This past week I held two Town Hall meetings at Ashburn Village and Ashby Ponds. I had great discussions at both communities on county initiatives, transportation and land use projects occurring in the district, and other topics affecting their communities. I was also pleased to welcome [AnnaSudha Community Kitchens](#) to the Dulles Town Center on Friday. Anna Sudha Community Kitchens provides hot and freshly made meals to those in need in Loudoun County. This week I also attended a Loudoun Chamber of Commerce event on affordable housing in Loudoun County. Positive discussions were had at this event on how the public and private sectors are working together to make housing more accessible for all not only in Loudoun, but regionally as well.

Lastly, the Broad Run District's recipients of the 2022 Loudoun Cares' Outstanding Volunteer award are the volunteers of the Ashburn Senior Center. Last weekend, I was thrilled to join the senior center in recognizing all of their volunteers for their hard work. During 2022, in addition to their skills, knowledge, and experience, these volunteers put in more than sixteen thousand hours to support the center's services and programs. I have updates to several land use items in Broad Run. The [Broadlands 104](#) and [Commonwealth Center](#) applications that both appeared at the Planning Commission's June Public Hearing were both forwarded to a Planning Commission Work Session in the fall. At the Work Sessions, more review and negotiations with the applicants will take place. The [DTC Substation](#) application will appear at the Board of Supervisors July 12th Public Hearing for final action. The Tillet's View residential rezoning for 400 housing units,

on the old Tillett's Auction Barn site at Waxpool and Belmont Ridge Roads, will appear at the Planning Commission's July 25th Public Hearing for its first round of public comments.

I want to address something that I regularly hear from constituents when discussing land use applications and other matters that are before the Board of Supervisors. Consistently constituents say to me "I didn't come to the meeting because I thought the rezoning was a done deal." No application is ever a "done deal" until the final vote of approval or denial is taken by the Board of Supervisors. Just because a rezoning application is filed with the county does not mean it will be approved. I want to encourage anyone who has thoughts on a matter before the Board of Supervisors to share them with me directly or with the whole Board. I very much appreciate when residents voice their views and it is always beneficial during the application review process.

Finally, I want to draw everyone's attention to the Dominion Energy powerlines project that will run powerlines down Route 7 and is currently out for public feedback. Dominion Energy, in an effort to accommodate the growing energy needs of data centers, is proposing an extensive infrastructure project in Ashburn. Dominion is looking to run large, galvanized steel powerlines down Route 7 to connect a substation at the Goose Creek to a substation at Pacific Boulevard. A path along the Dulles Greenway and a path along the W&OD Trail were considered but rejected as a number of homes would be impacted or condemned. The Route 7 path will either run along the north side of Route 7 or the south side. This project is not under the jurisdiction of the Board of Supervisors and is entirely up to the state as Dominion is a Virginia state utility. 

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Planning Commission Completes Draft Zoning Ordinance Review

The Loudoun County Planning Commission reached a pivotal milestone in the county's multi-year Zoning Ordinance Rewrite project during its June 8, 2023, work session: a vote to forward the Planning Commission's Draft Zoning Ordinance to the Board of Supervisors with a recommendation for approval. The vote is the result of more than 20 work sessions held by the commission since August 2022 and consideration of thousands of comments from members of the public. The Planning Commission worked to improve the county's ordinance by drafting a more simple, modern ordinance that is intended to be easier to use by the public and includes new district regulations that reflect land use policies in the county's Comprehensive Plan.

Last week, the Planning Commission considered more than 70 motions for final revisions to the draft text. The recommended draft will incorporate the commission's final edits and be prepared for review by the Board of Supervisors in the coming weeks.

The Planning Commission also recommended that the Board consider future Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Ordinance amendments after the adoption of a new Zoning Ordinance. These items require additional deliberations by both the Planning Commission and the Board of Supervisors to ensure Comprehensive Plan (General Plan) policy guidance is considered prior to the consideration of future text amendments. This will also allow time for thorough public processes that will further improve the county's land use policies and regulations.

Next Steps

Following the completion of more than three years of work that began with the Board of Supervisors' Zoning Ordinance Committee, and later with the Planning Commission, the next step in the Zoning Ordinance Rewrite project is for the Board to review the recommendation of the Planning Commission. The Board is

likely to hold a public hearing on the Planning Commission's recommended ordinance later this summer and consider potential revisions to ordinance text during a series of work sessions before ultimately adopting a new Zoning Ordinance that will replace the county's existing ordinance.

The Planning Commission's Draft Zoning Ordinance will be published on the county's website in advance of a Board of Supervisors public hearing. The date of the public hearing will be announced once it is scheduled.

About the Zoning Ordinance

The Zoning Ordinance is the primary regulatory tool to implement the county's long range land use planning policies. The [Loudoun County 2019 Comprehensive Plan](#) is an aspirational document that guides the county's planning efforts, and the Zoning Ordinance is comprised of the standards and regulations that implement the plan. The Planning Commission's extensive review helped form the regulatory zoning code language that governs what land uses are permitted in specific zoning districts. Together the plan and ordinance shape the long-term use of land throughout the county and include consideration of economic sustainability, sensitive environmental features, natural and historic resources, community amenities, quality of life and the development of attainable housing options.

