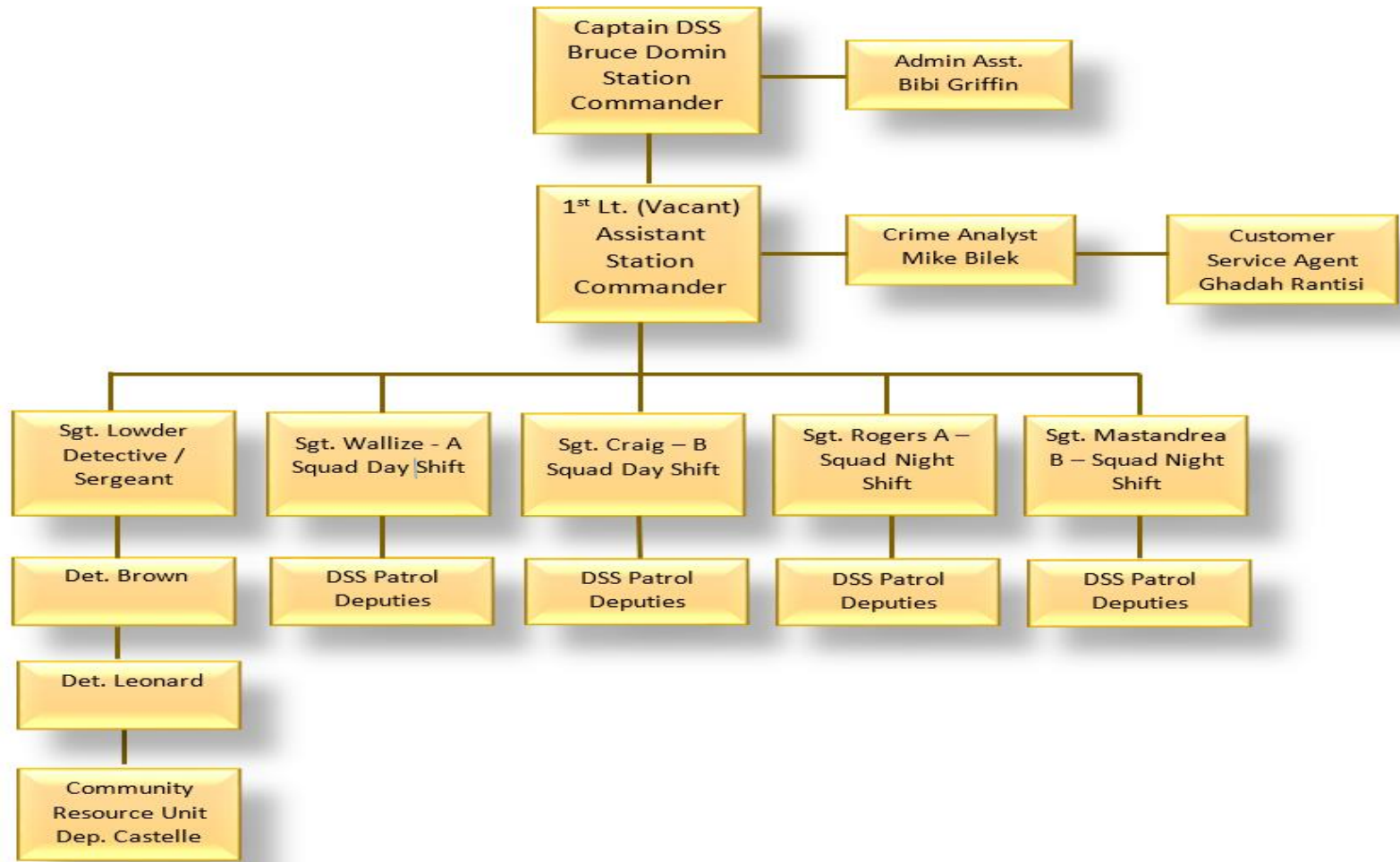

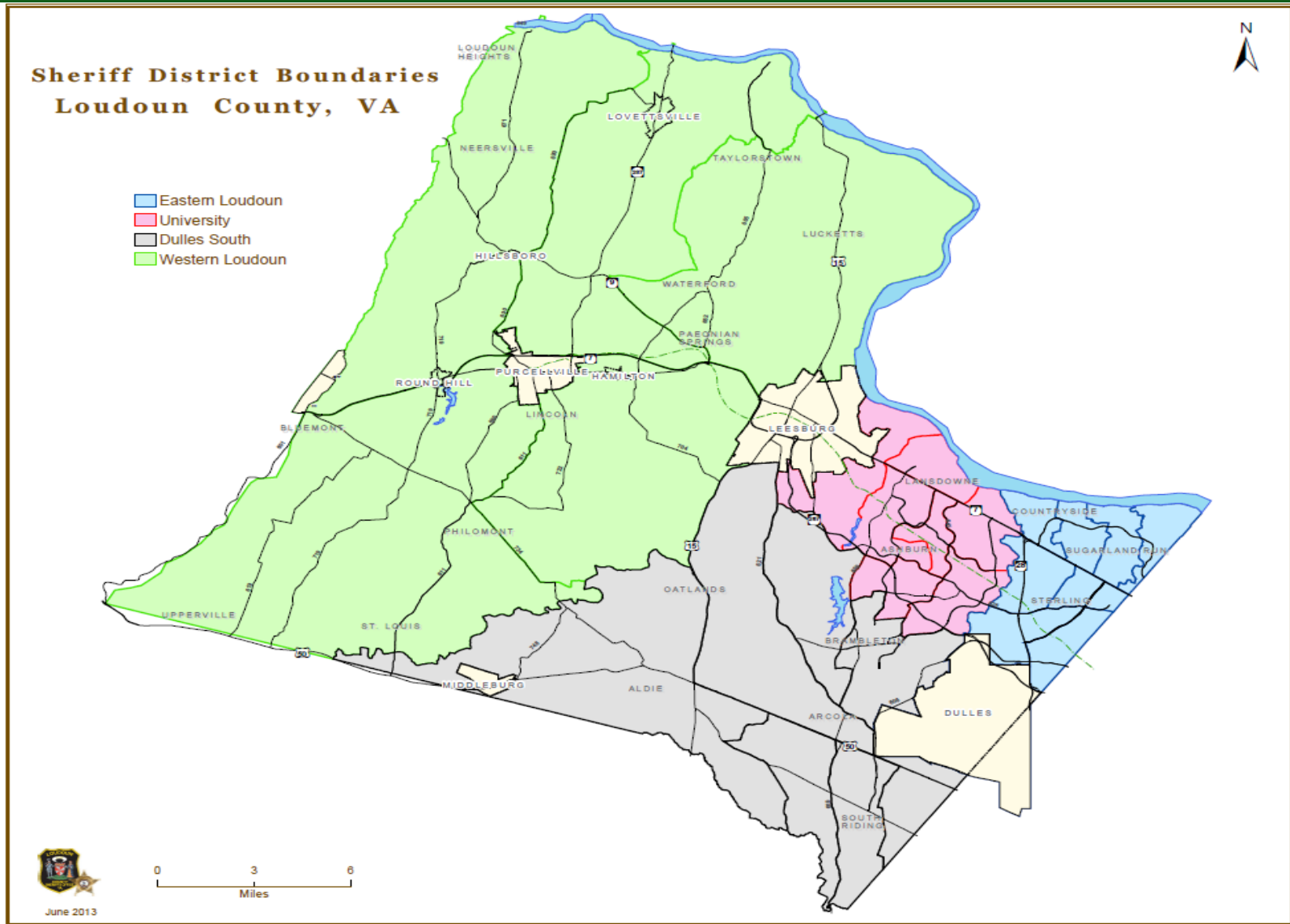


Dulles South Station Organizational Chart



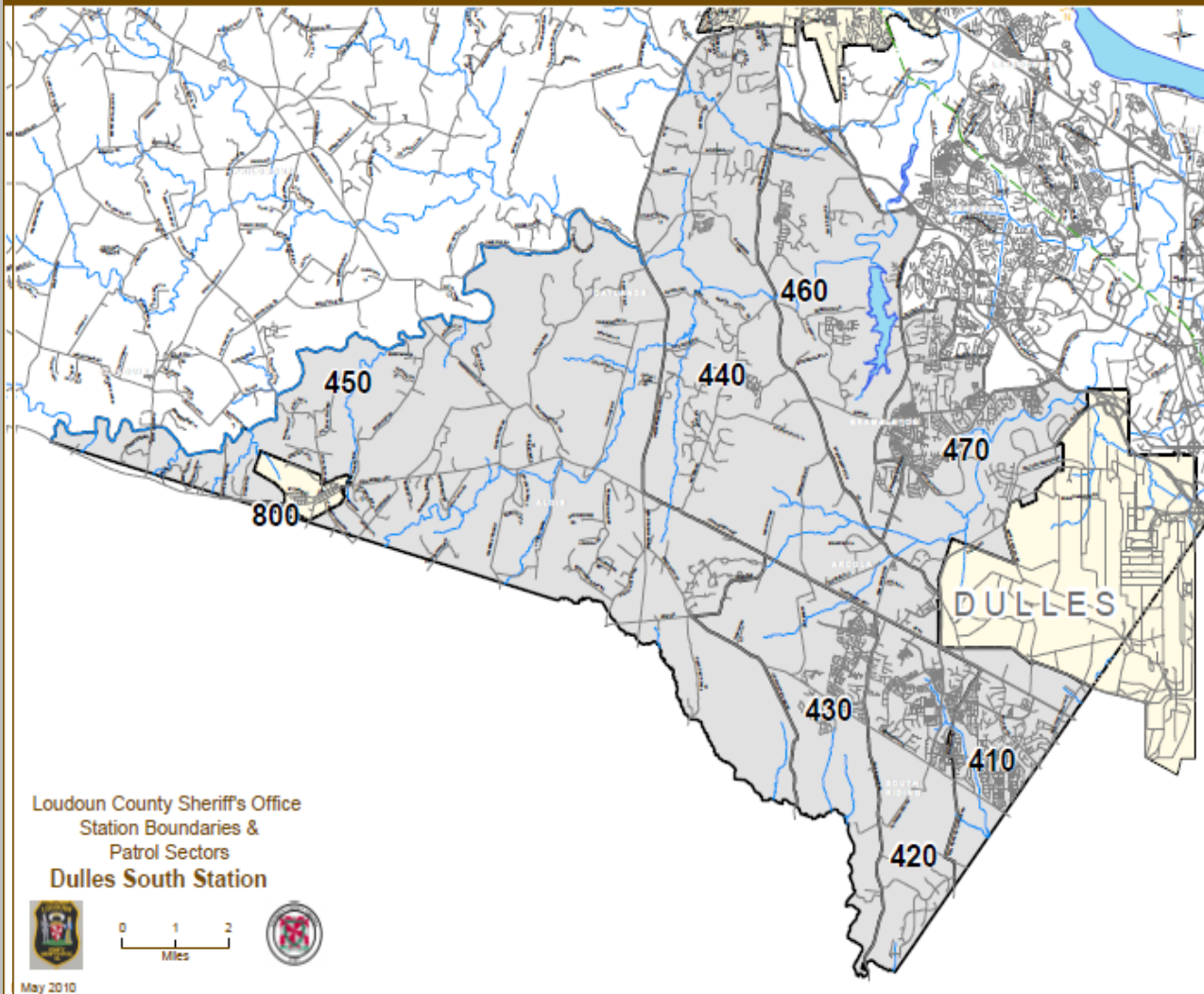


Sheriff's Office Station Boundaries

What is Heroin?



HEROIN

An opiate (narcotic) drug processed from morphine and extracted from certain poppy plants.

Heroin comes in a white or brownish powder, or a black sticky substance known as “black tar heroin.” Often “cut” with other drugs or substances such as sugar or powdered milk. User is unaware how much actual heroin is being used, creating possibility of an overdose.





Heroin can be Smoked, Snorted, or cooked & Injected

Snort

Heroin Paraphernalia



- Small pieces of foil with burn marks
- Needles
- Burned and missing spoons
- Small colored balloons
- Cotton balls for filter for injecting
- Cigarette filters for injecting
- Bottle tops for cooking heroin powder
- Increase in soda cans in bedroom and/or the bottoms of them cut up
- Missing shoe-laces and cut, or long rubber bands
- Cut up straws
- Covering arms all the time
- Lighters or candles
- Expensive personal and household items missing



