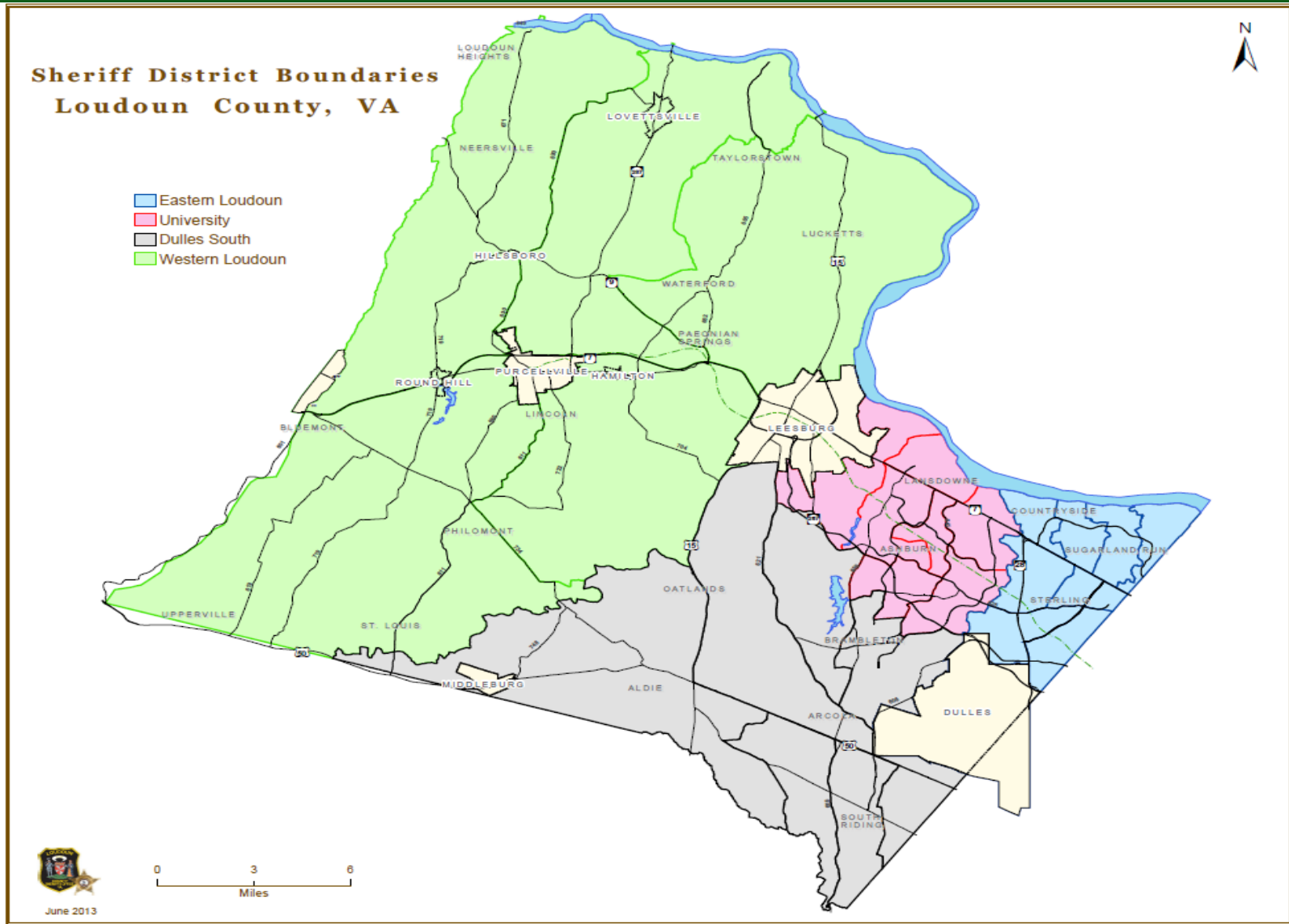

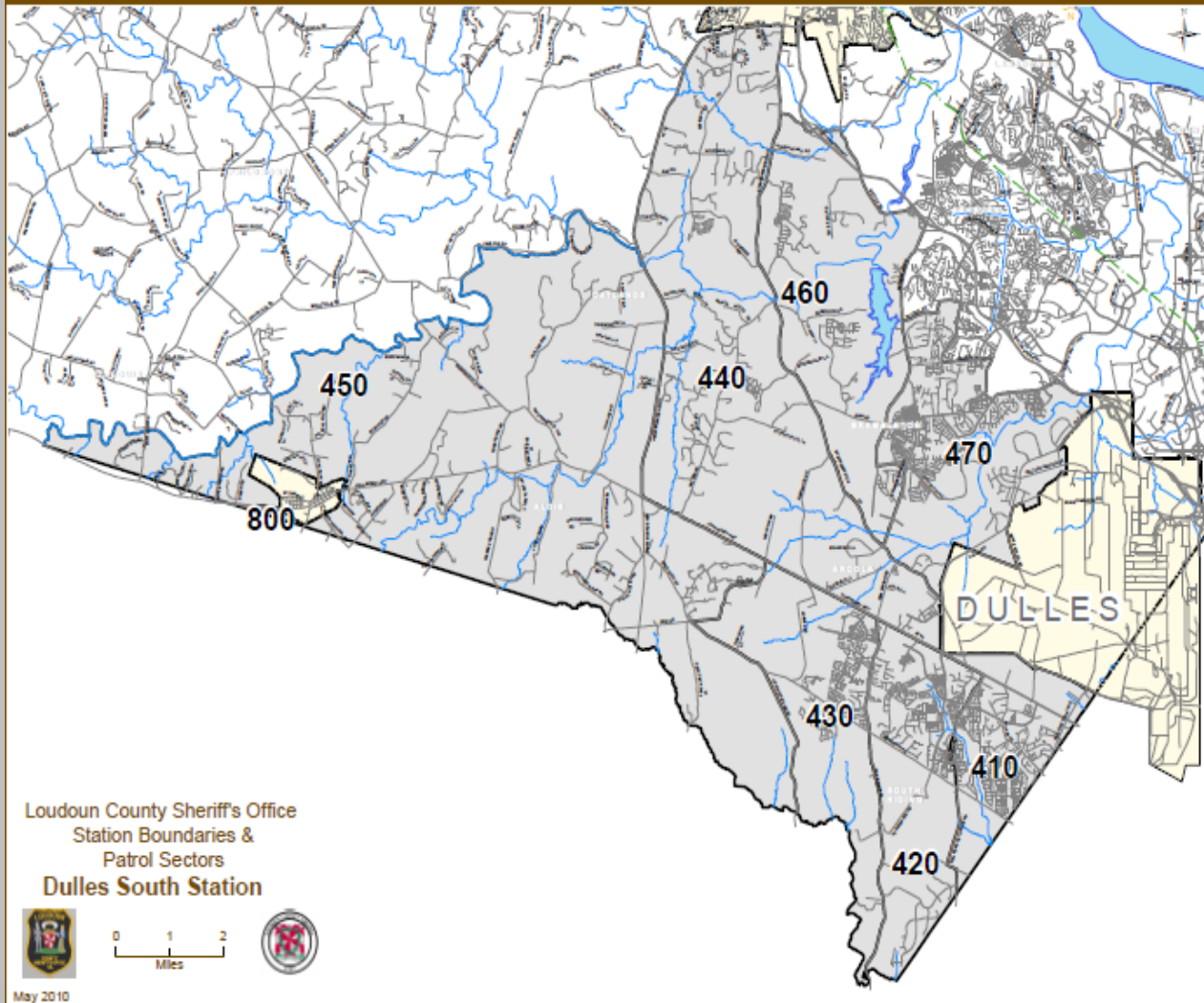


Sheriff's Office Station Boundaries

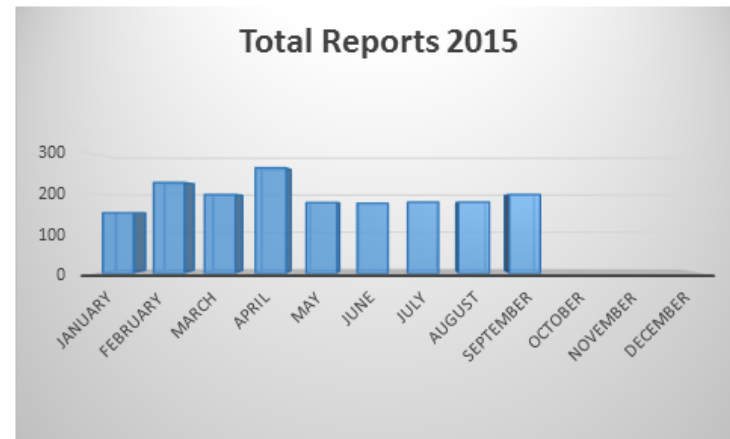

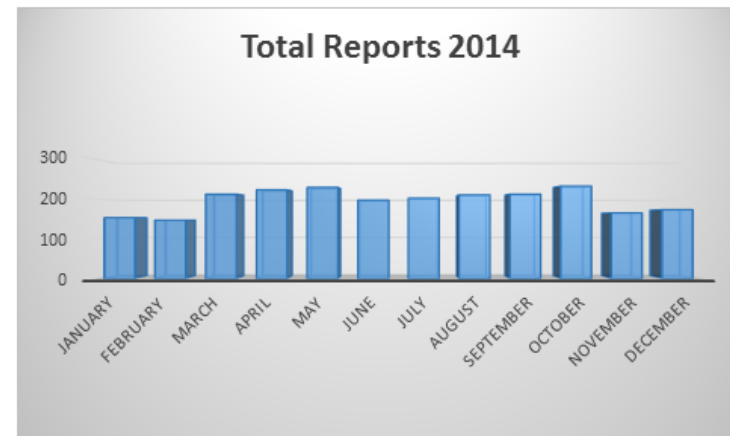

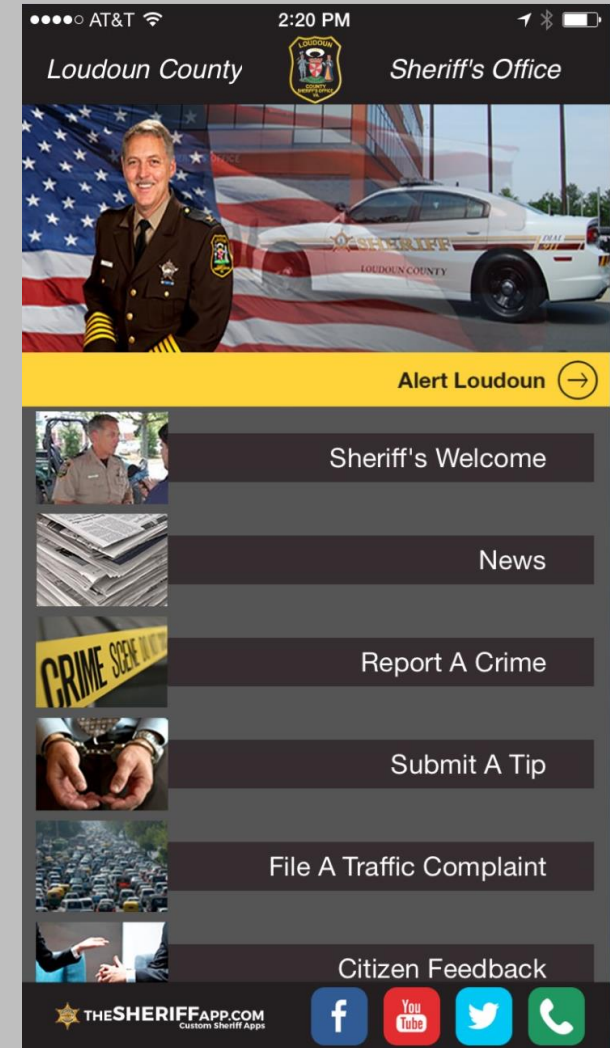

Safety Tips for Runners, Joggers and Walkers



BE AWARE OF YOUR SURROUNDINGS AT ALL TIMES

Tell someone (friends or family) where you will be running and when you should be back.

Run, jog, or walk with a known companion in a familiar area. Run, jog, or walk in a familiar area.

Do not run, jog, or walk in a heavily wooded, poorly lite areas, and take the same route.

Don't wear earphones. Being able to hear your surroundings (traffic, people) will allow you to notice someone you don't see.

Walk or jog facing traffic but not after dark.

Wear bright colored clothing and shoes to improve your visibility.

Carry a cell phone a whistle or high decibel battery powered alarm in case of emergency.

Carry your motor vehicle and/or home key with you.

Report any suspicious activity to law enforcement immediately.





