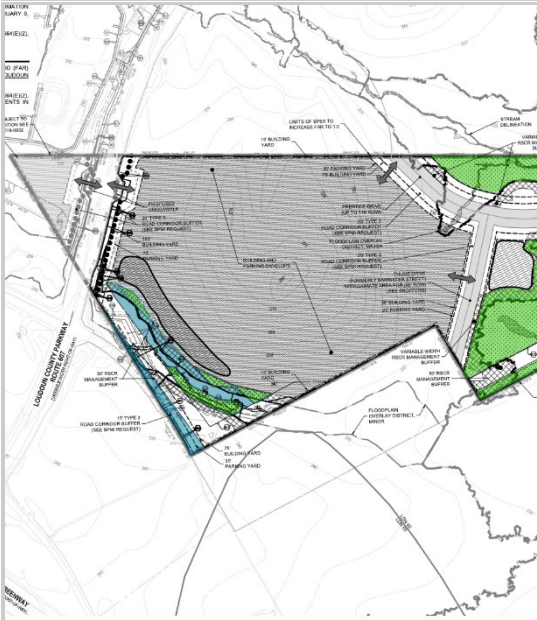
Several applications for power lines and power substations are currently in the staff review stages or coming before the Planning Commission and the Board of Supervisors. The

Substation application is still in the planning and zoning staff review process. The NIVO substation application

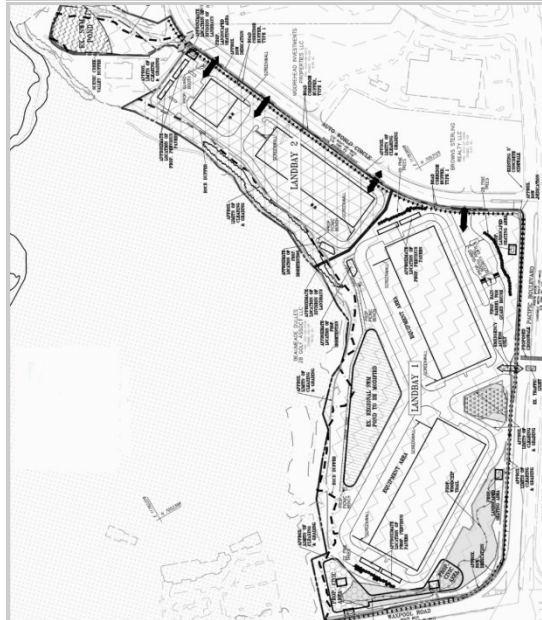

This project, on land northeast of the intersection with Loudoun County Parkway and Shellhorn Road, is to amend the property zoning to increase data center density allowed on the site from 1,671,000 square feet to 4,049,864 square feet. The applicant is also requesting to eliminate the requirement for a landscaping berm along the property frontages on public

appeared at the December 12th Planning Commission public hearing and was forwarded to the Board of Supervisors with a recommendation of approval.

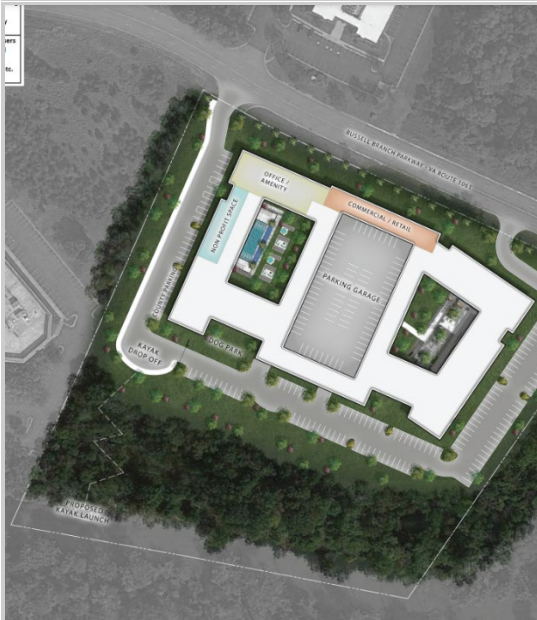


**Dulles 28 Technology Park
ZMAP-2020-0015
No Change**

This project, on land bounded by the 1757 Golf Club to the west, Waxpool Road to the south, Pacific Boulevard to the east, and Auto World Circle to the north, consists of the construction of two data centers and other industrial uses (proposed as a flex industrial building along Auto World Circle). The developer will construct sidewalks and trails along the property road

roads, and to reduce the setback requirements from the property line to buildings.

The application was approved by the Board of Supervisors at its February 1st, 2022 meeting.



Flats at Broad Run ZMAP-2020-0011

[This application](#) is on land south of Russell Branch Parkway, and north of the Broad Run, encompassing the former Ashburn North Park and Ride Lot. The applicant seeks to rezone from office park to residential to allow for the construction of 450 multi-family housing units, 25% of which would be attainable housing units. This application is currently in the staff review process. As part of the rezoning, the

frontages, repave Auto World Circle, and has committed to several design guidelines for the buildings.

This application was approved by the Board 5-4.

