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Dear Broad Run Friends and Neighbors,

I hope you all are enjoying fall and looking forward to Thanksgiving later this month!

This new season has brought many exciting events to the Broad Run District. This month, my office welcomed several businesses to the District, including, [Ashburn Fit Body Boot Camp](#), a personal

training center; [Cardinal Fencing Academy](#), a fencing club with programs for a wide range of ages and skill levels; [Clarys Advance Nursing](#), an educational institution that provides accessible and affordable education to students for the development of practical nursing at all entries of practice; [K.M. Recently, I also helped with an Eagle Scout Project that involved clearing out vegetation around the foundations of the original Beaverdam Run bridge at Ashburn Road, located directly east of the existing bridge. Next steps of this project will be to remove existing graffiti nearby and install an interpretive sign that draws on the bridge's unique history. It was a pleasure working with this scout to accomplish this important improvement for our community. If scouts in your troop need Eagle Scout or Gold Award project ideas, please email me.

There are several updates to land use projects in the Broad Run. The [Tillett's View application](#) is scheduled to appear at this Wednesday's, November 8th Planning Commission Work Session, where the Commission will work with the developer to solve remaining outstanding issues before forwarding the application to the Board of Supervisors with a recommendation of approval or denial. The [Commonwealth Center application](#) is scheduled to appear at the Board's November 15th Public Hearing for a final vote of approval or denial. Also appearing at that same Hearing are a few other applications. Among these items include the [Ashburn Crossing parking modification application](#) to reduce the parking setback along Gloucester Parkway from 75 feet to 50 feet on the vacant parcel located to the northeast of the Ashby Ponds entrance, the [Broadlands Section 104 application](#) to construct up

to 136 residential units on land northwest of the Van Metre Drive and Broadlands Boulevard intersection, and the [Loudoun Station modification application](#) to reduce the number of trees on the landbay fronting Ashburn Metro Drive.

Finally, the seat to represent the Broad Run District on the Loudoun County Parks, Recreation and Open Space (PROS) Board has opened up. The PROS Board advises Board of Supervisors and county staff on recommending policies and procedures relating to County recreation programs, public park systems, and the use of public open space. If you are interested in applying to this position, please find the link below in the newsletter.



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November 7th, 2023, General Election Information

Loudoun County voters will go to the polls Tuesday, November 7, 2023, for a general election. More information about the November 7, 2023, general election, including links to sample ballots, is available online at [Loudoun.gov/NovemberElection](#).

Know Who and What is on The Ballot

- Offices on the November 7, 2023, general election ballot in Loudoun County include the Virginia House and Senate, Constitution Officers, Board of Supervisors, School Board, and Soil and Water Conservation Director-Loudoun District. There are also three ballot questions involving the issuing of bonds for parks and recreation, public safety, school, and transportation projects. This elections will utilize the newly redrawn [Broad Run District map](#) and state election district maps. Many parts of the previous Broad Run District that were

- in Sterling have moved to the newly redrawn Sterling District.
- The Broad Run District is split between two House of Delegates District. All other offices on the ballot are the same across the Broad Run District.

Know When to Vote

- Polls in Loudoun County will be open from 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Tuesday, November 7, 2023.
- Early voting continues in Loudoun through Saturday, November 4. Locations and hours for early voting are online at [Loudoun.gov/VoteEarly](https://www.loudoun.gov/VoteEarly).
- Completed absentee ballots may be returned by mail (postmarked no later than November 7), dropped off at the 24/7 drop box at the Office of Elections and Voter Registration (750 Miller Dr. SE, Leesburg) or [early voting sites](#). Voters may also drop off their ballots at any polling place up to 7:00 p.m. on November 7.

Know Where to Vote and Bring Identification

- Earlier this year, voters received notices by mail from the Office of Elections and Voter Registration indicating their precinct and polling information. Voters can also check their voter registration card or look up their polling place and related information online at vote.elections.virginia.gov. A list of polling places in Loudoun is available at [Loudoun.gov/Polls](https://www.loudoun.gov/Polls).
- Voters will be asked to show an [acceptable form of identification](#), such as a Virginia DMV-issued driver's license. Voters who do not have an acceptable form of ID can sign an ID statement affirming their identity and they will be able to vote a regular ballot.
- Also, curbside voting is available at all polling places for individuals who have mobility issues.

Know Who Can Vote

- All registered voters in Loudoun County are eligible to vote in the general election. [Same Day Voter Registration](#) is also available and allows voters to register and vote a provisional ballot up to and including Election Day. Provisional ballots are used by voters who do not appear on the list of registered voters at their polling location. Provisional ballots are not processed by a vote counting machine at the time of

voting; they are subject to approval by the local electoral board.

Board of Supervisors Completes Review of Draft Zoning Ordinance; Public Hearing Scheduled for December 13

During a final work session on the Zoning Ordinance Rewrite project October 30, 2023, the Board of Supervisors completed its review of the Draft Zoning Ordinance that was sent to them by the Planning Commission in July. The Board held eight work sessions in

September and October and passed more than 150 motions to edit the ordinance text and proposed regulations. The Board's final version of the ordinance will now be prepared for a public hearing in December.

