A Story of Hope in Howardsville

Thomas Reid, a long time resident of Howardsville, a small, historically black community in western Loudoun, used an outhouse for a toilet and had no running water. Thanks to the dedicated work of County staff he was put up in a trailer with a toilet and running water. The fact that he was using an outhouse and having to boil water to take a shower all these years in Loudoun County is unconscionable. I am very happy this was done before the holidays at the County's expense because he was paying higher taxes than he should have for years. Mr. Reid is very appreciative and says his sleep has improved significantly. When he took his first hot shower in the trailer, he lost track of time and was eventually forced out because the water temperature started dropping. He laughed and danced in his chair as he mimicked how he tried rinsing off the soap under the cold water. I love being Chair everyday, but this heartwarming story makes me really love being Chair.

To prevent this from happening to others, I made a motion that was approved unanimously at the December 3rd Board business meeting to field verify the location of outhouses or privies in Loudoun County where little information is available and identify solutions to eliminate these outhouses or privies. We need to find out if there are any more people who need running water and septic systems.

The Board also approved plans for the new community wastewater treatment system in Howardsville in April. The \$1.47 million project remains in the design phase, with construction beginning as early as next year. This system will expand the service district for the Willisville community wastewater treatment system developed in 2007.

2nd Amendment and Discharge of Firearms

At the December 11th Public Hearing, we approved the following amended language to the Codified Ordinances of Loudoun County Section 684.03(d), "the discharge of firearms is prohibited within 100 yards of a building with a current occupancy permit and/or regularly occupied structure, unless the owner or authorized agent has given permission." We also created a new Section 684.03(e) in the Codified Ordinances of Loudoun County stating, "The discharge of firearms for recreational or target shooting purposes shall be conducted in such a manner as to ensure that projectiles do not leave the boundaries of the property or parcel upon which the shooting is occurring, unless permission to do so has been granted by the owner of the property or parcel upon which the projectile lands. A projectile leaving the boundaries of the property or parcel shall be prima facie evidence of a violation of this section."

I supported the discharge of firearms amendments to the codified ordinance because I don't think rounds should leave people's property. The Board also requested staff provide information to the public on the ordinance changes and the importance of using firearms safely.

Recycling

At the December 3rd meeting, I moved that the Board allocate \$218,000 from the FY 2020 uses to establish a glass only recycling program at the nine County centers and authorize one full time staffer in the Department of General Services to manage the program. This motion provides residents the opportunity to recycle glass separately. Currently, our drop off centers collect glass bottles and jars, plastic beverage containers, metal cans, paper and cardboard via a "single stream" collection where materials are mixed. The concern is that the glass contaminates the other materials. This program will improve our ability to separate recyclables and take the glass to Fairfax County where it will be crushed and repurposed. An important component will be an education campaign to let residents know glass recycling is now available at the County centers.

Children's Science Center

At the December 3rd Board business meeting, Loudoun County entered into a triparty Memorandum of Agreement with the Children's Science Center (501(c)3 non-profit organization) and the Science Museum of Virginia regarding the development and operation of the Northern Virginia Science Center. The County will contribute \$15 million towards the design, construction and installation of the fixed exhibits within the museum.

The Children's Science Center was founded to address the need for an interactive science center in Northern Virginia, the largest metro area in the country without such a resource. Today the Center serves over 70,000 visitors a year at its interim site at the Fair Oaks Mall. The current design will include 50,000 square feet with plans to expand up to 70,000 square feet in the Kincora development, which sits at the intersection of Route 7 and Route 28.

A Children's Science Center in Loudoun will be an enormous asset to not just our County, but the entire region. We are fortunate that so many have come together to make this vision a reality. We still have a long way to go but as of now we're on track to start design. The next step will be to discuss permanent exhibits. What better place for a new Children's Science Center to call home?



Regulation of Massage Establishments

At the December 3rd Board business meeting, we unanimously approved drafting amendments to the Codified Ordinances of Loudoun County to regulate massage establishments. The Northern Virginia Human Trafficking Initiative believes there are close to 100 illicit establishments in Northern Virginia. It is unfortunate on so many levels.

In the New Year, I will be hiring a new Legislative Aid for Behavioral and Community Health, Sarah Tuggle. She will be working with our faith based partners and nonprofits on this issue and other issues in January. Please help me welcome her to my staff.

Investing in Transportation

Riverside Parkway

On December 12th, we celebrated the breaking of ground for the construction of the four-lane, divided road segment of Riverside Parkway, between Lexington Drive and Loudoun County Parkway. Constructing this segment allowed for the removal of the traffic signal and the intersection at Lexington Drive and Route 7. Direct connections at Route 7 will be made at Ashburn Village Blvd and Loudoun County Parkway. Construction of this segment of Riverside Parkway is expected to be completed by the fall of 2021.

Ashburn Road Sidewalk Project

On December 13th, we celebrated the start of construction of the Ashburn Road sidewalk project, which will improve pedestrian access and safety with the construction of 1,100 feet of sidewalk on the east side of Ashburn Road between Partlow Road and the W&OD Trail. This project includes the construction of a sidewalk, curb and gutter, improved drainage and signage. Curb ramps and crosswalks installed along this segment of Ashburn Road will comply with the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act, providing an accessible route that people with disabilities can use to safely transition from the road to the curbed sidewalk, and vice versa.



Voice for a Cause NOVA Relief Center

NOVA Relief Center's mission is to improve the quality of life for refugees and immigrants with a blanket and coat drive, and provide local support to our neighbors. It is a creation of the local governments in Northern Virginia in partnership with business and religious organizations throughout the



region. We have sent over 600,000 blankets and coats to Turkey, Lebanon, and Jordan.