The Planning Commission's Draft Zoning Ordinance regulates the development of all proposed residential, commercial, industrial and civic buildings and structures, as well as transportation and pedestrian improvements. The Planning Commission's Draft Zoning Ordinance is designed to foster a high quality of life and successful economy while continuing to protect Loudoun's historic resources, sensitive environmental features and community amenities.

More Information

The Planning Commission's Draft Zoning Ordinance is based on the June 2, 2023, version of the draft text, and includes final revisions approved by the commission during its June 5 and June 8 work sessions. The final version of the ordinance that will be forwarded to the Board of Supervisors will be published online in the coming weeks.

LCFR Grilling Safety Tips

Outdoor grilling can be an enjoyable part of summer when grilling equipment is used properly. Loudoun County Fire and Rescue and

the National Fire Protection Association would like to share seven tips regarding the usage of outdoor grills:

- For propane grills, check the gas tank for leaks by applying a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If it's leaking, turn off the gas tank and the grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it. If the leak does not stop, call 911.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- Place the grill at least 15ft from the home, away from siding, deck railings and anything flammable, and a safe distance from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.
- Keep children and pets at least 3ft away from the grilling area and never leave a grill unattended.
- If you use starter fluid when charcoal grilling, only use charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- When you a finished grilling, let the coals cool completely before disposing in a metal container.

LCFR Fire Marshal's Office Highlights 'Sprinkler Saves' in Loudoun

Two fires in Loudoun County residences were contained by automatic fire sprinklers, limiting damage and injuries, and keeping people in their homes. According to the National Fire Protection Association's [U.S. Experience with Sprinklers report \(PDF\)](#), the home fire death rate was 90 percent lower when fire sprinklers and hardwired smoke alarms were present during fires, and the average firefighter injury rate was nearly 80 percent lower when fire sprinklers were present during fires. New 500-230kV Powerlines Project Down Route 7

Dominion Energy is committed to providing all our customers safe, reliable, affordable, and increasingly clean electricity. As such, we are moving forward with several electric transmission infrastructure projects designed to address the growing energy needs of Loudoun County and the region. We would like to bring your attention to two projects currently being developed. Our first project – named the Aspen to Golden 500/230 kV Project – includes two new substations, Aspen and Golden, and newly proposed high voltage transmission lines between them. This project extends our highest voltage lines into northeast Loudoun County to maintain reliability for the area. Additionally, due to new development and associated increased energy needs, new electric infrastructure – including four new substations and connecting transmission lines – is being studied west of Belmont Ridge Road, south and east of the Luck Stone quarry. This project is

named Twin Creeks to Apollo 230 kV Electric Transmission Line. These route options are not final but simply the next step in continuing the conversation with you and your neighbors. Ultimately, one route will be built (per project) based on the Virginia State Corporate Commission's (SCC) review and approval. Loudoun Fire Officials Offer Critical Fireworks Safety Tips and 2023 Fireworks Event Schedule

The Loudoun County Combined Fire and Rescue System (LC-CFRS) wants to ensure a memorable and SAFE Fourth of July holiday for you and your family. Fireworks cause thousands of serious injuries every year, sending adults and children to the emergency room. LC-CFRS encourages residents to leave fireworks to the experts and attend professionally coordinated fireworks shows instead of using fireworks on your own. If you choose to use fireworks, know the risks, PROCEED WITH CAUTION, and follow these tips!

- DON'T use illegal fireworks! DO use only legal fireworks purchased from a retail stand with a Loudoun County Fire Marshal's Office permit.
- DON'T use fireworks while impaired by drugs or alcohol!
- DON'T light fireworks indoors! DO use fireworks a safe distance away from homes, and steer clear of brush, leaves, and flammable substances. Keep a bucket of water or a garden hose nearby.
- NEVER allow young children to play with or ignite fireworks. DO maintain constant adult supervision.
- DON'T light fireworks in your hand! DO place fireworks on stable ground, never in a container, and ensure the device will not tip over when firing.
- NEVER point or throw fireworks at anyone!
- DON'T try to re-light "a dud" or malfunctioning firework! DO soak spent fireworks in water for several hours before discarding into a fire-proof container. Keep the container outside, away from the home.

VDOT 2023 Repaving and Resealing

VDOT has released their map of [roads that will be resurfaced in 2023](#). The exact dates for the road work are unknown at this time, as it is dependent on weather and contractor schedules. Resurfacing projects can last from a few days to a few weeks, depending on the size of the project.



Ashbrook Place
ZMAP-2018-0004
No Change

This project, at the eastern corner of Ashbrook Place and Russell Branch Parkway, was approved by the Board of Supervisors in December 2019. The approval was for a **rezoning** from industrial park to residential to allow for the construction of 190 multifamily units. Sewer installation and road construction have begun. The developer will construct the remaining asphalt path on the northeastern side of Russell Branch Parkway from Savin Hill Drive to Ashbrook Place. Unit construction and sales are currently underway.



