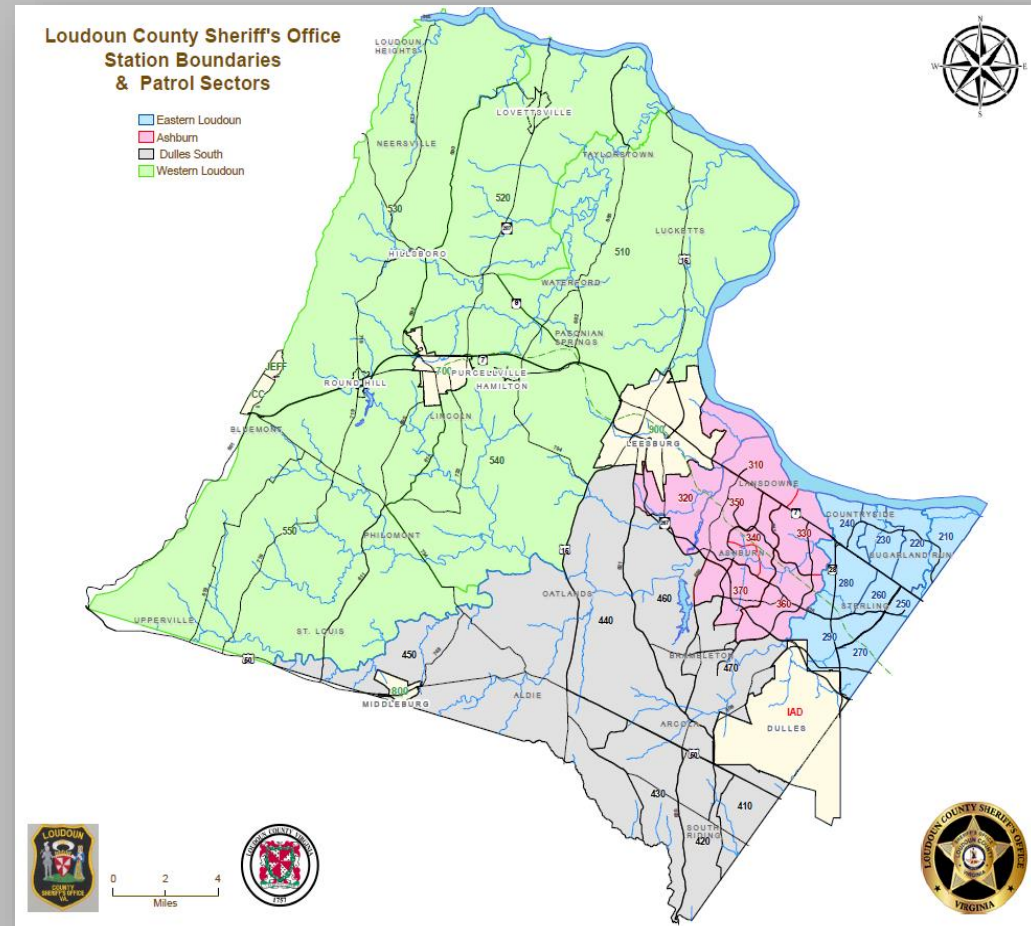

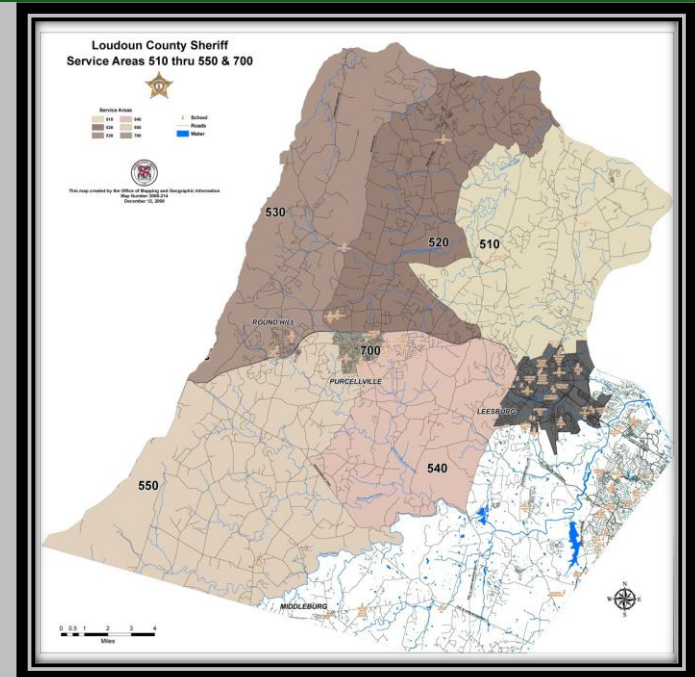

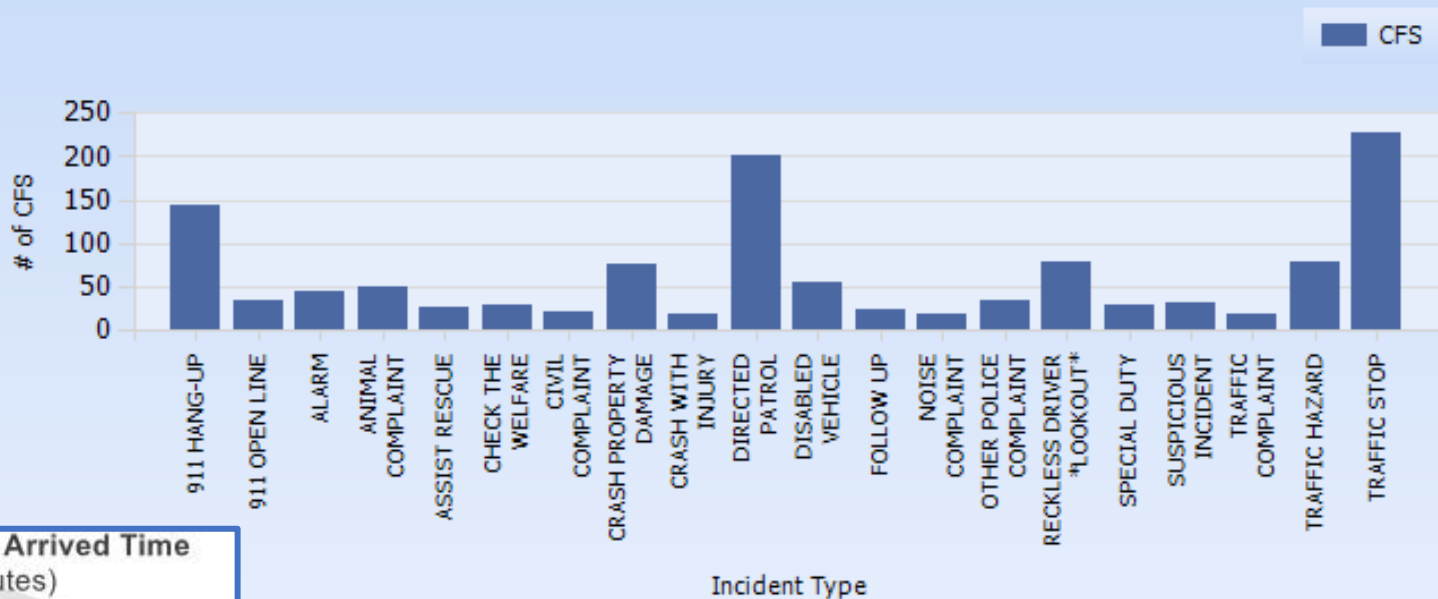

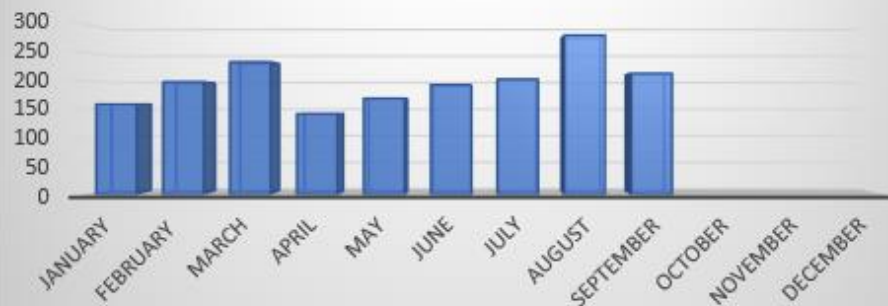

Imposter Scams Take on Many Forms

- You did not appear for jury duty and must pay a fine or be arrested.
- There is a warrant for your arrest that can be removed if you pay.
- You will be fined, arrested, or deported if you do not pay taxes or a debt.
- Social Security or Medicare benefits have been suspended.
- You owe back taxes/there is a problem with your return/please verify your information.



● Family Emergency Scam

- **Caller:** Hi Grandpa, it's me.
- **Grandpa:** [Name of grandson], is it you?
- **Caller:** Yes, it's [name]. I'm in trouble and I need money for bail. Don't tell Mom and Dad.
- **Grandpa:** Where are you?
- **Caller:** Hurry, Grandpa. A lawyer is going to call you.



Phishing and Smishing

- You get an email or text that appears to be from someone you know or an entity you are familiar with.
- It uses familiar logos and appears to be from a legitimate source.
- It's urgent and you are pressured to act immediately.
