# DRIVING

- When you drive, be on the lookout for any problems that affect the neighborhood's well-being such as abandoned cars, missing signs, malfunctioning traffic lights, reckless drivers, or poor street lighting. Follow up and report any problems to the appropriate authorities.
- If your cell phone does not work and your vehicle does break down, raise the hood or tie a white cloth to the street-side door handle. Stay in the locked vehicle. If someone stops to help, ask him or her to phone for assistance.



- Keep a flashlight, blanket, jumper cables, basic tool set, road flares, map and a good spare tire with tire changing accessories in the trunk of your vehicle.
- Keep your vehicle in good running condition to avoid breakdowns and keep at least ¼ tank of gas in it at all times.
- Park in a well-lighted area that will still be well lighted when you return.
- Remove any items of value from your vehicle or hide them out of sight.
