

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Neighbors,

The Board of Supervisors' March agendas focused extensively on the FY24 Operating Budget and Capital Improvement Program. As we approach the next Business Meeting where the budget is expected to be adopted, I am grateful for the incredible work of our county staff to craft a budget that addresses many of the Board's priorities, including environmental initiatives, housing, parks and recreation projects, and equity work.

I have worked hard to rectify the funding shortfall for LCPS and get facilities projects at Dominion and Potomac Falls high schools funded. I was able to get these projects sent to the end of year fund balance discussion so the money can be allocated to get these projects back on track.

Unfortunately, we fell short about \$3.2 million in local LCPS funding and the state is withholding \$13 million from our jurisdiction. This will have real impacts on the quality of education in our county. Our schools are the finest in the state and the nation, and I will continue to fight for every student to receive a world-class education. But we can't do it if the state continues to shortchange our children. Especially when it has a \$3 billion surplus.

In February, I joined with Chair Phyllis Randall on a trip to Uruguay where we officially signed a sister city agreement with the Canelones region. This region offers many synergies and opportunities for partnerships in tourism and business. I look forward to announcements soon from our department of economic development about joint efforts with our new sister region!

March commemorates Women's History Month. I am proud of the work we have done to break down barriers for women in all aspects of public life. When I first came to office, I made the motion for our board to support the Equal Rights Amendment in our legislative agenda, telling the General Assembly our county supports women's rights. Virginia was the 38th and most critical state to ratify the amendment. Recently, I made sure our county is supporting the full spectrum of reproductive rights and opposing any rollback of the constitutional right to privacy as codified in Roe V. Wade. Lastly, I secured \$2.25 million in American Rescue Plan dollars for childcare initiatives in the county, to include a countywide needs assessment, training for current providers and programs to lower costs for quality care. We know that our nation lost 80,000 childcare workers during the pandemic and that two thirds of those who lost their jobs during that time were women, mostly because of lack of childcare. Our county loses roughly \$1.3 million in annual revenue because we are 2,700 seats short for children six and under. It is my hope that these initiatives will build a foundation to making sure all parents can get in and stay in the work force.

Remember that the housing expo is this weekend at Dominion High School! I will be joining to kick off the event that will highlight free resources for first-time buyers and renters looking for housing in Northern Virginia. Find more information here.



## **FY24 Budget Development**



The Board of Supervisors spent the month of March working hard to develop and finalize the FY 2024 Loudoun County Budget. County Administrator Tim Hemstreet presented his proposed budget on February 15 to the Board of Supervisors. The BOS hosted three public hearings and took in a multitude of input from community members and county stakeholders.

The proposed budget included 33 increase options that covered high priority department resource requests. The Board of Supervisors hosted four work sessions to review resource requests and take straw polls on whether to add specific items to the budget. Here are some of the highlights of resource requests I supported.

- Voter Services Manager for Elections and Voter Registration.
- Elder Resources Case Manager for Parks, Recreation, and Community Services.
- Housing Program Specialist for Housing and Community Development
- Environmental Work Plan and Energy Strategy for General Services.

The final budget will be up for a vote at the April 4th Board of Supervisors Business Meeting where the board will hear public comment one more time. Cascades Marketplace Town Hall Recap

Last month, my office hosted a packed Town Hall on the Cascades Marketplace rezoning applications that is making its way through the legislative process. In case you missed it, you can find the presentation that was shared <a href="here">here</a>. The event consisted of a detailed presentation and open Q&A from audience members. Willard Retail committed to participating in another Town Hall on the application, likely in the summer or early fall. Our office will release more information in the future.



If you have opinions, suggestions, or feedback regarding the proposed application, there are two ways you can express them:

- 1. Visit Loudoun County's <u>Loudoun Online Land Application (LOLA)</u> system to write comments. These comments are reviewed by staff, the Planning Commission, and Board of Supervisors during the legislative process. To reach the project, visit LOLA, then search by application number ZMAP-2022-0015. Once on the project page, select "Click here to leave a comment".
- 2. Visit <u>cascades-marketplace.com</u> to review Willard Retail's plans for the revitalization project and respond to their feedback form. The developers are using this website to take feedback from the community.

## School Zone Signals Installed on Lowes Island Boulevard



New school zone signals have been installed on Lowes Island Boulevard south of Saulty Drive to replace signals that were removed last month. Several constituents contacted my office to share that drivers entering Lowes Island Boulevard south from Saulty Drive had no way to identify whether they were in a school zone. We contacted our colleagues at Loudoun County Public Schools, as well as VDOT, the Department of Transportation and Capital Infrastructure, and the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office, to address the issue. LCPS informed me that a miscommunication with the installer resulted in the signals being removed from their original locations, which was never intended as part of the decision to expand the school zone.

Thank you to the many constituents who brought this issue to our attention. With your help, we were able to make sure that another set of school zone signals were installed earlier this month!

I joined Northern Virginia Community College Loudoun Campus to cut the ribbon for the renovated Reynolds Building! 


### Sister Cities Trip to Uruguay


## Temporary Precinct Change for June Primary




LCPS provided notice to the Office of Elections and Voter Registration that extensive summer construction/renovation projects at Algonkian Elementary School and Potomac Falls High School will make their facilities unavailable for usage as a voting precinct for the June 20, 2023 primary election. Staff recommended to the Board of Supervisors a temporary precinct change for the June primary, which the Board adopted at the March 15th Public Hearing.

Voters in the Potomac Falls and Algonkian precinct will be voting at River Bend Middle School for the June 20, 2023, primary. The River Bend Middle School precinct location is roughly equidistant between the two existing precincts. Voters affected by this change will be notified by mail and advertisement in local newspapers. This change is only for the June primary. Future elections will revert to the permanent polling places at Algonkian Elementary School and Potomac Falls High School.



University Center Lakeview

**Dogwood Farm Station** 

The University Center Lakeview application has been forwarded to the BOS with a recommendation of approval from the Planning Commission. The application proposes to rezone the property to R-24 for the development of up to 617 multifamily units (both multifamily stacked and multifamily attached) with 10% of the unit count as affordable. The application was forwarded to the April 18 Board of Supervisors Business Meeting for a vote.

## STATUS: RECOMMENDATION/DECISION

Lennar Multifamily Communities has filed plans for a multifamily development to build 485 homes on the 19.33-acre site currently home to Blue Mount Nursery.

The application was heard at a Planning Commission Public Hearing on Wednesday, March 28th and was forwarded to a Planning Commission Work Session for further deliberation.



### **Cascades Marketplace**

**STATUS: ACTIVE** 

The team at Willard Realty are busy meeting with (and signing) prospective tenants. Make sure to visit their website for updates and to provide feedback, here.



#### **Bles Park**

#### **STATUS: APPROVED**

The application was to establish a Bles Park Master Plan to expand the existing park and its amenities, including trails, pickleball courts, an off-leash dog park, four soccer fields, and a kayak launch.



#### The Villas at Cascades

**STATUS: APPROVED** 

This application is to allow the development of 178 multi-family stacked residential units. The developers are currently in the site plan processing stage of the project. They expect to break ground towards the end of this year with the first units delivering approximately a year later (or late 2024). A \$160,000 school contribution has also been made with the expectation those funds will be used for the playground area at Meadowland Elementary.
