On Sunday, October 9th, Loudoun County came together to paint and clean the grounds of the historic Ashburn Colored School. Over 600 people came to the Community Restoration Celebration to repair the school. I am pleased to announce that Dan Snyder and the Washington Redskins Charitable Foundation will donate \$35,000 to benefit the restoration of the Ashburn Colored School. The Redskins leadership reached out to my office to see what they could do to help and informed us that Mr. Snyder and the Foundation would gladly fund the difference between what had already been raised and the \$100,000 funding goal. 

Investing in Transportation

Chair Randall attended a groundbreaking ceremony on October 18 to mark the construction of the missing four-lane segment of Tall Cedars Parkway between Pinebrook Road and Gum Spring Road. Construction is planned to last 18 months, with completion anticipated in spring 2018.

VDOT has scheduled a Pardon our Dust public meeting for the Belmont Ridge Road widening project (Hay Road to Gloucester Parkway) on October 27 from 6:30 to 8:00 pm at Belmont Station Elementary School Cafeteria, 20235 Nightwatch Street in Ashburn. The purpose of the meeting is to inform the public about the upcoming construction project and discuss the construction schedule.

Northern Virginia Transportation Authority (NVTA) launched a <u>fall survey</u>. The purpose of this survey is to gather information from residents that will help shape transportation planning for Northern Virginia for the next 25 years. NVTA's mandate is to develop multi-modal regional solutions that address traffic congestion and other regional transportation needs.

Solarize Loudoun

The Loudoun County government is partnering with the Northern Virginia Regional Commission (NVRC) and the Local Energy Alliance Program (LEAP) to promote the use of solar power in Loudoun County homes and business. Through November 30, Loudoun County can utilize Solarize NOVA to take advantage of a streamlined installation and financing process. Smart Cities Week 2016

On September 29, Chair Randall was invited to speak on the Planning for the Smart City of the Future panel. She explained that the County's GIS mapping



technology is used to permanently protect land from development including historic areas and ensure adequate open and green spaces. The County's GIS provides apps for walking trails, biking trails and bus routes, and determines interim property uses over the next 20 to 40 years. This dovetails nicely with another goal: to encourage people to stay out of their cars.

Community Engagement Coalition Town Hall Meeting

On Wednesday, October 5, Chair Randall was a panelist at a Town Hall meeting at Tuscarora High School to discuss building relationships with local authorities hosted by the Community Engagement Coalition (CEC) and the Loudoun Branch of the NAACP. The CEC is a group of actively concerned



community minded citizens who strongly feel that proactive interaction with law enforcement will lead to positive outcomes in our community. The goal was to have citizens leave with a better understanding and relationship with the local law enforcement and criminal justice system.



Dedication Ceremony for Madison Small Softball Complex

Chair Randall attended a ceremony formally dedicating softball fields at Trailside Park in Ashburn in honor of Madison Small on October 8. Earlier this year, the Board of Supervisors approved a resolution naming softball fields #1 and #2 at Trailside Park, "The Madison Small Softball Complex." The resolution honored the memory of Small, the Broad Run High School senior and softball team captain who passed away suddenly in 2015. A bronze plaque with Small's name has been placed at the softball fields at Trailside Park. Small grew up playing softball in the Ashburn Girls Softball League and considered Trailside Park her home field.

Voter Registration Deadline for November Election Extended to October 21

The deadline to register to vote or update a registered voter's address for the November general election has been extended in Virginia to Friday, October 21. A federal judge ordered the extension after technical problems with the state's online voter registration system prevented some people from registering by the original October 17 deadline.



Citizens may register to vote in person, online at www.vote.virginia.gov or by mail. For anyone who is registering to vote by mail, the application must be postmarked no later than October 21. In-person voter registration is available through Friday, October 21, at the Loudoun County Voter Registration and Elections Office at 750 Miller Drive, S.E., Suite C, Leesburg, from 8:30 am to 5:00 pm.