- You click on the link and malware or ransomware is installed, or you are requested to provide personal information.



How to Protect Yourself

- Education and vigilance.
- Utilize 2-Factor Authentication (2FA).
- Be conscious of your online footprint.
- Use different passwords for your accounts.
- Install virus protection on your computers.
- Keep all your devices up-to-date with new software updates.

How to Protect Yourself

- Use well-known investment firms and banks.
- Avoid paying with physical checks and avoid placing them in your mailbox.
- If you receive a call from a bank, utility company, etc., hang up and verify real contact numbers.
- If providing personal information online, only use sites that begin with: "https".



How to Protect Yourself

- Change your privacy settings on your phone.
- Be careful when using public wi-fi networks.
- Don't click on spam emails. Delete or mark them as spam.

Small Unmanned Aircraft System (sUAS)

LCSO Small Unmanned Aircraft System (sUAS)

The Loudoun County Sheriff's Office (LCSO) acquired a small Unmanned Aircraft System (sUAS), commonly referred to as a drone. It is the first in Virginia and the sixth in the United States to be equipped with a Project Lifesaver© antennae.

Members of the LCSO Search and Rescue Team are licensed Part 107 Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Pilots.





LCSO Small Unmanned Aircraft System (sUAS)

The Project Lifesaver© program is an electronic based locating system for people with medical conditions such as Alzheimer's, Autism, or other conditions, that have a tendency to wander from home and become lost.





LCSO Small Unmanned Aircraft System (sUAS)

Project Lifesaver© clients are equipped with a wristband transmitter that emits an automatic locating signal. If the client becomes lost, the specially trained deputies with the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office Search and Rescue Team will now use the sUAS, equipped with the Project Lifesaver payload, to help locate the client.





LCSO Small Unmanned Aircraft System (sUAS)

The LCSO sUAS is also enabled to carry a payload of cameras to assist in search and rescue operations.

