

It is also responsible for routine traffic enforcement and preservation of crime scene evidence.


The patrol shifts are responsible for answering calls for service and general enforcement within the entire county.




Calls For Service Statistics/Traffic Enforcement







INFORMATION WANTED

BURGLARY AT SHOOTING RANGE -FIREARMS TAKEN

INCIDENT DATE / TIME: January 24, 2023, between 3:45 - 4:50 am

INCIDENT LOCATION: Silver Eagle Group -21000 block Beaumeade Circle, Ashburn

On January 24, 2023, between 3:45 – 4:50 am, two subjects broke a glass window and entered the Silver Eagle Group, located in the 21000 block of Beaumeade Circle in Ashburn, and stole 10 firearms. Both subjects wore zip-up jackets or sweatshirts with hoods, face masks, and gloves and were seen leaving in a dark colored sedan.

DUI & Reckless Driving

- A vehicle crashed into one of the patrol vehicles with the deputy inside, causing significant damage
- The deputy's emergency equipment on his patrol vehicle was active at the time of the crash
- The driver of the striking vehicle was found to be under the influence and arrested

Grand Larceny - Recovered Property

On January 13th the victim contacted a local junk hauling/moving company to disassemble and move a bed frame. The company arrived and completed the work. Several days later the victim noticed her diamond engagement ring was missing from her jewelry box.

Det. Franks was assigned the case and immediately searched the pawn database for a ring matching the description (valued at over \$15,000).

The ring was located at a local pawn shop and was recovered. Subsequently, a suspect was developed from the pawn record and was charged with grand larceny and larceny with the intent to sell.

The ring was returned to the victim and the suspect is currently in jail on several other charges from surrounding jurisdictions.

IRS SCAM

As if tax time wasn't stressful enough, you also have to worry about scammers claiming to be from the IRS.

Things the IRS WILL NOT do...

(from our friends at the IRS)

- Initiate contact with taxpayers by email, text messages or social media channels to request personal or financial information.
- CALL to demand immediate payment using a specific payment method such as a prepaid debit card, gift card or wire transfer.
 Generally, the IRS will first mail a bill to any taxpayer who owes taxes.
- Demand that you pay taxes without the opportunity to question or appeal the amount they say you owe. You should also be advised of your rights as a taxpayer.
- Threaten to bring in local police, immigration officers or other lawenforcement to have you arrested for not paying. The IRS also
 cannot revoke your driver's license, business licenses, or
 immigration status. Threats like these are common tactics scam
 artists use to trick victims into buying into their schemes.



GOVERNMENT / LAW ENFORCEMENT SCAM

if you receive a call from someone reporting to be from a government or law enforcement agency and are asked to provide personal information such as bank account, social security, account login information, etc. OR to purchase gift cards to avoid legal action or to satisfy a warrant -

NEVER provide banking or personal account information. Agencies will not ask you to purchase gift cards, wire money, or transfer money through a cash app (such as Venmo, Bitcoin, PayPal, or Zelle.

These types of scams pull at your heartstring and make you want to help.

The scammer hopes that people will send them money or gift cards.

A couple of ways to determine if the person is a scammer.

- The person has never posted in the group before.
- The person has a very limited social media profile or appears to have a new
 account.

What can you do?

- Instead of sending money, refer the person to local organizations that can provide assistance. Loudoun County has many great organizations.
- Contact the admin of the social media page and make them aware.

Spoil Your Grandkids, Not Scammers!

Beware of scammers posing as a relative – usually a child or grandchild. Often they claim to be in trouble – usually in jail, stranded in a foreign country, or injured at a hospital. The scammer may ask you to send cash by mail, buy gift cards, or even offer to send a person to your residence to pick up cash. They will instruct you to keep it a secret and that you have to act fast.

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

- Don't send money. Hang up and call family members to confirm the story.
- Never trust anyone who says you can't report it to law enforcement.
- Call the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office for advice 703-777-1021.
- Don't purchase gift cards to pay for bills, bail, attorney fees, taxes, etc. IT IS A SCAM.













Catalytic Converter Thefts

Thieves target catalytic converters because many contain precious metals, which are then sold to a scrap yard for cash.

What Can You Do?

- When possible, park in well-lit areas and close to building entrances.
- Calibrate your car's alarm to set off when it detects vibration.
- Install an overt video surveillance system and place the camera facing your vehicle.
- If you have a garage at your house, park your car inside and keep the garage door shut.
- Have the catalytic converter welded to your car's frame or attach a security device.
- Engrave your vehicle identification number (VIN) on the catalytic converter.

Report suspicious activity to your local law enforcement agency.

Shopping Safety: PURSE & WALLET THEFT

It can happen very quickly, you look or walk away from your shopping cart for a couple of seconds, and when you turn back around, your purse or items from within your purse are gone.

SAFETY TIPS

- Carry only what you need if you do not need it to shop, leave it home including your purse, credit cards, store cards, money, etc.
- Zip your purse so thieves can't reach in and grab your wallet.
- Secure your purse to the shopping cart by using the child safety belt or a carabiner clip.
- If you walk away from your cart, take your purse with you.



Altered Mufflers



Following the most recent session of the Virginia General Assembly, a bill was passed to amend and reenact the Virginia Code that returns the enforcement of Improper Exhausts by a law enforcement officer as a primary offense. The new law took effect on July 1, 2022, and replaces the March 2021 law restricting law enforcement's ability to conduct traffic stops for this

equipment violation (making it a secondary offense).

Virginia law § 46.2-1049 continues to require exhaust systems to be in good working order "and in constant operation to prevent excessive or unusual levels of noise." Violations are punishable by a fine of no more than that provided for a Class 4 misdemeanor.



What is the difference between a primary and secondary offense? A primary offense is a traffic violation, that on its own, law enforcement establishes reasonable suspicion to make a traffic stop. A secondary offense is a violation that law enforcement can observe, but not pull over unless the officer observes a primary offense.








CityProtect



The LCSO uses CityProtect as an online mapping and analysis service that combines the value of law enforcement data with the ease of use of Google-based mapping and an analytics module so that members of the public can view police data in a high-impact map or summary descriptive format.



Many residents have asked about the option to register their security camera at CityProtect.com. Registration is 100% voluntary and does not provide the law enforcement with direct access to your security system/camera. Your personal information will be kept confidential by the LCSO and registration information will only be accessed by law enforcement if there is a criminal incident that was possibly captured by your security camera. LCSO detectives or deputies may request a copy of any video captured by your camera, if it may assist in the investigation of a crime.








