

Planning Commission Completes Draft Zoning Ordinance Review



Zoning Ordinance Rewrite Meetings Continue

The Board of Supervisors held the first two Zoning Ordinance Rewrite Work Sessions on September 7th and 11th. As we work through the draft Zoning Ordinance, the BOS is able to amend specific sections of the Ordinance to establish permitted and unpermitted uses, set clear design standards, and set the overall policy for development in Loudoun County. At Tuesday's Work Session, I successfully passed two motions to limit the growth of data centers in Loudoun County. I appreciate the support from the majority of my colleagues for these changes to our zoning ordinance.

The first motion removed data centers as a Special Exception use in the Town Center (TC) zoning district. The TC district is envisioned to be a mixed-use center with residential and retail uses throughout. Data centers should never be built near residential communities, which is what is envisioned as part of the TC district.

The second motion amended the Planned Development Research and Development Park (PDRDP) zoning district to make data centers a Special Exception use. This will give the BOS managerial control to deny or approve data centers in the PDRDP zoning district, instead of being allowed "by-right". There is a large area of land zoned PDRDP in the western part of the Algonkian District in the GW area. With this change, any proposed data center development would have to go through the legislative process instead of being allowed by-right. I was also proud to vote against several motions that would have weakened the use-specific standards that apply to data centers in the new Zoning Ordinance and rejected motions that would have allowed for data center development closer to residential communities.

The Zoning Ordinance Rewrite process will continue with a Work Session scheduled for 6pm on Tuesday, September 26th. Board of Supervisors Hold Hearing on Dogwood Farm Station Application

On Tuesday, September 13th, the Board of Supervisors held a Public Hearing on the Dogwood Farm Station application, which proposes the construction of 485 dwelling units, a childcare center, and community-accessible pool on the site of the existing Blue Mount Nursery. In advance of last night's hearing, my office underwent an extensive public engagement process, regularly speaking with community members and hosting a public meeting on August 22nd.

After hearing from about a dozen speakers and questions from Board members, I made a motion to send the application to the November 15th Public Hearing for action. The applicant has promised to modify the proposal in response to community feedback, which may include changes in density and added open space. I am continuing to negotiate proffers that would benefit the community if this application were approved. Once the changes to the application are made and presented to the Board of Supervisors in November, my colleagues and I will decide on the application.

Thank you to the residents, primarily in Lexington 7 and Potomac Farms, who came to the BOS to speak last night. I appreciate community feedback from so many of our residents and will continue taking that into consideration as I weigh my decision on this application.