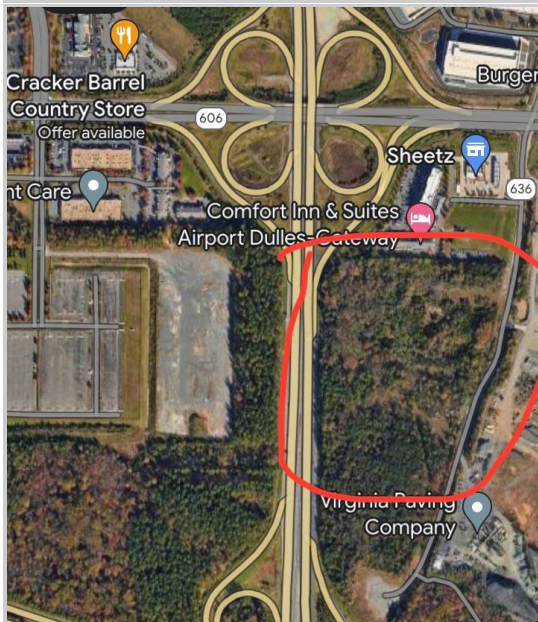

[This project](#) is on land northeast of the Dulles Greenway between the Ashburn Metro Station and the Loudoun Station development. The project was approved in conjunction with the Loudoun Station development by the Board of Supervisors in December 2003. The two developments can construct up to 1,514 multi-family residential units and up to 1.8 million square

applicant has offered to buy the Park and Ride Lot from the county. At the December 6th Business Meeting the Board agreed to sell the former Ashburn North Park and Ride Lot, provided the rezoning is approved at a later date.



**Innovation Gateway
ZMAP-2022-0001
No Change**

This application is located on land bounded by Route 28 to the west, vacant land to the south, Shaw Road to the east, and hotels and the Sheetz gas station to the north. The application proposes to rezone the 24-acre parcel from a research and development park to allow for data centers and residential units. The

feet of commercial, retail, and/or office space. Plans for the Gramercy District portion of the project are still in conceptual design stages with construction beginning several years from now.



**Innovation Multifamily
ZMAP-2021-0007
No Change**

This project is on land bound by the Fairfax County line to the east, Innovation Avenue to the south, and other parcels to the west and north. The application consists of rezoning 5 acres from one residential unit per acre to Planned Development-Town Center to allow for the construction of 415 multifamily residential

application is currently in the Loudoun County planning and zoning staff review stage and has not been scheduled to appear before the Planning Commission nor the Board of Supervisors.



**Kincora Village Center
ZMAP-2018-0014**

No Change

This project, located at the southwest corner of the Route 7/Route 28 interchange, was approved by the Board of Supervisors in April 2021. The project consists of 2,400 multi-family housing units (386 of which are attainable housing units), over 2 million square feet of non-residential uses, approval of the two museum

units. The application was approved at the Board of Supervisors' November 15 Business Meeting in a 6-3 vote. The applicant will construct a neighborhood park on the parcel along with trails and lighting in the vicinity.



**Loudoun Station
ZMAP-2002-0005**

No Change

This project is on land south west of Shellhorn Road, and southeast of the Ashburn Home Depot, near the Ashburn Metro Station. The project was approved in conjunction with the Gramercy District development by the Board of Supervisors in December 2003. Loudoun Station plans to develop 1,159 multi-family

uses (NMISO and NVSC), and placing the Children's Science Center to a larger, 5-acre site backing to the Broad Run. **A change** to the timeline for constructing a public plaza was approved on April 19th, 2022.

No Change

The project will construct a 117,000-square-foot recreation and community center on Broadlands Boulevard, west of the intersection with Claiborne Parkway. Crews have begun clearing vegetation from the site and establishing tree protection in preparation for construction. For the next few weeks, site work activities, including utility and building foundation installation will continue. Loudoun County held a groundbreaking to celebrate the beginning of construction on Thursday, June 16, 2022. Children's Science Center

At the request of Supervisor Glass and Supervisor Turner, the Board has approved and [funded the design and construction](#) of an asphalt trail under Ashburn Road, on the north side of Beaverdam Run, connecting the existing trails in Ashburn Village and Ashburn Manor. The Board allocated \$112,000 to complete the project, which is currently in the design stages. [A study](#) was also completed to determine the best way to add pedestrian facilities crossing Beaverdam Run from the north and south. An approximately \$4 million pedestrian bridge on the west side of Ashburn Road was determined the best option.



No Change

This project includes the construction of a regional science center through a multi-party agreement. The Science Center will be built on an approximately 5-acre site backing to the Broad Run at the Kincora development.

Currently, the land is in the final stages of being transferred from the developer to the center. Loudoun is contributing \$15 million, and the Commonwealth of Virginia is contributing \$40 million, of the \$75 million cost of the project. Construction is estimated to begin in 2022 with the center opening by early 2024.

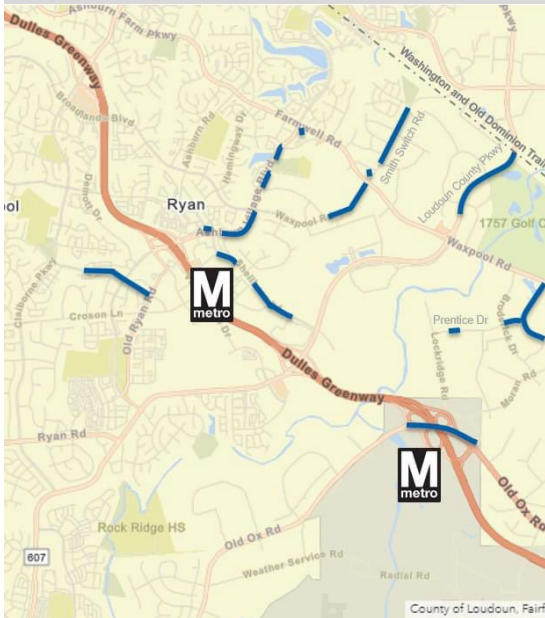
