Scams

04/08/2024	Sterling	Phone Scam: The complainant reported that she received a text message from a random number requesting two \$200 eBay gift cards. The text message also stated that they were cancer patients at an undisclosed hospital. The complainant purchased the gift cards and provided the numbers to the unknown person on the back. She then realized that she was the victim of a scam. SO240006283
04/08/2024	Aldie	Microsoft Scam: The complainant reported that he was having issues with his computer, so he googled a number for Microsoft and called the first number he saw. The complainant was told that people in Germany were accessing his computer, and someone was listening through his computer, so he would need to download software called "Ultra View" (remote viewing software). The complainant was also told his banking information had been compromised and needed to withdraw his money and deposit it into a bitcoin ATM in Alexandria. After withdrawing and depositing the money, he realized he was the victim of a scam. SO240006275

Safety Tips / Announcements

Five Signs You're Being Scammed

1

You're asked to purchase gift cards or cash app money.

Anytime you are asked to pay for goods, services, etc. by purchasing gift cards or to send money through a cash app to someone you personally do not know - it is a scam. Don't Do It.

2

You're being rushed.

No legitimate company will rush you into making a decision, providing sensitive information, or sending money or gift cards.

3

A government agency contacts you out of the blue.

If a government agency (law enforcement included) contacts you and asks you to purchase gift cards or to send money through a cash app - It is a scam. Call the agency or law enforcement, using their official phone # and NOT the one the person called you from.

4

A company contacts you out the blue.

If a company contacts you out of the blue - be wary. Go to their official website and call the number you get from there to determine if it is legitimate. Never provide any information or purchase gift cards or cash app any money.

5

You're sent an email or text with a link.

Scammers want you to click links sent through email or text message to place a virus on your computer or phone. The virus gives them access to your sensitive information.

Please call us prior to sending any money or purchasing gift cards.
