She was informed that there was fraud happening in her bank account and that she needed to transfer her money to another account. After transferring her money, she realized she had been the victim of a scam. SO240005116

03/20/2024	Aldie	Law Enforcement Scam: Complainant reported that he received a phone call from someone claiming to be a member of the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office. The suspect informed the complainant that he missed jury duty and a warrant of arrest had been issued. He was told he could avoid being arrested by paying 12% of the bond that was issued. After paying the money at different Coinme machine he realized he was the victim of a scam. This case is under investigation. SO240005090
03/20/2024	Sterling	Facebook Scam: The complainant reported that she has been dating a man she met on Facebook but has never actually met in person. During the course of their online relationship the man/boyfriend has requested bail and other money from her on several occasions, in the form of gift cards. She now believes she is the victim of a scam. SO240005061

Safety Tips / Announcements



Recently, the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office has received numerous reports of impersonation scams where individuals are pretending to be sheriffs' deputies and, in many cases, use legitimate names and ranks. In these scams, the bad actors are telling citizens that they missed jury duty and have warrants for their arrest. The callers go on to say that citizens can pay a fine for the warrants to be dismissed by way of mobile payment services, gift cards, or cryptocurrency.

Please know that the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office does not operate this way. Our Financial and Cybercrime Unit is working diligently to investigate these crimes and hold these criminals accountable.