Next Steps

In the coming weeks, all of the edits to the Draft Zoning Ordinance that were approved by the Board will be incorporated to produce a final Zoning Ordinance. The final version of the ordinance will be available for the public to review prior to the upcoming public hearing and will be posted on the county's website when available. The public hearing will also be publicly advertised in November in accordance with Virginia law.

The Board of Supervisors may vote to adopt the new Zoning Ordinance following public input at the December 13 public hearing. Once adopted, the new ordinance will replace the current ordinance, the [Revised 1993 Zoning Ordinance](#).

Public Hearing December 13

The Board of Supervisors will hold a public hearing on Wednesday, December 13, 2023, at 6:00 p.m. The public hearing will be held in the Board Room at the Loudoun County Government Center located at 1 Harrison Street SE in Leesburg.

Members of the public can sign up in advance to speak to the Board in person or by phone regarding the proposed new Zoning Ordinance. Instructions for signing up to speak are posted on the county's website at loudoun.gov/signuptospeak.

The Board's December 13 public hearing will be televised on the county's cable channel, Comcast Government Channel 23 and Verizon FIOS 40, and livestreamed online at loudoun.gov/meetings.

About the Zoning Ordinance

The zoning ordinance regulates land use throughout the county and is the primary implementation tool for the Loudoun County 2019 Comprehensive Plan, a policy document that provides guidance for elected officials and other governmental decision-makers as to where and how the community will grow over many years.

An update to the zoning ordinance is necessary following adoption of the Comprehensive Plan in 2019. The new zoning ordinance is intended to be more modern and user-friendly, with new regulations that reflect the land use policies in the Comprehensive Plan.



building. The proposed building would be built over an existing parking lot between Route 7 and 20098 Ashbrook Place, Ashburn.

This application was approved by the Board of Supervisors at its September 14th Public Hearing after receiving a unanimous Planning Commission recommendation of approval and having no outstanding land use issues from Loudoun County planning and zoning staff.



Ashburn Station / The Regency ZMAP-2018-0010 **No Change**

This project, at the southwest corner of Ashburn Village Boulevard and Waxpool Road, was approved by the

intersection. The flex-industrial buildings are allowed by-right, meaning without Board of Supervisors approval. St Johns Properties has submitted an application to reduce the parking setback for the property along Gloucester Parkway from 75 to 50 feet. That application is scheduled to appear before the Board of Supervisors at the November 15th Public Hearing.



Belmont Chase, Regency at ZMAP-2013-0003 **No Change**

This project, on land in between Claiborne Parkway, Ashburn Road, and Russell Branch Parkway, was approved by the Board of

Board of Supervisors in December 2019 as a rezoning from 1 residential unit per acre to 24 residential units per acre. Up to 254 residential units will be built. The developer is installing a series of sidewalks and trails to connect the area to the Metro station, and dedicating [around 70 acres](#) of parkland to the County. Sidewalk installation, road construction, and building framing is currently underway.



Broadlands Demott & Silver
ZMAP-2016-0010
ZMOD-2021-0018
No Change

[This project](#), on land between Demott Drive, the Dulles Greenway, Waxpool Road, and Old Ryan Road, was

Supervisors in March 2018, and allows for the construction of 105 age-restricted townhomes and 33,000 square feet of retail space. The construction of the age-restricted townhomes are still underway. The retail space has yet to begin construction. An application for a gas station and fast food restaurant were withdrawn and are not being considered anymore.



Broadlands CyrusOne

The [draft study](#) examined existing and projected conditions along Route 7, between Dranesville Road at the Fairfax County line to the Route 28 interchange. The study included an evaluation of the history of recent crashes, an analysis of existing traffic operations along the corridor, and



Route 28 / Dulles Toll Road Interchange Study No Change

Completed in spring 2021, a study was performed to assess traffic movements and safety measures at the interchange between Route 28, the Dulles Toll Road, and the Dulles Greenway (also encompassing the interchanges between Route 28 and Innovation Avenue and Old Ox Road). The study

Shellhorn Road and Sterling Boulevard Extensions No Change

[This project](#) constructs an extension of Shellhorn road from the existing terminus at Loudoun County Parkway through to the existing Sterling Boulevard interchange at Route 28. Portions of the Shellhorn Road extension will follow the existing alignments of Lockridge and Moran Roads.



Waxpool Road Intersection Improvements I

This project funds intersection improvements and turn lanes at Waxpool Road and Pacific Boulevard, intersection improvements and turn lanes at Waxpool Road and Broderick Drive, and intersection improvements and turn lanes at Waxpool Road and Loudoun County Parkway.

The project is currently in the design stage and will be constructed in segments. This project will now be accelerated one year due to adjustments in the County's Capital Improvement Program. More information is available at Loudoun.gov/shellhornextended and Loudoun.gov/5416.



Waxpool Road Intersection Improvements II No Change

[A study](#) was completed on the safety of Waxpool Road from Demott Drive to Faulkner Parkway. The Board has allocated \$300,000 to install a four-way stop at the intersection of Ashburn Road and Waxpool Road as a temporary solution before a traffic signal is installed by

The lane closure and work that is being done to remove overlapping utilities underneath the rightmost travel lane of eastbound Waxpool Road between Pacific Boulevard and Route 28 is expected to continue until November 2023. Project information can be found [here](#) and [here](#).
