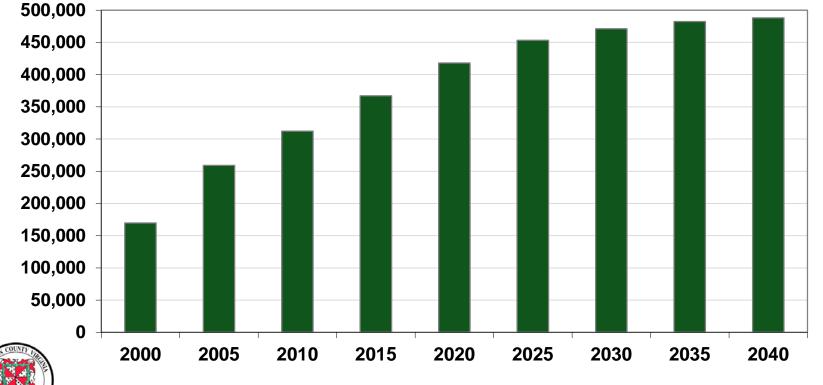




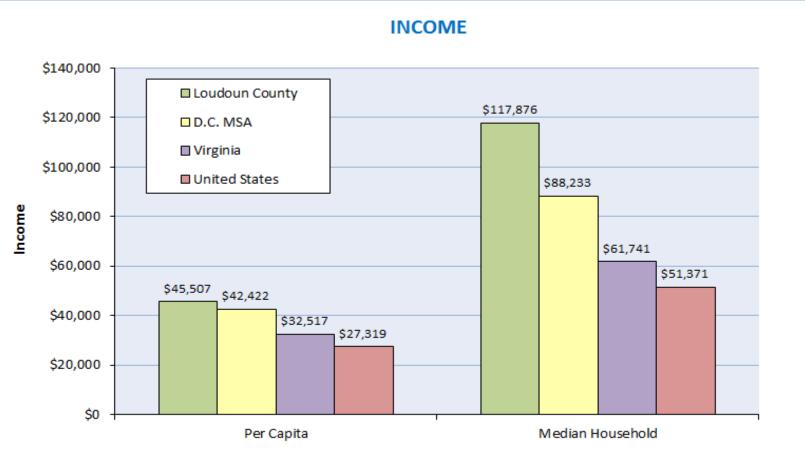
#### **Forecasted Population**

**Total Population** 









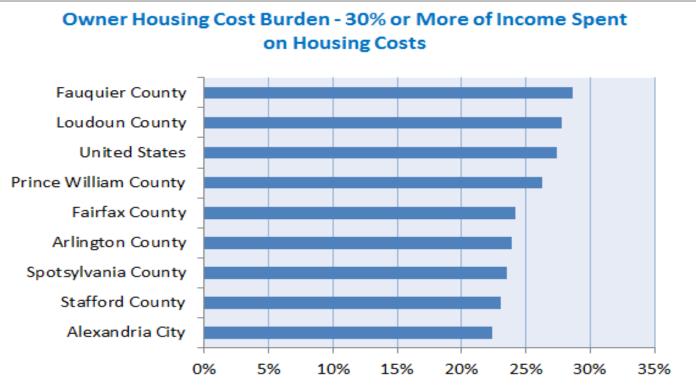

- High labor force participation rate of 77% in 2012
- High wage earners
- Large number of households with multiple incomes:
  - Loudoun has 66.4% of its family households with two wage earners in the labor force compared to 51.4% of for the nation overall in 2012.







Note: Excludes housing units where selected monthly owner costs as a percentage of income could not be determined.

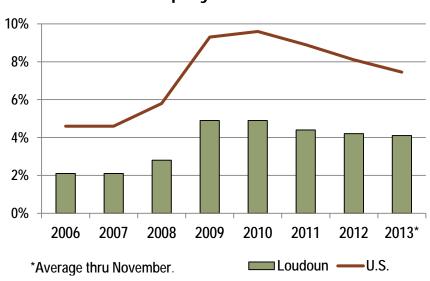

### FY 2015 Revenue Outlook

- Increase of \$69 million in local tax revenue from FY 14 to FY 15
- Increase of real property values of 8.3% from January 2013 to January 2014
- Growth in personal property, sales and BPOL revenues





### How the Budget is Developed

- Fiscal Guidance from the Board
  - Estimate of funds available
  - Guide for County Administrator and Schools to aim for
  - Given in September 2013
- County Administrator Budget Development
  - Build budget to address needs within this guidance
  - If needs are greater, inform Board and tell why
  - September through January Department-based





