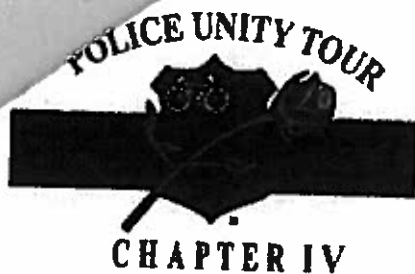

I had the pleasure of meeting Deputy Taylor and a team of Loudoun County Sherriff Department personnel on June 8th and I wanted to let you know of their professionalism and expert handling of a situation involving : . As the official report likely details, was home for a 24-hour visit from Caron Treatment Center, a drug treatment facility in Pennsylvania. began resisting the scheduled return to Caron yesterday morning and shortly after leaving home by car, it became clear to me that we needed professional (police) assistance to diffuse a potentially dangerous situation and accomplish our goal of safely returning to the treatment facility.

missing after going to the Claude Moore Park Rec Center in Sterling [REDACTED] is 77 and has dementia, was cleared by his neurologist to drive, knew the way there and back, and only needed to drive about three miles.. Then, he didn't come home. I kept expecting him to call, but he did not. I called 911 for assistance, and received a call from the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office. Deputy Bauer came to our home to compile a complete report. Deputy Bauer was thorough, kind, and, throughout the night, whether he knew it or not, was able to keep me focused on what steps we needed to take to aid in the search. In other words, he kept me from dissolving into tears and panic. He stayed in contact with me throughout the search, and was the one who notified me that my husband had been found, safe, in Fauquier County. He contacted the officer who was with my husband, and arranged for a pick up location. He ensured that I would be able to drive to Warrenton to get him; I believe he thought I might be too tired to make the round trip. Adrenalin kept me going. He also advised me of a program available through the Sheriff's Office in Loudoun County, Project Lifesaver, which keeps a database on individuals who may, due to their circumstances, once again need to be located. I simply cannot praise Deputy Bauer enough for his (probably to him) routine actions that night. To me, he is a hero. Detective Mark Bush was actively involved. He didn't tell me everything he did, but I was especially impressed that once we determined that Bob had been through the main tool booth at Tysons, actually went there to see which lane he had gone through, in an attempt to figure out which direction he went from there. He decided to alert Montgomery County law enforcement, and kept going, around the beltway, checking license plates of all disabled vehicles along the way. He also kept in touch all evening, always trying to think of a different approach to solve what was become an increasingly worrisome and probably dangerous situation. For Detective Bush, this is what he does. For me, my second hero of the evening. To the extent I could find any comfort in my husband's situation, knowing that not only police and sheriff personnel in counties throughout the state, and also the State Police were actively looking made me realize the many avenues our law enforcement officials undertake for the protection of all of us. Thankfully, for my husband and me, it was a positive outcome. I sincerely believe, had any more time elapsed, that would not have been the case. So, a very special, tearful, and heartfelt "thank you" to Deputy Bauer and Detective Bush. I am thankful they are choosing law enforcement as a career, and pleased they are in Loudoun County, keeping us all safe in times of danger, and kindly helping in times of need.

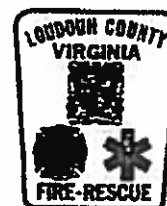

On May 31, 2016, Fire and Rescue Incident Number 201612374, I responded as the Lieutenant Paramedic on Paramedic Engine 626 for a reported cardiac arrest which was later downgraded to a possible overdose. Upon my arrival on the scene, I encountered Deputy First Class Ryan Hamilton attending to the patient. He immediately confirmed that the patient was not in cardiac arrest and that he had administered intranasal naloxone (Narcan) to the patient. Bystander accounts confirm that when found the patient was "barely breathing"; to the point that the initial callers believed the patient to be in cardiac arrest.

Upon commencing my assessment of the patient it became apparent that the he was in considerable medical distress based on his vital signs and general appearance. Had DFC. Hamilton hesitated or deferred to EMS in the administration of the naloxone the patient's condition, in my opinion, could have deteriorated to the point where managing his condition would have been extremely challenging and the outcome could have been far worse from what I anticipate it being at this point in time. I would like to take a moment to let you know that DFC. Hamilton's quick actions directly and positively impacted the patient's condition and greatly assisted in the overall medical management of the patient. If you have the opportunity to extend my thanks to DCF. Hamilton, I would greatly appreciate it.