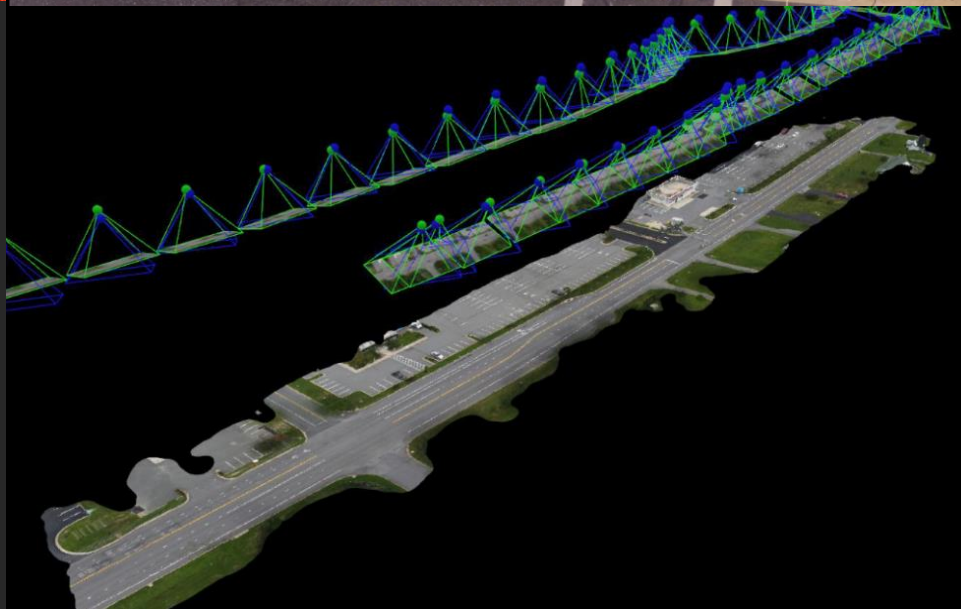
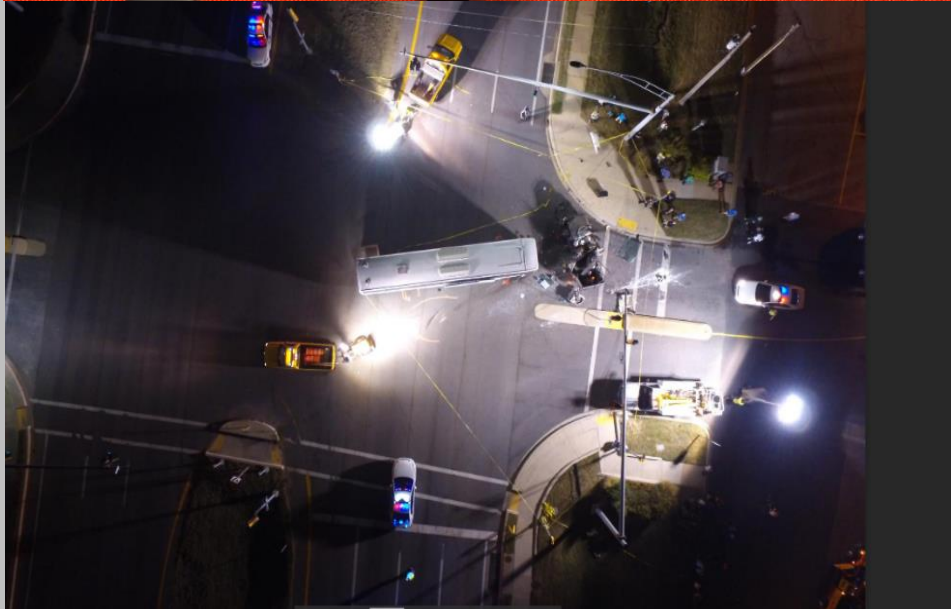
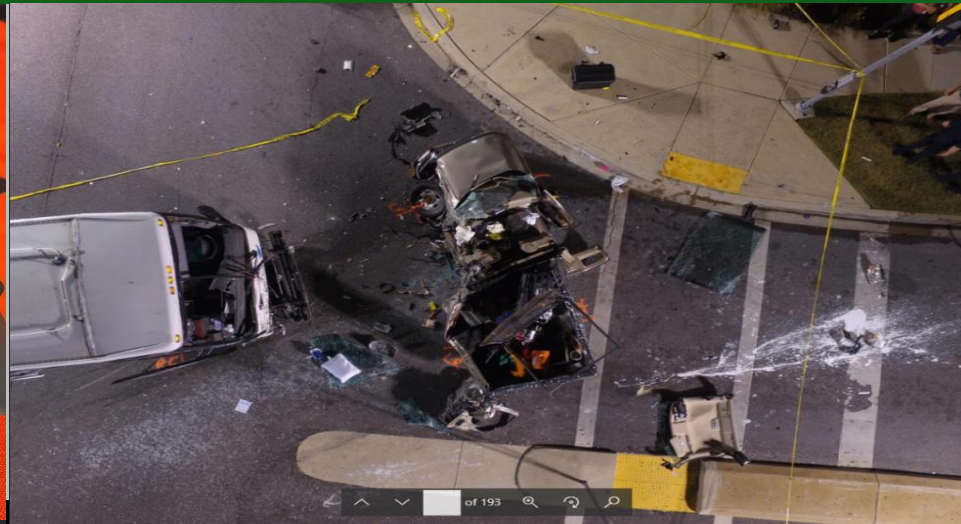


