




LCSO DASHBOARD - PAST 30 DAYS (MAR. 21-APR. 20)



BURGLARY

On December 16, after having been away from their residence for 12 days, a Leesburg (520) resident discovered their back door had been broken into.

A Taurus Millennium 9 mm handgun, multiple jewelry items, designer bags, and other miscellaneous items, with a total value of approx. \$45,000, were stolen.

On April 10, 2023, the firearm and multiple items of the jewelry were discovered discarded in Frederick, MD.



On March 14, a resident of Paeonian Springs reported the larceny of 3 firearms, valued at a total of \$8,000, which had occurred at some point over the previous 2 weeks. He suspected his dog walker (SPINKS) and told him about the missing firearms and that they'd been reported as stolen to LCSO.

During the next week, SPINKS surreptitiously returned each of the 3 missing firearms which were subsequently discovered.

Upon being interviewed, SPINKS made a full confession, declaring his actions "stupid," and turned himself in for service of the felony warrants.

DEA DRUG TAKE-BACK





In partnership with the DEA, law enforcement agencies in Loudoun County (LCSO, PPD, LPD, and MPD) participated in a drug takeback event on April 22 at multiple locations throughout the county. A total of 792 lbs of potentially dangerous medications were collected for proper destruction.

COMMUNITY RESOURCE - VAPE OPERATION





On April 12, Station 5 CR Deputy
Southward conducted a vape operation at
5 locations in Western Loudoun. Of those
5, one summons was issued to West End
Motors, Lovettsville, for selling to an
underage buyer.

Tobacco, nicotine vapor, and alternative tobacco products may not be sold to anyone under the age of 21 unless the seller first verifies that person's age by means of reliable photographic identification* containing the person's date of birth.

Active-duty military personnel who are 18 years of age or older may legally purchase tobacco products by displaying a valid ID card issued by US Armed Forces.

*Employer or school issued IDs are not acceptable forms of ID.




