The table above is the schedule for the Board's Zoning Ordinance work sessions with the last public hearing tentatively scheduled December 13th. The Zoning Ordinance is the regulation that implements the Loudoun County 2019 General Plan.

To assist the public with comparing the current Zoning Ordinance (Revised 1993 Zoning Ordinance) with the Planning Commission Draft Zoning Ordinance, staff sought consultant services to develop a wayfinding tool. The tool is intended to allow users who are already familiar with the current Zoning Ordinance to locate a regulation in the Planning Commission Draft Zoning Ordinance. This tool may be helpful given the reorganization of the Planning Commission Draft Zoning Ordinance chapters. The wayfinding tool is in its final development stage and will be published on the [County's website](#) as soon as possible.

You can see the major changes staff identified between the current Zoning Ordinance and the Planning Commission Draft Zoning Ordinance in the [staff report](#) from the July 26th public hearing.

Loudoun County Commissioner of the Revenue Robert S. Wertz Jr. reminds residents that first-time applications for the County's Personal Property Tax Relief for the Elderly & Disabled program are due Friday, September 1st. Vehicle owners who are 65 and older or permanently and totally disabled and who meet income and net worth requirements are eligible for a reduced tax rate on one vehicle per qualified applicant.

Greenway Toll Increase Request



The Virginia State Corporation Commission (SCC) has opened its public comment opportunity and scheduled hearings on an application from the owners of the Dulles Greenway requesting to increase the maximum tolls for most drivers to \$8.10 during peak hours, up from the current \$5.80, and \$6.40 during off-peak hours, up from \$5.25. This is a toll increase of 40% during peak morning and afternoon hours and 22% for off-peak hours, which the corporation claims is necessary to meet its debt obligation. Data show, however, that use of the Greenway is down because of its already high toll rate.

Loudoun County continues to oppose toll rate increases that have once again been proposed by the operators of the Dulles Greenway. To promote use of the Greenway by more motorists, Loudoun County has consistently supported changing the Greenway's toll structure to distance-based tolling while also lowering toll rates. The Greenway operator has the ability to implement both changes now.

Members of the public may submit written comments through January 24th. Written comments regarding the Greenway's request for increased toll rates can be provided online through the [SCC's website](#) (click on "Submit Comments" next to [case # PUR-2023-00089](#)).

Written comments can also be submitted by U.S. mail to the Clerk of the State Corporation Commission, c/o Document Control Center, P.O. Box 2118, Richmond, Virginia 23218-2118. All comments must refer to case number PUR-2023-00089.

The SCC has also scheduled hearings regarding the Greenway's request for increased toll rates. The public witness session is scheduled to begin at 10:00 a.m., Tuesday, January 30, 2024, at 1300 East Main Street in Richmond. Public witnesses will testify by telephone. The SCC allots each witness five minutes to provide testimony.

Public witnesses who wish to provide oral testimony must pre-register by 5:00 p.m., Wednesday, January 24, 2024, in one of three ways:

1. Complete a public witness form for case number PUR-2023-00089 on the [SCC's website](#).

2. E-mail a [PDF version of the form](#) to SCCInfo@scc.virginia.gov.
3. Call the SCC at 804-371-9141 during normal business hours (8:15 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.) and provide your name and a phone number where you can be reached during the hearing.

A separate public evidentiary hearing will be held at 10:00 a.m., Wednesday, January 31, 2024, to receive testimony and evidence from the company, any respondents and the SCC staff. Although testimony from members of the public will not be accepted, the hearing will be open to the public. Both hearings are scheduled to be [webcast](#).

Loudoun County Health Department Locally Administered

Under an agreement between Loudoun County and the Virginia Department of Health, the [Loudoun County Health Department](#) is now under the administration of the County government, effective July 1, 2023.

Approximately fifty former State employees of the Loudoun County Health Department have transitioned to County employment, joining other County employees who were already employed in the department, with all reporting up to the County Administrator and the Board of Supervisors.

Local control of the Health Department provides the following benefits:

- Aligns resources with community needs and goals and with the Board's vision and strategy.
- Allows the County to better manage responsive programming for Loudoun's residents and businesses.
- Addresses the disparities in salaries and benefits that occurred between state and County employees performing the same or similar work in the Health Department.
- Provides administrative efficiencies and eliminates the need for duplicate systems in the areas of technology and human resources.

New Proclamation Process: The Leesburg Town Council has adopted a new proclamation process, which now allows users to submit requests online. The web-based form will help streamline the process while reducing the amount of time it takes staff to research and prepare proclamations.



Patriot Cup Winner: The Leesburg Town Council presented Loudoun Wildlife Conservancy with a Certificate of Recognition on Tuesday, July 11th after their float won the “Best in Show” Patriot’s Cup trophy during last week’s 33rd annual Independence Day Parade. The float depicted a waterfall, greenery, frogs, monarch butterflies, and an eagle’s nest, which helped spread Loudoun Wildlife’s mission.

Changes to Trash and Recycling Schedule: Due to the high temperatures and heat indices typically experienced in July and August, Patriot Disposal will begin all trash, recycling, and yard waste collections in the Town of Leesburg at 6 a.m., instead of 6:30 a.m., through Friday, September 8th.

Market and King Street Improvements: The final phase of the Market and King Street Improvement Project has begun. Work will involve the relocation of storm structures from the corners of the intersection, replacement of streetlights, underground utility conduits, and replacement of sidewalks, ramps, and pavement. The entire project is expected to be completed by October 2023.

New Youth Services Center: Loudoun County is offering new support services for young people and their families at the new Youth Services Center located at 42055 Gourley Transit Drive in Leesburg. Please attend a free youth and family workshop listed in the flyer above.

The Youth and Family Resource Center is a new service open to Loudoun youth ages 11-17 who may face behavioral challenges, including issues at home, in the community and with peers. The Youth and Family Resource Center connects young people and their families to appropriate Loudoun County programs and services and other local resources. The process includes a brief screening and the development of an action plan so youth and families can get help quickly. The goal of the Youth and Family Resource Center is to prevent or reduce delinquency and court involvement.
