Envision Loudoun

Ashburn Town Hall

Dominion Venting

On Monday, June 19th, Dominion Energy will vent natural gas at the Leesburg Compressor Station on Consolidated Lane off Watson Road between 8:00 am and 12:00 pm. The natural gas will be vented through the silencers to mitigate noise. Dominion states the venting is necessary to complete required replacement of certain pipeline segments and annual testing and inspections. The work associated with the planned venting should be completed by June 23rd. For more information, please e-mail Dominion directly at LDNCCompressorstations@dominionenergy.com.

The Board will be voting on the Silver Line Comprehensive Plan Amendment at the June 22nd business meeting. Additional information will be presented on the airport noise exposure map, net fiscal impact and any information and/or agreements between landowners and the County for the required easements and right of ways to construct the road infrastructure.

The Board forwarded the Planned Development-Town Center Zoning District to the July 5th business meeting for action. The purpose of this amendment is to offer increased flexibility while facilitating high-quality town center developments. The Board moved this item to a future meeting due to concerns from the Lansdowne Conservancy and residents about permitting data centers and mini warehouse uses in town centers.

The primary goal of Simplicity Health is to provide ongoing primary care, prevention, and disease management for chronic illnesses like diabetes, hypertension and heart disease. Patients pay an affordable subscription fee of \$10 per week, four-weeks at a time, for access to regular primary health care, basic behavioral health services and educational group sessions. Investing in Transportation

Northern Virginia Transportation Authority (NVTA) seeks public input on its newly released draft [TransAction plan](#) and [associated project list](#). The draft TransAction plan identifies more than 350 candidate projects and \$44 billion in unmet transportation needs. The public comment period is open now through July 23rd and the public can submit comments in three ways:

A public hearing is scheduled on July 13th with an open house at 5:30 pm, presentation at 7:00 pm and public comment following the presentation. Each speaker will have three minutes and you can [pre-register](#) to speak.

Transportation Summit is scheduled for Thursday, June 29 at 5:00 pm in the Board room of the Government Center, 1 Harrison Street, SE, Leesburg. The public is welcome to attend these summits but there will be no public input session. Emerging issues that will be addressed include intelligent transportation systems, Potomac River crossing, rural roads, Route 7, Route 28, Route 50, and a summary update on the infrastructure projects to support Metrorail. I would like to start the summit with the different transportation funding sources and programs. Please reach out to my office ASAP if you would like your organization or group represented at the Transportation Summit.

Loudoun is seeking public input on the proposed alternatives to relieve congestion and improve safety on Route 15 north of Leesburg (please see the [Route 15 Congestion Report](#)). Additionally, the County is beginning the public input process on safety and operational issues on Route 15 between Whites Ferry Road and the Maryland state line.
