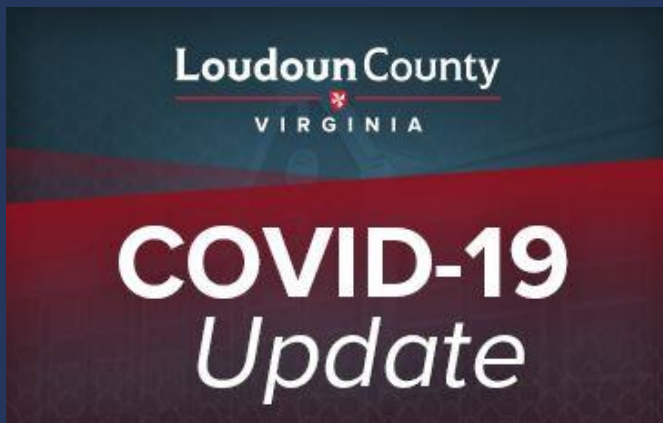

COVID-19 Updates from Dr. Goodfriend



Loudoun County Health Director Dr. David Goodfriend provided the Board of Supervisors with an update on COVID-19 during the Board's April 20, 2021, business meeting, covering the status of cases, vaccinations, testing and more.

Some key points:

- The county did see a rise in coronavirus cases shortly after spring break. Those numbers are starting to come down, but the numbers are still high considering how many people have been vaccinated.
- The presence of variants of the virus that causes COVID-19 in our region points out the importance of continuing the mitigation strategies that have worked so far.
- Everyone 16 and older who has not pre-registered for a vaccination is encouraged to register at vaccinate.virginia.gov or 1-877-829-4682.
- More pharmacies are receiving COVID-19 vaccine and are offering appointments. Information is available at vaccinefinder.org.

Statewide Phase 2



As of Sunday, April 18, the rest of Virginia has entered Phase 2 of the state's vaccination plan, which makes anyone age 16 years of age or older who lives or works in Virginia eligible to make an appointment to receive a COVID-19 vaccine.

Loudoun County entered Phase 2 on April 12 and the county will continue to require pre-registration for anyone who wishes to receive a vaccination appointment through the Loudoun County Health Department. Individuals age 16 and older who live or work in

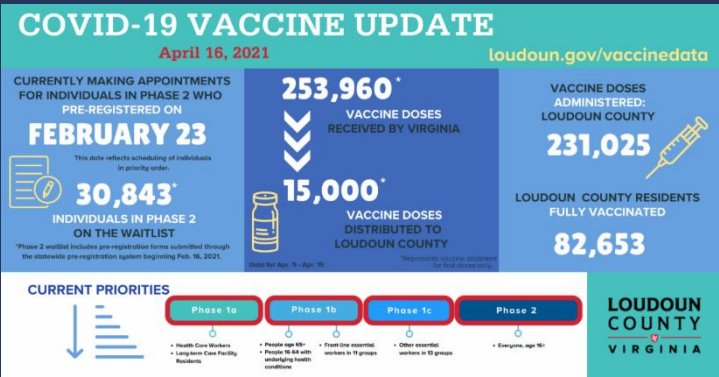
Other Ways to Get a Vaccine

At vaccinate.virginia.gov, you can also access the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's [VaccineFinder website](#), which allows you to search the map-based site for appointments at Community Vaccination Centers, pharmacies, and hospitals in the region, and make your appointment yourself online.

Weekly COVID-19 Vaccination Waitlist Update

Date Now Serving:
 Loudoun County has started offering appointments to individuals who are in Phase 2 and submitted pre-registration forms online or by phone on **February 23**.

- On April 12, Loudoun [entered Phase 2](#). With the increase in the number of people eligible for the vaccine, the date now serving has restarted to offer

appointments for Phase 2 pre-registrations submitted since February 16.

- If you are in Phase 2 and pre-registered before February 23 but have not heard from us, please ensure the email address used in your pre-registration form has not been used to pre-register anyone else for a vaccine. Our appointment scheduling system requires a unique email address for each individual who will receive a vaccine. To update the email address, go to vaccinate.virginia.gov and select "Verify and Update your Record."
- Currently, for people in the Phase 1a, 1b and 1c priority groups, the time between pre-registration and receiving an invitation to make a vaccination appointment has been shortened to a few days.

Current Waitlist: There are currently **30,843 people** in Phase 2 on the waitlist, a decrease of **2,455** from last Friday's report.

The waitlist continues to grow daily as more individuals pre-register. Anyone in Virginia can now pre-register at vaccinate.virginia.gov.

Loudoun County Schedules Free COVID-19 Testing Events through May

Loudoun County will continue to hold free, drive thru COVID-19 testing events through May. The events are scheduled for Tuesdays, 10:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m., at the following locations:

- **May 4:** Franklin Park, 17501 Franklin Park Drive, Purcellville
- **May 11:** Philip A. Bolen Memorial Park, 42405 Claudia Drive, Leesburg (Enter the park on Crosstrail Boulevard from Sycolin Road.)
- **May 18:** Cascades Library, 21030 Whitfield Place, Potomac Falls (Access the testing location in the back parking lot, near the senior center.)

- **May 25:** Dulles South Recreation & Community Center, 24950 Riding Center Drive, South Riding

In addition, the county is holding the previously scheduled COVID-19 testing event **Tuesday, April 27, 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.** at Ray Muth Sr. Memorial Park, 20971 Marblehead Drive, Ashburn.

The testing events are free and open to all. There are no age or residency requirements. No prescriptions or appointments are necessary. A person does not have to exhibit symptoms of COVID-19 to be tested. A PCR test (nasal swab) will be administered, which tests for the novel coronavirus. No antibody or rapid tests will be offered. **No COVID-19 vaccine will be available at these events.**

Hang on to Your Vaccination Card

When you get your first dose of COVID-19 vaccine, you receive a small white card with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention logo that tells you which COVID-19 vaccine you received, the date you received it and where you received it. You take the vaccination card to



your second dose appointment where the second dose is noted. That card is your tangible proof of vaccination and you don't want to lose it.

If You Lose Your Vaccination Card: You can contact the Virginia Immunization Information System by [sending an email](#), submitting an [online form](#) or calling [1-866-375-9795](tel:1-866-375-9795). If you enrolled in [v-safe](#), the smartphone-based, after-vaccination health checker following your first vaccine dose, you can also access your vaccination information through that tool.

Scam Alert: COVID-19 vaccination cards are fast becoming a target of scammers. Phony copies of the cards have been sold through online marketplaces. Individuals might use the phony cards to misrepresent their vaccination status, potentially exposing others to risk.

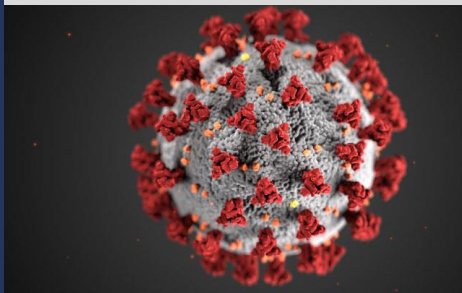
The strategic plan is designed to help the county and its partners improve housing access, quality and affordability for all families. It identifies strategies and actions to address unmet housing needs in a systematic and comprehensive way with integrated programs. The plan will also aim to create housing targets over the short term and the long term (the next five years).

The draft plan was presented to the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors at its April 6, 2021, business meeting. The Board's feedback and input from the public

will be included in the final draft plan, which is scheduled to be presented to the Board at its May 12, 2021, public hearing.
