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Commissioner of the Revenue to Hold Tax Relief Seminars

65 or Older or Disabled? – Learn about Loudoun’s Real Estate Tax and Vehicle Tax Relief Programs; Information Sessions Scheduled

Loudoun County Commissioner of the Revenue Robert S. Wertz Jr. has scheduled free information sessions to familiarize residents who are age 65 years or older, **or** are totally and permanently disabled, with the county’s generous real estate and vehicle tax relief programs.

Loudoun County residents who are age 65 or older, or are disabled, and have income and wealth below established limits may benefit from a reduction in the amount of property taxes they pay. Program participants saved over \$9 million in real estate and vehicle property taxes in tax year 2023.

Anyone interested in learning about the tax relief program is encouraged to attend one of the free sessions being offered throughout the county. No appointment or RSVP is required. All sessions begin at 10:30 a.m. The schedule is as follows:
