The next Sterling community COVID-19 vaccination clinic is scheduled **Sunday, July 11, 2021, 11:00 am–6:00 pm**, at Meadowland Elementary School, 729 Sugarland Run, Sterling.

The event will offer the 2-dose Pfizer vaccine to anyone 12 and older. A second dose event will be held on **Sunday, August 1st at Meadowland Elementary School.**

If you would like to make an appointment, follow the instructions below:

1. Visit the [Medspack appointment website](#)
2. Enter your email address in the email field.
3. Under "For which dose of COVID-19 vaccine do you want to sign up?" select "First and second dose."
4. Under "Choose Location," select your preferred location.
5. Select a first and second dose time slot.
6. Fill out the required information on the form.

7. In the insurance information fields please enter insurance information such as BIN number, PCN, Group and/or ID number. If insurance information is unavailable, please type NA in the box.
8. Once you complete the immunization questionnaire, you will be asked to sign twice.
9. Press the submit button at the bottom, wait for the success message page to appear and check your email provided in the form to view your confirmation.
10. Please bring or show your confirmation email on the day of your vaccination.



Loudoun to Hold Virtual Public Meeting July 12th on Route 7 Corridor Study

Loudoun County is hosting an online meeting to gain input from the public on the Route 7 corridor study on **Monday, July 12, 2021, from 6:00 – 7:00 p.m.** The limits of the draft study, completed in February 2021, were from Route 28 to the Fairfax County line.

The public meeting will examine current safety and traffic operations as well as travel forecasting and traffic operations for proposed future alternatives to the existing conditions on the Route 7 corridor. Members of the public are invited to join the virtual meeting to learn about the proposed alternatives and areas along the corridor that need attention and to ask questions about the corridor.

VDH Reminds Virginians of Important Role of Masks to Protect Against COVID-19



The Virginia Department of Health reminds Virginians that while vaccination is the best defense against COVID-19, masks are also an important tool to protect yourself and others.

Public health officials encourage Virginians to continue to wear masks to

help prevent the spread of COVID-19 as recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Masks may be especially important now that recent cases of the “Delta variant” (B.1.617.2) have been identified in Virginia. This variant can spread more easily and might cause more severe illness than others. Although current COVID-19 vaccines appear to be effective against the Delta variant, additional mitigation measures (such as wearing masks, keeping distance from others, washing hands frequently, and cleaning surfaces) help lower risk even more.

New COVID-19 Testing Tool

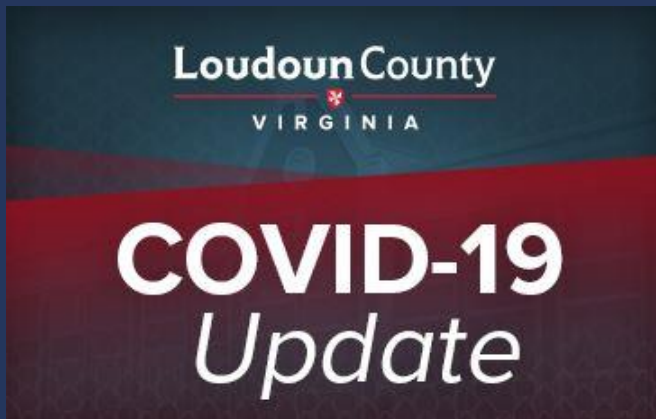
The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has introduced the web-based [COVID-19 Viral Testing Tool](#).

County Launches Virtual Line for Community Development In-Person Services at Government Center

Loudoun County has launched a new online system that allows people who are seeking in-person services from the county's community development departments to make an appointment or to get in a virtual line from anywhere.

The new system is designed to improve the experience for the county's

customers at the Government Center in Leesburg through the added convenience of the new system, which allows people to reduce or eliminate physically waiting in line for services.

The county has launched the "Qless" system for customers who plan to visit the Departments of [Building and Development](#), [Planning and Zoning](#), and Health (for [Environmental Health Services](#) and Vital Records), and the [Office of Mapping and Geographic Information](#). These departments—commonly referred to as the community development departments—provide a broad range of online and in-person services, such as permitting, review of land development plans and applications, inspections, enforcement of regulations, and data and mapping services.

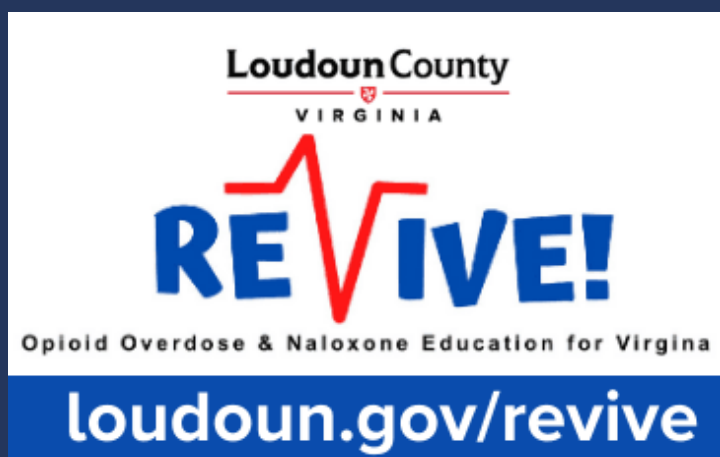

Learn How to Reverse an Opioid Overdose July 8



Space is available in an upcoming Revive! class, Loudoun County's virtual opioid overdose reversal training.

"REVIVE!" is the Opioid Overdose and Naloxone Education program for the Commonwealth of Virginia. the Loudoun County Department of Mental Health, Substance Abuse

and Developmental Services (MHSADS), the Loudoun County Community Services Board and the Virginia Department of Health sponsor the local training sessions.

Anyone who uses opioids or knows someone who does is encouraged to take the class to learn how to recognize and respond to an opioid overdose.

The Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Services contracted with PROS Consulting, Inc. in 2020 for a master plan with the goal of creating an environment for providing exceptional facilities and recreational opportunities to enhance county residents' health and well-being. The plan has been completed and was approved by the Board of Supervisors June 15, 2021.

The July workshop will present an overview of findings, recommendations and where opportunities for improvement will be focused for the next 10 years.

**REMINDER: Virginians Can Enroll in 2021
Health Insurance Marketplace Through August
15**



Virginians who buy health insurance through the Healthcare Marketplace at [HealthCare.gov](https://www.healthcare.gov) may now qualify for financial help with those premiums. Virginians who already receive financial help could be eligible for additional savings on health insurance coverage following Congress' passage of the American Rescue Plan of 2021 (ARP).

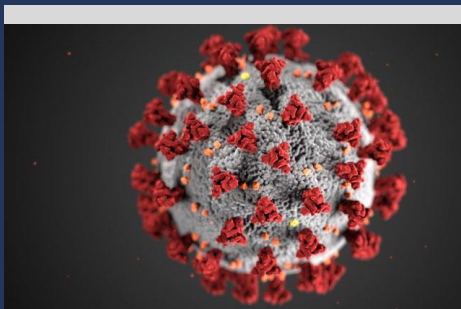
Approximately 77,000 uninsured Virginians are newly eligible for tax credits that reduce the cost of their health insurance premiums. An estimated four out of five enrollees may

be able to find a plan for \$10 or less per month with these tax credits. A family of four with household income of \$90,000 could see premiums reduced by approximately \$200 per month.

Following a Special Enrollment Period that began earlier this year, enrollment is now open through August 15 – no qualifying life event is necessary. If you already are covered through the [Marketplace](#), you will need to re-enroll to take advantage of the new savings.
