Morven Park




Can you guess where this photo on the left was taken? It is the rarely seen south side of the Davis mansion at Morven Park on the edge of Leesburg.

FY 2024 Budget



County Administrator Tim Hemstreet presented a <u>proposed budget</u> for the Loudoun County government to the Board for FY 2024, which begins July 1, 2023. The budget totals \$4.2 billion in appropriations for the County Government and Loudoun County Public Schools (LCPS).

The proposed budget has been prepared at a real property tax rate of \$0.87 per \$100 of assessed value, which is 2 cents below the current real property tax rate of \$0.89 per \$100 of assessed value. While the proposed tax rate for FY 2024 is lower than the current tax rate, the proposed rate is 6.5 cents above the overall equalized rate of \$0.805, which is the rate at which the average real property owner's tax bill would remain flat year over year. The homeowner's equalized tax rate is \$0.83. This means that while the proposed tax rate is lower than the current tax rate, the average homeowner's tax bill would increase if the proposed tax rate is adopted. Under the proposed budget, the average homeowner in Loudoun County would have a real property tax bill increase of \$302, or about \$25 per month, in tax year 2023.

The proposed budget executes the planned reduction in the general personal property tax rate from \$4.20 per \$100 of assessed value to \$4.15 per assessed value for tax year 2023. This is to give vehicle owners some relief on their personal property tax bills.


LCPS requested a total of more than \$1.1 billion dollars in local tax funding for FY 2024. The County Administrator's proposed budget includes an increase of \$69.1 million in local tax funding over last year but leaves a gap of \$6.2 million from the School Board's adopted budget. In addition, due to an error in the Commonwealth of Virginia's revenue calculations, the resulting revenue shortfall of up to \$7.4 million could prompt the School Board to ask for additional funding.

We will determine the final tax rates and related budget policy decisions during March budget work sessions with final adoption of the FY 2024 budget expected at the Board's business meeting April 4th. There are three budget public hearings scheduled for:

Real Property Assessments



On February 7th, Commissioner of the Revenue, Robert Wertz, provided an annual update to the Board regarding **2023 real property assessments for commercial and residential properties.**

Data Centers are 58% of the total commercial real property value. The significant growth of data centers is the primary driver of commercial valuations. As depicted in the bar chart above, data centers have an overall assessed value of \$18.4 billion with 31 million square feet. Most of the growth between 2022 and 2023 is driven by an increase in the power capacity for existing data centers, land acquired by data centers, and new construction.

Loudoun County real estate assessment notices for tax year 2023 were mailed this month. These assessment notices, which are not tax bills, communicate to property owners the value of their real property as of January 1, 2023, and are reflective of sales activity occurring in the local real estate market during 2022. New values are also available online here.

Property owners who believe their assessments are incorrect will be provided with a 30-day period within which to file an **Application for Review with the Commissioner** until March 10th. Thereafter, appeals may be made to the Board of Equalization.

At the February 21st Board business meeting, the Board approved Scenario 2 (see table above), which provides smaller awards to more nonprofit organizations that have demonstrated adequate performance related to American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) outcomes, are in compliance with federal reporting requirements, and support life sustaining emergency services to targeted populations. The purpose of the County's

<u>ARPA Nonprofit Grant Program</u> is to support sustainable recovery from the negative economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic for Loudoun's disproportionately impacted residents.


The County received 27 applications from nonprofits who provide a program or service addressing one or more of these areas of need:

- Rental Assistance
- Food Assistance
- Utility Assistance
- Mental Health
- Other (providing supporting evidence of need and impacts of program/service)

I first supported a motion that would provide larger awards to nonprofit organizations who scored highest. That motion failed but I believe we need to fund the worthy nonprofits who applied and provide critical services for our community so I voted for Scenario 2. Thank you to staff who put a lot of thought and expertise into the review process.

Utility Work at North and Church Streets

North Street & Church Street Intersection Closure Night Work March 5 - March 10, 2023





Local traffic will be allowed into the closed sections of North Street and Church Street.

As part of Loudoun County's new <u>courthouse construction project</u>, construction crews will be performing utility work at the intersection of North Street and Church Streets NE in Leesburg in two phases. During this time, residents can expect lane closures, delays and noise associated with the construction. Additionally, due to work activity at the south end of Rotary Park, access to a portion of Rotary Park will be closed through March 10th.

Through Thursday, March 2nd, work is scheduled to take place from 7:00 am until 5:00 pm at the intersection of North and Church Streets NE. To complete this work, one lane of traffic will be closed to vehicular and pedestrian traffic at the intersection.

Overnight utility work is scheduled from Sunday, March 5th through Friday, March 10th from 7:00 pm until 7:00 am. During this period, the entire intersection will be closed at North Street NE and Church Street. Drivers and pedestrians should use extra caution when traveling through the area and follow directions from the posted signs and road crews.

Courthouse Construction Virtual Meeting

The County has scheduled a virtual construction update on the new courthouse project that is open to the public. This project includes the construction of a new 92,000-square-foot Loudoun County District Courthouse and renovation of existing courts facilities. The proposed Fiscal Year 2024 Budget and Six-Year Capital Improvements Program was presented to the Town Council February 13th. The proposed General Fund budget totals \$77.9 million. Parking in Downtown Leesburg: The Town of Leesburg will officially transition to utilizing the ParkMobile system for payment for its on-street parking spaces on Wednesday, March 1, 2023. Coin meters, which have been bagged since the beginning of the free holiday parking promotion in November, will be removed. Beginning March 1, those who wish to utilize on-street parking spaces may pay using the ParkMobile system, which has been utilized in the downtown since 2016. The Town has developed a Frequently Asked Questions webpage to aid in the transition to ParkMobile. Payments to ParkMobile can be made by downloading the ParkMobile app, texting ParkMobile, or scanning a QR code. On-street parking will remain free on weekday evenings after 5 p.m., on weekends, and Town holidays. In addition, the Town Hall parking garage will remain

The County is holding free Information sessions to familiarize residents with the eligibility criteria for the county's generous real estate tax and car tax relief program.

Loudoun County homeowners 65 or older or with disabilities who are below established income and wealth limits may benefit from a reduction in the amount of property taxes they pay on their homes and cars. Qualified applicants for real estate relief must have a gross combined income less than \$77,000 and net worth less than \$920,000. Up to \$10,000 in income of a spouse or relative residing in the home is excluded from the income calculation for real estate relief. Program participants saved over \$8.4 million in real estate and vehicle property taxes in tax year 2022.