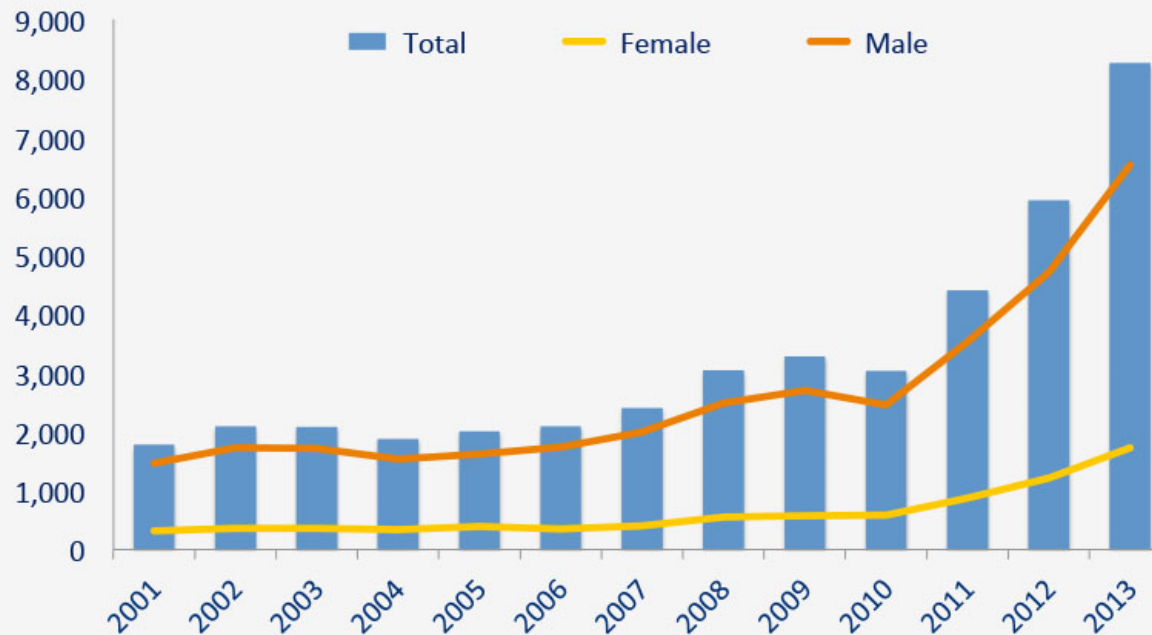

National Overdose Deaths—Number of Deaths from Heroin. The figure above is a bar chart showing the total number of US overdose deaths involving heroin from 2001 to 2013. The chart is overlaid by a line graph showing the number of deaths by females and males. From 2001 to 2013 there was a 5-fold increase in the total number of deaths.





Heroin overdoses frequently begin with a traumatic injury and a pain killer prescription- that leads to addiction



- When valid pain killer prescriptions run out, patients often find themselves addicted
- Heroin then becomes a less expensive and accessible alternative
- But Heroin is 'cut' with other drugs (Fentanyl) that often cause overdoses and sometimes result in death

- **Northern Virginia SOS is Baltimore/Washington DC; also New York and Philadelphia; and Chicago to West Virginia**
- **Travel by car to Washington D.C., Baltimore, MD or Prince Georges County, MD**
- **Wholesale Level Purity 60%-80%**
- **Street Level Purity >60% (Northern Virginia) 2013-14; 50%-60% (MD)**
- **Street Level Price \$15-\$20 (VA); \$10-\$15 (MD);**

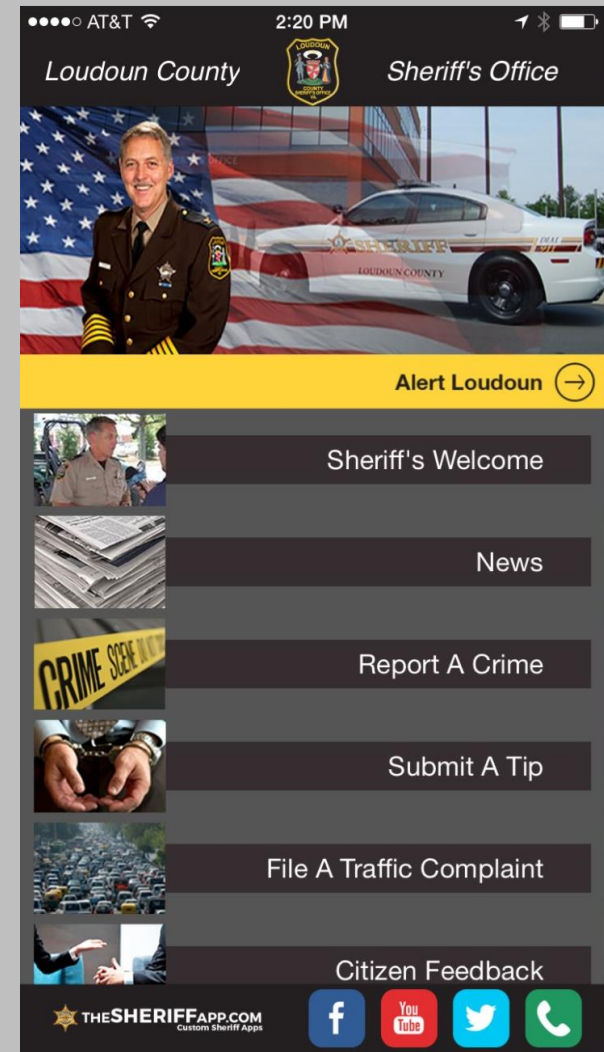

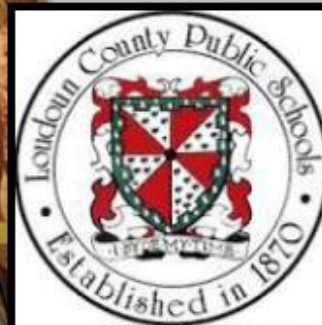

- ▶ Apply for or renew your driver's license – take road and knowledge tests; get your picture taken. Reinstate driving privileges.
- ▶ Get a copy of your driving record.
- ▶ Obtain vehicle titles, license plates, decals, transcripts.
- ▶ Order disabled parking placards or plates.
- ▶ Purchase hunting and fishing licenses and temporary boat registrations.
- ▶ Apply for Virginia birth certificates.
- ▶ Recently moved? Stop in to update your address on your DMV record. At the same time you can update your voter registration address and organ donor status.
