On September 16th, the Board of Supervisors held a Strategic Planning Retreat to identify our strategic goals for the remainder of our term. Historically, the strategic plan has served as a work program, providing direction to staff on initiatives of importance to the Board. We identified 5 strategic areas: transportation, economic development, new comprehensive plan, community health and wellness, and growth planning and management. Staff will develop a work plan outlining the steps to accomplish the strategic goals. I will provide an update when the work plan is available.

The Youth Knowledge Enrichment (TYKE) Foundation was established to prepare youth for STEM occupations. In order to meet these critical

September 11th Remembrance Ceremonies

On September 11th, Chair Randall attended ceremonies in Purcellville (pictured below), Leesburg and Lovettsville observing the tragic day. All were moving expressions of support and pride for our country and appreciation of our first responders. In Lovettsville, two speakers were first responders to the Pentagon. The Northern Virginia Firefighter' Emerald Society Pipe Band played throughout the ceremony in Lovettsville and sang "God Bless America" just as 150 members of Congress did on that fateful evening.





Investing in Transportation

Chair Randall attended a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the opening of a Russell Branch Parkway Segment on September 7. The recently-opened segment of the parkway between Ashburn Road and Ashburn Village Boulevard was identified as a "missing link' in the county's Eastern Loudoun Transportation Study.

She also attended a groundbreaking ceremony for Belmont Ridge Road, Gloucester Parkway to Hay Road

on September 27. The Belmont Ridge Road Project illustrates the regional collaboration between the Norhern Virginia Transportation Authority (NVTA), Loudoun County and VDOT. NVTA is investing \$20 million towards this project and plans to invest an additional \$19.5 million in improvements to Belmont Ridge Road from Turo Parish Road to Croson Lane for a total of \$39.5 million.



Labor of Love Resolution

On Thursday, September 1st members of the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors presented a proclamation declaring Labor Day Weekend as a "Labor of Love" weekend to Norman Duncan, a Loudoun County man who serves as chairman of the International Caregivers Association

Board, which works to create a universal standard of dementia care. Duncan also served as a longtime caregiver for his wife Elsie, who died in 2015. The Labor of Love Weekend is one way we can acknowledge and honor the great sacrifices of caregivers," said Chair Randall. "They commit time and resources to comforting their loved ones who are suffering from Alzheimer's disease--it truly is a labor of love."

Absentee Voting for November Election

From September 23 through October 21, inperson absentee voting will take place at the Loudoun County Office of Elections, 750 Miller Drive, S.E., Suite C in Leesburg, Monday through Friday, from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Beginning October 24, hours for absentee voting at the Office of Elections will be Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Absentee voting will be available on Saturday, October 29, and Saturday, November 5, from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.



From October 24 through November 4, voters may also vote absentee at the Cascades Senior Center, 21060 Whitfield Place, Sterling; and the Dulles South Multipurpose Center, 24950 Riding Center Drive, South Riding, Monday through Friday, from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. and Saturday, October 29, and Saturday, November 5, from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
