

Mobile Hope handles sad issues every day, we have helped kids wipe away tears when they are broken, we have hugged them when they feel they are alone, and we have walked with them when they feel the world as they know it is against them.

What we don't do well with is when, after visiting one of our kids in the hospital over the weekend, we were notified that they were pronounced dead.

We are sharing this with you, just like we share all the wonderful celebrations and successes, because youth homelessness is not easy, but it is real.

We ask that you hug your kids tight, you overlook their mistakes, and you work to guide them. We ask that you let them follow their dreams, and cherish all of their idiosyncrasies and quirks, because that is what makes them unique. We ask that you keep them close to you even when you disagree or when their lifestyle is not what you had hoped for them. We ask that you smile at a stranger, hold the door open for someone who is struggling and recognize how lucky we all are to have the lives we have been given.

We unfortunately have had to attend funerals for these young people when life got too hard, when their burdens were just too heavy to carry. Life on the streets is hard, being homeless makes it even harder, but these kids deserve a caring smile, a warm hug, a high five and a congratulations, even from a stranger.

These kids come from such broken backgrounds, live in survivor mode every moment of every day and do the best they know how to do.

While this kid was tough on the outside, he so desperately wanted to find his way, so desperately wanted to enjoy a happy life and so desperately wanted to be loved

Give Choose 2023

Today is Give Choose 2023, a 24-hour day of giving organized annually by the Community Foundation for Loudoun and Northern Fauquier Counties to benefit local charities serving our community. VPHA is a proud participant in Give Choose, and we are grateful for your support with our mission of Preservation through Education.

This year we are working alongside the Loudoun Heritage Farm Museum to develop an educational resource to teach students of all ages about the Native American heritage of our region.

The Jenkins Collection of American Indian Artifacts comprises approximately 300 objects including projectile points, stone tools, pottery shards, and small decorative items. The collection represents human habitation of the local Potomac watershed from approximately 3000 BCE – 1700 CE. By about 900 CE local communities were growing corn, beans, and squash, all of which originated in southern climates and were traded, shared, and spread northwards by American Indians living all over the continent. Therefore, this collection is evidence of mankind's first development of agriculture in the county.

VPHA and the Loudoun Heritage Farm Museum want to make sure that every Loudoun student and resident has an opportunity to learn about indigenous peoples in Loudoun and how they interacted with the landscape.

- Photograph and digitize the collection, creating equitable access for all users
- Expand Loudoun Heritage Farm Musuem's permanent American Indian exhibition, Loudoun's First Farmers: Indigenous Food Ways and Land Use Along the Potomac, with interpretation about the changing nature of food ways and land use over time during indigenous occupation
- Create a traveling exhibition to be displayed throughout Loudoun County and surrounding areas
- Create two classroom trunks including hand-knapped and 3D printed examples of original collections items