Infrared Thermal Camera



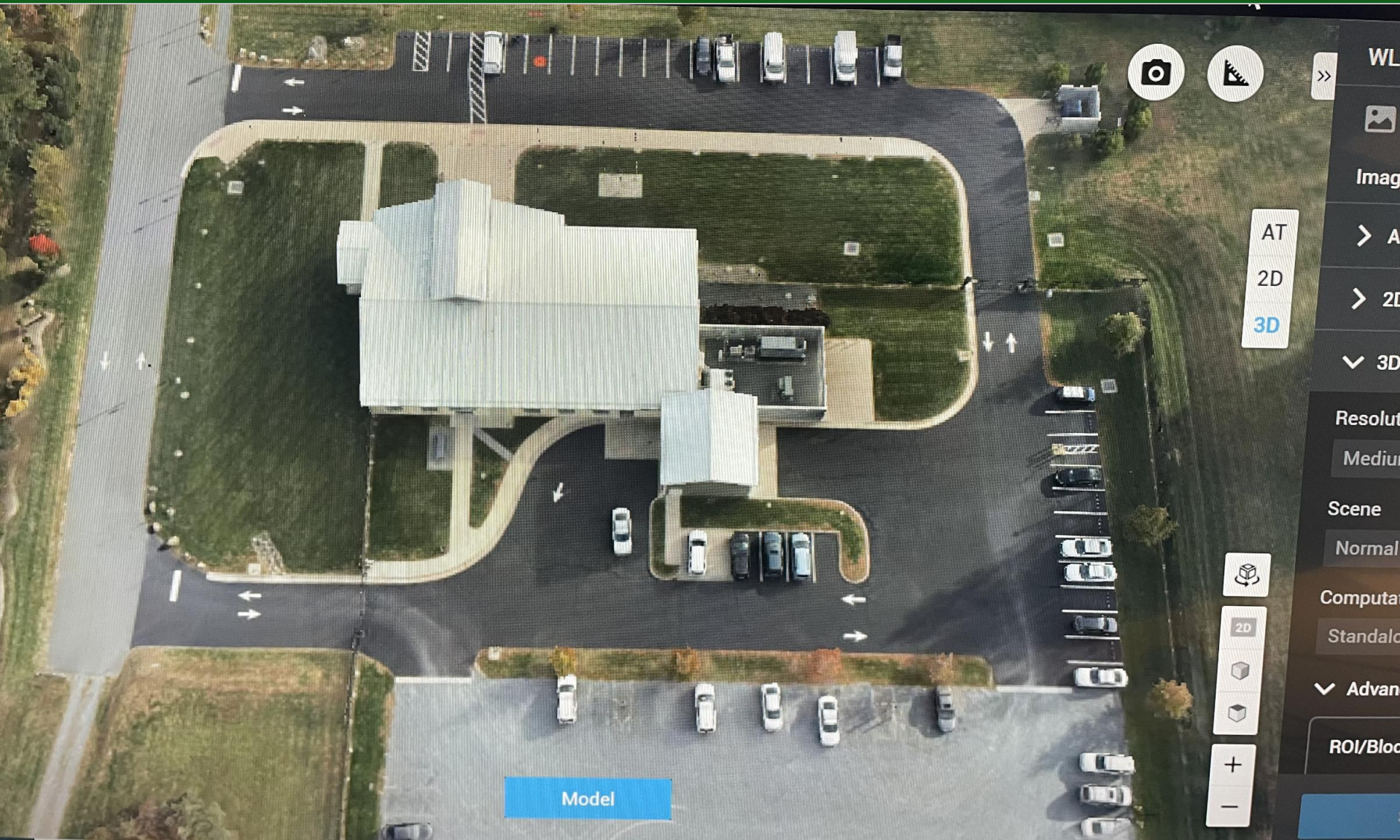

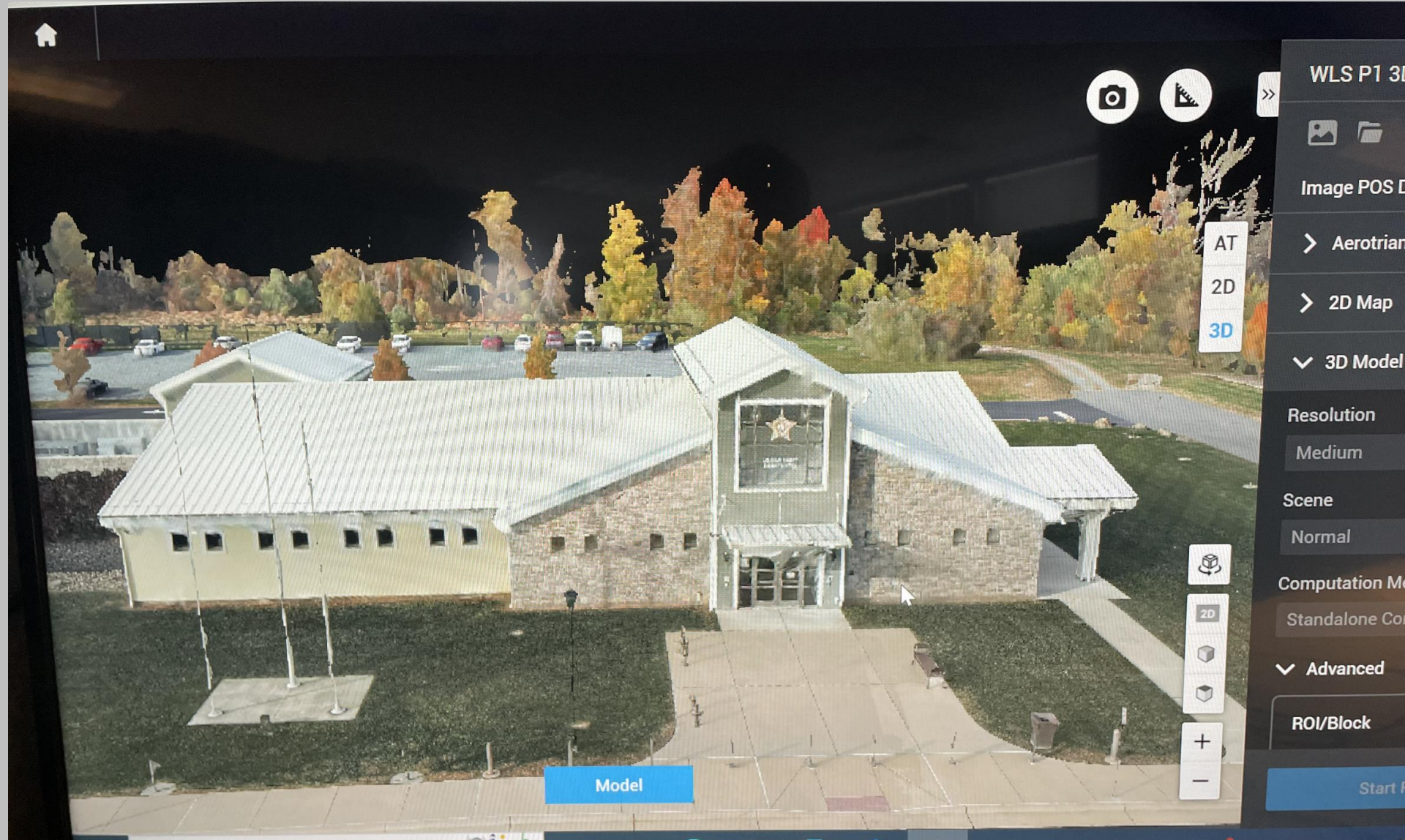

SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

LARCENY FROM VEHICLES

- During the overnight hours of August 27 and 30, a subject dressed in dark clothing was observed stealing items from numerous unlocked vehicles within the Shenstone / Beacon Hill communities.
- During the overnight hours on September 28, a subject dressed in black clothing was observed stealing items from unlocked vehicles in the Hamilton area.

SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS



- The Loudoun County Sheriff's Office is seeking additional witnesses to a hit and run single-vehicle crash that occurred on Friday, March 25, 2022, around 6:30 p.m. on Route 9 near the West Virginia line.
- The vehicle, a 2012 gray Dodge Ram 2500, was found crashed on the side of the roadway. The driver was seen leaving the area and did not report the crash to law enforcement.
- The driver has been identified as Sean R. Sohn, who was charged with two counts of Reckless Handling of a Firearm. 18.2-56.1.