Holiday Burglary Prevention



Preparing For The Changing Season And Weather.



- Check all of the exterior light fixtures
- Trim back or remove seasonal plantings in order to maintain that kept up appearance that deters burglars.
- Ensure you are securing the shed with a dependable lock. (Don't forget the quick shot of WD40 into the lock to prevent freezing.)
- Be sure to close and lock those windows when you are not at home. Even a short trip within the neighborhood could be the opportunity a burglar is looking for.
- Do a quick check and make sure your address numbers are still visible. to emergency responders.
- As the weather gets colder, doors and window frames will shrink. Be sure to check that locks are still working properly. If in doubt, call one of the LCSO Crime Prevention Specialist for a Home Security Inspection.





Prevent Package and Parcel Thefts




- Make arrangements to pick up packages at a package store or postal facility.
- Ask that packages be left on a back porch or set beside the front porch as a theft prevention measure.
- Request a specific delivery time.
- Ask a neighbor to watch for the delivery or keep it until you return home.
- Be extra vigilant in your neighborhood. If you keep seeing something suspicious, such as a vehicle circling the block or a person wandering through the neighborhood, call it in immediately!

- ▶ Apply for or renew your ID card – available for adults and children.
- ▶ Apply for or renew your driver's license – take road and knowledge tests; get your picture taken. Reinstate driving privileges.
- ▶ Get a copy of your driving record.
- ▶ Obtain vehicle titles, license plates, decals, transcripts.
- ▶ Order disabled parking placards or plates.
- ▶ Recently moved? Stop in to update your address on your DMV record. At the same time you can update your voter registration address and organ donor status.
- ▶ Request a Personal Identification Number (PIN) to set up a myDMV account receive DMV notices via email or phone; conduct secure transactions on the DMV website, www.dmvNOW.com.
- ▶ Search for other state services through a Virginia Internet portal.
- ▶ And more!
