All businesses should make modifications to maintain six feet of physical distancing, increase cleaning and sanitization of high contact surfaces, and provide enhanced workplace safety measures.

Retail establishments will be allowed to operate at 50 percent occupancy, restaurant and beverage establishments may offer outdoor dining at 50 percent occupancy, personal grooming services may begin operating with one patron per service provider, and fitness centers may offer outdoor exercise services. Campgrounds may also begin taking reservations for short-term stays.

## Governor Northam Requires Face Coverings



**Effective 12:00 a.m., Friday,  
May 29, 2020**

On May 26, 2020, Governor Northam issued [Executive Order 63](#) requiring Virginians to wear face coverings in public indoor settings to help contain the spread of COVID-19.

A face covering includes anything that covers your nose and mouth, such as a mask, scarf, or bandana.

Under the Governor's executive order, any person age ten and older must wear a mask or face covering at all times while entering, exiting, traveling through, and spending time in the following public settings:

- Personal care and grooming businesses

- Essential and non-essential brick and mortar retail including grocery stores and pharmacies
- Food and beverage establishments
- Entertainment or public amusement establishments when permitted to open
- Train stations, bus stations, and on intrastate public transportation, including in waiting or congregating areas
- State and local government buildings and areas where the public accesses services
- Any indoor space shared by groups of people who may congregate within six feet of one another or who are in close proximity to each other for more than ten minutes

**Exceptions include:**

1. While eating or drinking;
2. Individuals exercising or using exercise equipment;
3. Any person who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove the face covering without assistance;
4. Any person seeking to communicate with the hearing impaired and for which the mouth needs to be visible;
5. When temporary removal of the face covering is necessary to secure government or medical services; and
6. Persons with health conditions that prohibit wearing a face covering. Nothing in this Order shall require the use of a face covering by any person for whom doing so would be contrary to his or her health or safety because of a medical condition.

## **COVID-19 Business Interruption Fund: Round 3 Details**

**Opens June 3 at Noon**

Another \$2 million was allocated from federal CARES Act funding by the Board for the COVID-19 Business Interruption Fund to support Loudoun businesses impacted by the coronavirus outbreak.

Although the fund does not open until June 3rd, you can start preparing documents now and sign-up for an e-mail reminder when the fund opens. Please visit the website through the link below.

The fund will provide 400 randomly selected applicant businesses with a \$5,000 grant.

Applicants must demonstrate the following criteria:

- Have between zero and two W-2 employees (no limit on 1099 contractors);
- Have less than \$2.5 million in gross annual receipts;
- Have at least a 25% loss in revenue that can be attributed to COVID-19;
- Be a licensed and operational for-profit business in Loudoun County, Va.
- If the applicant business received a grant from the COVID-19 Business Interruption Fund in the first or second rounds, they are not eligible to apply again.

The fund will open for applications at noon on June 3, 2020, and remain open for 72 hours, closing at noon on June 6, 2020.

All submissions will be accepted based on the time stamp that the application was received, verified by county employees, and placed into a pool, where businesses will be randomly selected until the funding has expired.

## Timeline

**Now-June 6:** You will be asked to download, complete and upload a Financial Form and an IRS W-9 Form as part of your application. You are encouraged to fill those out in advance, as they are a required part of your application. the Financial Form and IRS W-9 Form can be downloaded from the website below.

**June 3 at noon:** Applications open.

**June 6 at noon:** Applications close.

**June 4-8:** Businesses will be verified with the Commissioner of the Revenue or the towns, and must be confirmed as being in good standing with the county's jurisdictions.

**June 9-12:** A member of Loudoun County Government staff will call you to confirm application information and application number and resolve any document issues.

**June 9-18:** Applications will be vetted for eligibility and prepared for the random drawing.

**June 19:** Random drawing will be held, if needed, at the Government Center and broadcast to ensure fairness and transparency.

**June 25:** The payment process will begin between the Economic Development Authority and grant recipients.

Loudoun County will hold Free COVID-19 Testing for All Ages June 1, 2020.

This free, drive-through testing for COVID-19 will take place at Philip A. Bolen Memorial Park in Leesburg, Monday, June 1, 2020, beginning at 10:00 a.m.

Testing will end when the site reaches capacity or by 6:00 p.m. No appointments are necessary. To help reduce wait times, people who plan to attend Monday's event are strongly encouraged to complete a registration form for each person who will be receiving a test prior to arriving at the testing site.