Ashbrook Place Lot 4
ZCPA-2021-0006
No Change

This project consists of reducing a building setback along Route 7 from 300 feet to 200 feet in order to construct an already allowed flex-industrial office building. The proposed building would be built over an existing parking lot between Route 7 and 20098 Ashbrook Place, Ashburn. This application was approved by the Board of Supervisors at its September 14th Public Hearing after receiving a unanimous Planning Commission recommendation of approval and having no outstanding land use issues from Loudoun County planning and zoning staff.



**Ashburn Crossing
No Change**

This project, on land bound by Loudoun County Parkway to the east, Gloucester Parkway to the south, and Ashby Ponds to the west, is being constructed by-right (without Board of Supervisors approval). The project consists of building three flex-industrial buildings and a gas station on the vacant land at the site. The flex-industrial buildings will be identical to the existing buildings directly to the north. Two of the three buildings are currently in the framing process with foundation pouring underway for the third building along Gloucester.



**Ashburn Station / The
Regency
ZMAP-2018-0010
No Change**

This project, at the southwest corner of Ashburn Village Boulevard and Waxpool Road, was approved by the Board of Supervisors in December 2019 as a rezoning from 1 residential unit per acre to 24 residential units per acre. Up to 254 residential units will be built. The developer is installing a series of sidewalks and trails to connect the area to the Metro station, and dedicating around 70 acres of parkland to the County. Sidewalk installation, road construction, and building framing is currently underway.



**Belmont Chase, Regency at
SPEX-2022-0012**

No Change


This project is located on land in between Claiborne Parkway, Belmont Chapel Drive, and Bodmer Drive. The developer has withdrawn the special exception applications to build a gas station and a drive-thru restaurant on the undeveloped commercial section of the community. This application appeared at the Planning Commission's March Public Hearing and received a unanimous recommendation of denial. Due to the withdrawal, the application with the previous zoning approvals on the property remain in place.



**Broadlands Demott & Silver
ZMAP-2016-0010
ZMOD-2021-0018**

No Change

This project, on land between Demott Drive, the Dulles Greenway, Waxpool Road, and Old Ryan Road, was approved by the Board of Supervisors in December 2019. The application allows Van Metre to construct townhomes and multifamily units, office space, retail space, a hotel site, and educational spaces. Unit construction is currently underway, with home occupancy occurring soon. Sidewalks, signals, and other road improvements will be installed in the nearby area.



**Broadlands Hillside
ZMAP-2019-0005**

No Change


This project, on land in between Belmont Ridge Road and Truro Parish Drive, south of the two water towers, was approved by the Board of Supervisors in November 2019. The project is budgeted for \$6.2 million, and completion has been accelerated by a year due to adjustments in the County's Capital Improvement Program.



Route 7 Corridor Study


No Change

The [draft study](#) examined existing and projected conditions along Route 7, between Dranesville Road at the Fairfax County line to the Route 28 interchange. The study included an evaluation of the history of recent crashes, an analysis of existing traffic operations along the corridor, and travel demand forecasts. The Board of Supervisors confirmed alternative 4 as the preferred configuration in October 2021.



**Route 28 / Dulles Toll Road
Interchange Study**
No Change

Completed in spring 2021, a study was performed to assess traffic movements and safety measures at the interchange between Route 28, the Dulles Toll Road, and the Dulles Greenway (also encompassing the interchanges between Route 28 and Innovation Avenue and Old Ox Road). The study identified a preferred "mega project" that will address much of the congestion and safety concerns along this corridor. View the unfunded study findings [here](#).




**Shellhorn Road and Sterling
Boulevard Extensions**
No Change

This project constructs an extension of Shellhorn road from the existing terminus at Loudoun County Parkway through to the existing Sterling Boulevard interchange at Route 28. Portions of the Shellhorn Road extension will follow the existing alignments of Lockridge and Moran Roads. The project is currently in the design stage and will be constructed in segments. **Waxpool Road Intersection
Improvements I
No Change**

This project funds intersection improvements and turn lanes at Waxpool Road and Pacific Boulevard, intersection improvements and turn lanes at Waxpool Road and Broderick Drive, and intersection improvements and turn lanes at Waxpool Road and Loudoun County Parkway. Right-of-way authorization, land acquisition, and utility relocation are ongoing in coordination with VDOT. Construction is expected to begin in 2023. **Waxpool Road Intersection
Improvements II
No Change**

[A study](#) was completed on the safety of Waxpool Road from Demott Drive to Faulkner Parkway. The Board has allocated \$300,000 to install a four-way stop at the intersection of Ashburn Road and Waxpool Road as a temporary solution before a traffic signal is installed by 2025. A roundabout will be installed by the end of 2023 at the Faulkner Parkway intersection. All missing links are being filled in the entirety of the corridor.
