UDOUN STATION

Ever had a neighbor who is on the porch making lots of noise? Now, the sheriff's office can do something about it. The new codified zoning ordinance passed by the Board of Supervisors on July 13 gives the sheriff's office enforcement power. The noise ordinance applies to individuals not commercial businesses. The general prohibition states that no person shall permit, operate or cause any source of sound or sound generation that is audible and discernible in any other person's residential dwelling with the doors and windows to that other person's residential dwelling closed.

The zoning ordinance noise standards that apply to commercial businesses was forwarded to the September 22 Board Business Meeting for action. Public input is at 5:00 and 6:30 pm and advanced sign-up is available until noon the day of the Business Meeting. Contact the Clerk to the Board of Supervisors at 703-777-0204 to sign-up to speak.

Loudoun County hosted an information session on the new proffer legislation and small area plans on Wednesday, July 20. This meeting explained the new state legislation that limits the types of proffers the county may accept and information on a Comprehensive Plan Amendment (CPAM) establishing Small Area Plans to implement the new state legislation. The Small Area Plans proposed by staff will encompass the two Loudoun Metro stations and the Dulles Airport Metro station, and generally coincide with the county's suburban communities designated by the Revised General Plan. These Small Area Plans will also provide a means for the county to implement the broader policies of the New Comprehensive Plan, currently being developed, and to address community and neighborhood issues. The Northern Virginia Transportation Authority voted to grant Leesburg \$20 million toward the construction of a new interchange at Battlefield Parkway and Route 7 in

FY2017. This brings the total funding up to \$33 million of the \$58 million needed for the interchange. I want to thank Leesburg residents and Loudoun County representatives and staff who made a compelling case for funding this year.

While <u>Loudoun County is prepared to combat Zika virus</u>, there are simple steps that each of us can take to protect ourselves and our families. Wear long pants and long-sleeved shirts to cover exposed skin and use EPA-registered insect repellent. Because the Asian tiger mosquito is mainly a daytime biter, it is important to wear repellent during the day and night.

- Replace or dump out water at least weekly in bird baths and pet bowls.
- Dispose of containers that can capture water, such as drink containers, tires, toys, tarps, etc.
- Look for sources of standing water, such as potted plants, roof gutters, air conditioners, corrugated drain pipes, etc.
- If standing water cannot be removed, consider treating the water with larvicides, which prevent mosquitoes from developing and are available at home improvement stores.

Next Phase of Metrorail SafeTrack Program to Affect Loudoun Commuters

The fifth "surge" of the SafeTrack plan will result in single tracking between the East Falls Church and Ballston Metro stations. The direct effects on Loudoun County bus riders will be:



From July 20-29, 2016, Loudoun
County Transit will temporarily alter two of its Metro-Connection bus service
routes - Potomac Falls Routes 901 and 902 - to bypass the impacted section
of Metrorail track. All Potomac Falls service will be re-routed from the West

Falls Church Metro Station to the Ballston Metro Station during this period. The schedule is online at <u>www.loudoun.gov/SafeTrack</u>.

 During the surge, Metro's Silver Line trains will operate every 18 minutes as opposed to the normal six-minute intervals. To assist commuters, Loudoun County Transit has produced flyers that highlight the morning and afternoon buses that line up within seven minutes of the rail arrival or departure.