### **Assessments and Equalized Tax Rate**

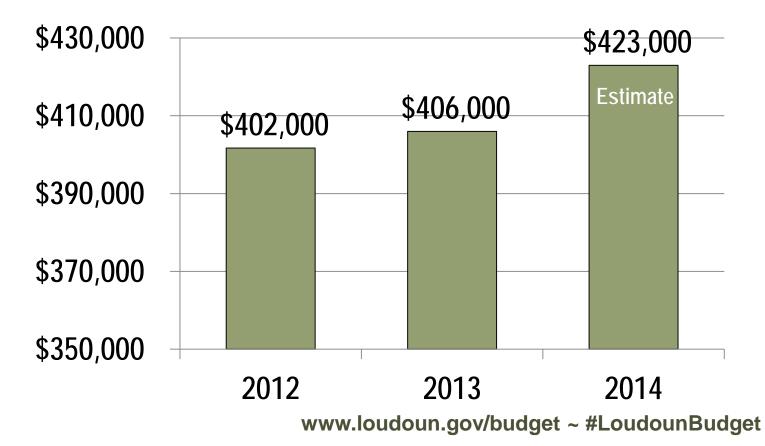
- Assessment Process
  - Fair Market value as of January 1, 2014
  - Based on recent sales, market data
  - Conducted by Commissioner of Revenue
- Tax Rate
  - Set by Board; rate per \$100 of assessed value
  - "Equalized Rate" no change in tax bill from 2013 for
    <u>average</u> homeowner

### **Board of Supervisors Process**

- Provide Fiscal Guidance September 2013
- Receive County Administrator's Presentation Feb 5
- Meet with School Board Feb 18
- Budget Public Hearings Feb 26/27, March 1
- Work Sessions Month of March
  - Work Session with School Board on March 3
- Budget Adoption April 2, 2014





### How County and LCPS Budgets Integrate

- Local Tax Funding is largest revenue source for LCPS
- Board gives LCPS a "lump sum"
  - Line items for LCPS set by School Board
- Fiscal Guidance from Board also affects anticipated transfer to LCPS
  - Goal is for School Board to meet Board guidance
- Board must consider <u>all</u> needs of County:



Schools, Public Safety, Human Services, Development, etc.



- Equalized tax rate of \$1.155 meets BOS guidance and stated priorities
- Adheres to Board's adopted vision, goals and work plan
- Enhancements
  - Public safety
  - Community development
  - Resources required to open new facilities
- Enhancement requests that remain unfunded





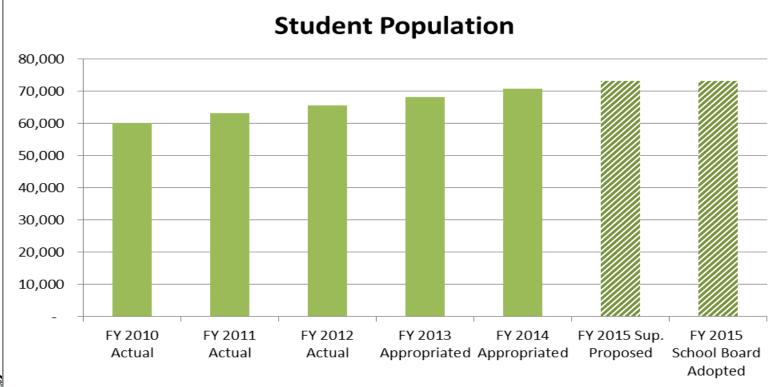
### FY 2015 Proposed Fiscal Plan LOUDOUN COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS

- Increase of 2,375 Students
- Opening of 3 new schools
- At equalized rate, including all other revenue sources, LCPS will receive <u>\$66.7 million</u> in additional revenue from FY 2014 to FY 2015
  - Approximate 8% increase
  - Increase in local transfer: \$45.5 million