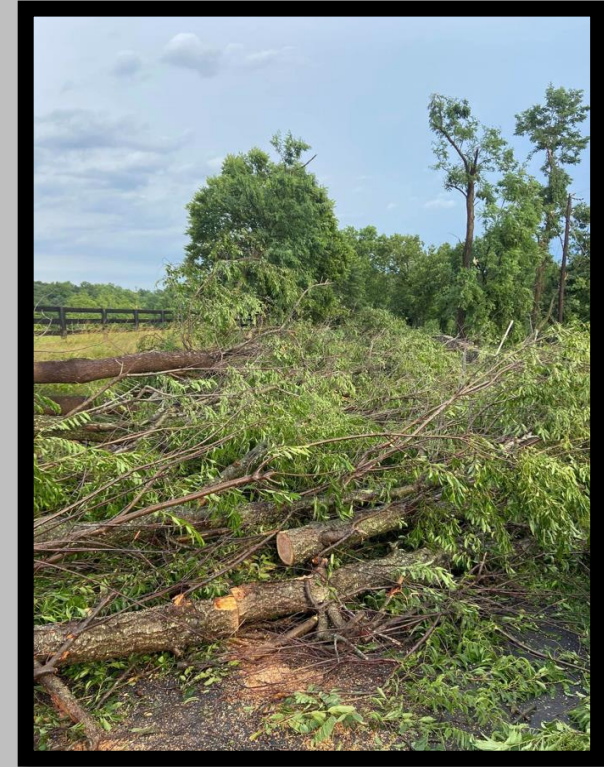
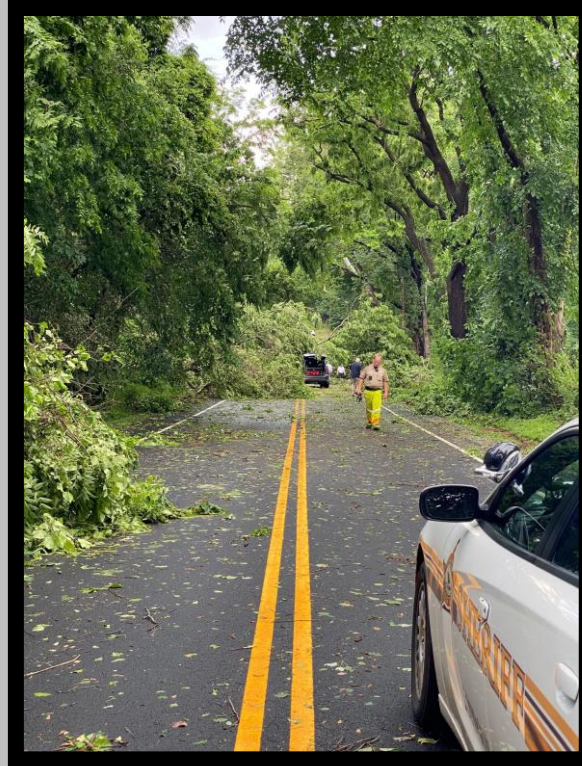
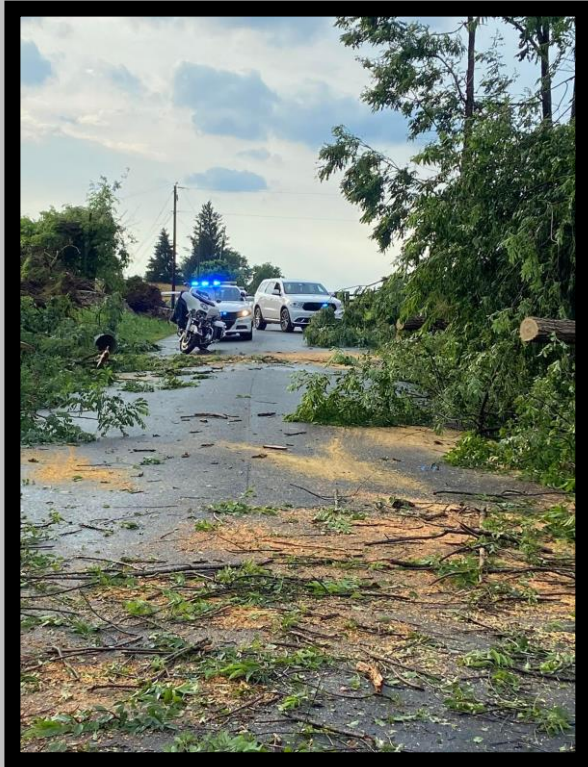
(August 20, 2022) – A North Carolina man was charged with attempting to carjack several vehicles after crashing a stolen vehicle out of Fairfax.

- On **August 20, 2022**, at approximately 3:57 p.m., deputies responded to the area of Harry Byrd Highway (Rt. 7) and Yellow Schoolhouse Road in Round Hill, for a report of a reckless driver who had spun-out and crashed into the median.
- Witnesses reported that the suspect, after crashing the vehicle (which had been reported stolen out of Fairfax), approached three drivers and attempted to carjack their vehicles.
- One of the drivers was assaulted by Guilford and received a minor injury.
- After attempting to enter additional nearby vehicles, Guilford fled the area on foot into a wooded area.
- Deputies and a sheriff's office K-9 team located Guilford and took him into custody.
- The suspect, identified as **Collin R. Guilford, 20, of Greenville, North Carolina**, was charged with three counts of carjacking, one count of resisting arrest, one count of grand larceny (auto), one count of assault, and one count of driving while intoxicated.





SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS



On June 22, due to storm damage throughout the west end of the county, multiple deputies were occupied for several hours in efforts to clear the roadway of debris, assisted by LCFR, VDOT, and several citizens.