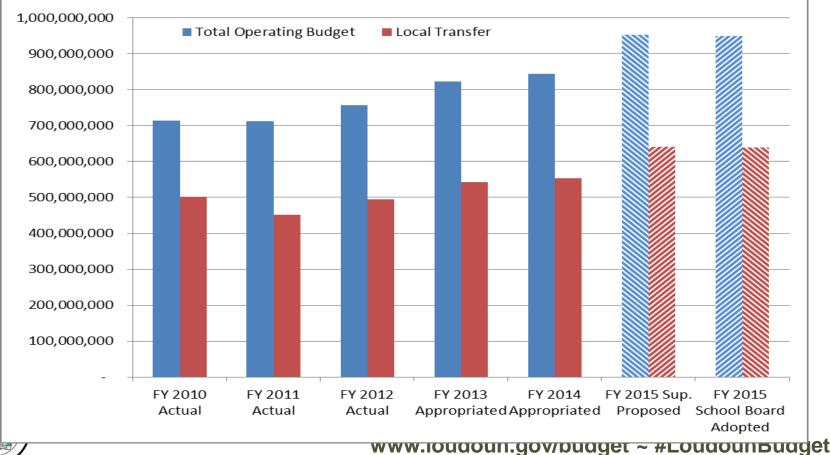
#### LOUDOUN COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS





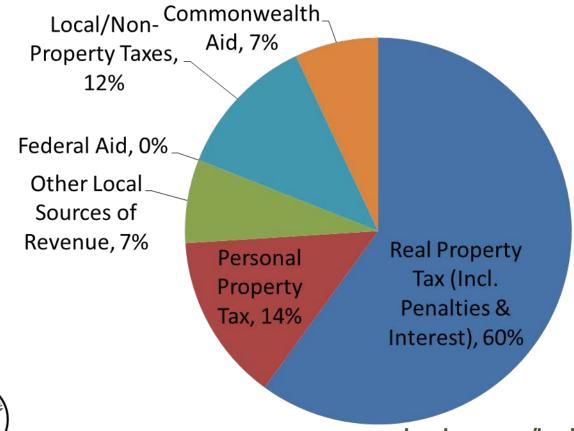


#### **LCPS Operating Budget and Local Transfer History**





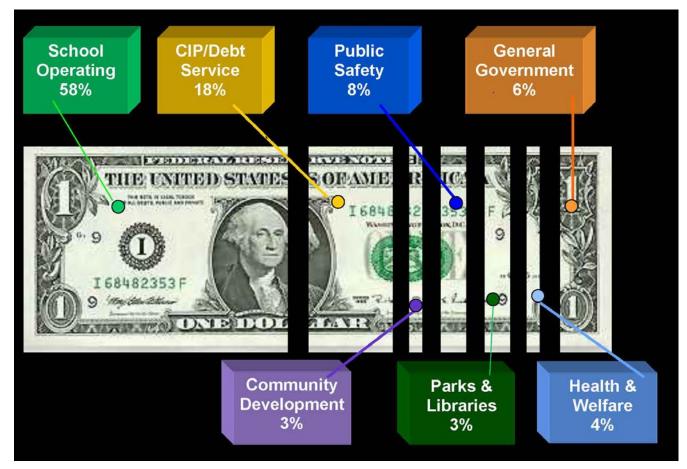
### **General Revenue Sources**







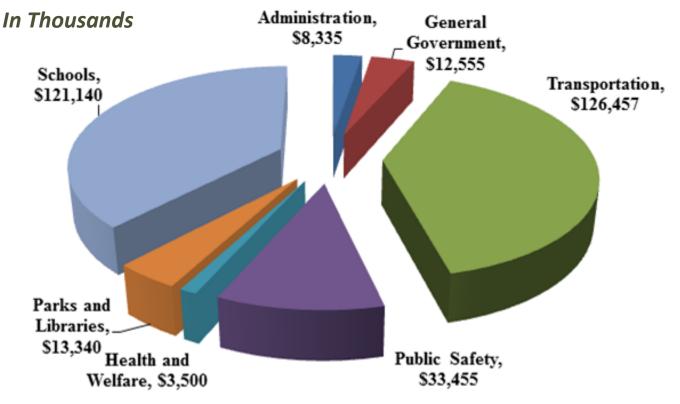

#### FY 2015 CAPITAL BUDGET: GENERAL GOVERNMENT

- \$198 million
- Transportation
  - \$40 million for Dulles Rail
  - \$80 million for Road Projects
    - Belmont Ridge Rd, Gloucester Pkwy, Riverside Pkwy
- Dulles Multi-Purpose Center Phase III
- Courts, Fire Station





#### FY 2015 CAPITAL BUDGET: LOUDOUN COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS

### \$121 million

- \$35 million for Dulles North Elementary
- \$53.5 million for Dulles North Middle School
- \$6 million for the design funding of Advanced Technology Academy
- \$26.5 million for renovation of Broad Run High School
