Loudoun County has scheduled a COVID-19 testing event on Friday, February 4, 2022, at [Claude Moore Park, 46150 Loudoun Park Lane, Sterling](#). Testing is scheduled from 10:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m., but may begin early to mitigate traffic impacts and may close early if capacity is reached.

The testing event is free and open to all. There are no age or residency requirements. No prescriptions or appointments are necessary. A person does not have to exhibit symptoms of COVID-19 to be tested. A PCR test (nasal swab) will be administered, which tests for the novel coronavirus. No antibody or rapid tests will be offered. No COVID-19 vaccine will be available at these events.

The forms should be filled out and submitted online prior to the test. For anyone who cannot submit the forms online, paper forms will also be available at the testing site.

Submitting the form in advance is not an appointment or a guarantee for a test. Given current demand, the site may close when it reaches capacity.

The form is required and asks for general information including name, date of birth, address, phone number. The information is kept private.

Supplemental Real Estate and Personal Property Tax Deadline is February 7, 2022

Loudoun County Treasurer H. Roger Zurn Jr. reminds taxpayers that the deadline for payment of supplemental real estate and personal property taxes is **Monday, February 7, 2022**.

Payments received or postmarked after February 7, will incur a 10% late payment penalty. Additional interest at the rate of 10% per annum will be assessed. In addition to the late payment penalty for personal property taxes, if the taxes remain unpaid for 60 days after the original payment due date, the taxpayer will incur an additional 15% penalty of the total amount due. The due date will not be extended for bills where assessment questions have been filed with the Board of Equalization.

Payments can be made using electronic check (eCheck), VISA, MasterCard, American Express or Discover. Please note that there is a convenience fee added to credit card transactions. There is no fee for eCheck. For safety and convenience, taxpayers are encouraged to make payments online.

COVID-19 Vaccine Clinic Open for Walk-Ins

Loudoun County is now offering walk-in service at the COVID-19 vaccination clinic, located at Dulles Town Center, 21090 Dulles Town Circle in Sterling.

Vaccinations are available on a first-come, first-served basis during the COVID-19 vaccination clinic's scheduled hours of operation; no appointment

is necessary.

The clinic is open on the following schedule:

- Tuesdays: 1:00 – 7:00 p.m.
- Fridays: 9:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.
- Saturdays: 9:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.

Appointments for COVID-19 vaccine are also still available. Appointments can be [scheduled anytime online](#).

Vaccination Eligibility

The following groups are currently eligible for COVID-19 vaccine:

- First and Second Doses: People ages 5 and older who have not yet received their first and/or second dose of COVID-19 vaccine.

Boosters:

- People ages 18 and older who received the second in a two-dose series of Pfizer or Moderna vaccine at least five months ago or who received the J&J vaccine at least two months ago.
 - 'Mix and Match' Boosters: Any of the three approved vaccines may be used as a booster, regardless of the product used in the initial vaccine series. For example, if someone's primary series was Pfizer or Moderna, they are eligible for Moderna, Pfizer or J&J vaccine as a booster after five months. Someone who received the one-dose J&J vaccine could receive any vaccine as a booster after two months.

- Children 12 and older who received their second in a two-dose series of Pfizer vaccine at least five months ago.

How to Prepare Your Loudoun Business for the Disposable Plastic Bag Tax

Beginning on July 1, 2022, certain Loudoun County businesses must collect a tax of five cents (\$0.05) for each disposable plastic bag provided to customers, whether or not those bags are provided free of charge.



To compensate for the cost of collecting, accounting for, and remitting the tax, retailers are permitted to keep a portion of the tax collected, accounting for the discount in the form of a deduction when submitting their tax return.

What types of businesses are impacted?

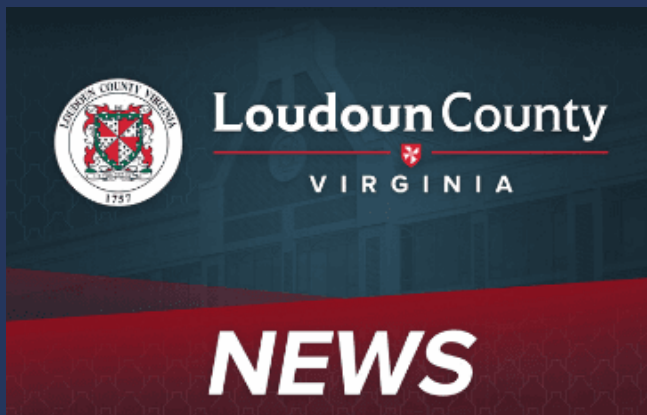
The tax must be collected by Loudoun County grocery stores, convenience stores and drugstores from customers who make in-store purchases, to-go purchases, delivery purchases, and curbside pick-up purchases from their establishments. The guidelines for the ordinance defines these terms as:

- **Grocery store** – an establishment that has an enclosed room in a permanent structure and that sells food and other items intended for human consumption, including a variety of ingredients commonly used in the preparation of meals (does not include food banks, farmers markets, or mobile food units).
- **Drugstore** – an establishment that sells medicines prepared by a licensed pharmacist pursuant to prescription and other medicines and items for home and general use.
- **Convenience store** – an establishment that (i) has an enclosed room in a permanent structure where stock is displayed and offered

for sale and (ii) maintains an inventory of edible items intended for human consumption consisting of a variety of such items of the types normally sold in grocery stores.

2022 Loudoun Real Estate Assessments Available Online



Loudoun County Commissioner of the Revenue Robert S. Wertz Jr. announces that Loudoun County real estate assessments for tax year 2022 are now available online

at loudoun.gov/parceldatabase. Printed assessment notices will be mailed to property owners the week of February 7, 2022.

These assessment notices, which are not tax bills, communicate to property owners the value of their real property as of January 1, 2022, and are reflective of real estate market activity that occurred during 2021. The assessed value in conjunction with the tax rate to be set by the Board of Supervisors in April provides the basis for real estate tax bills that will be due on June 6 and December 5.

Property owners who believe their assessments are incorrect may file an Application for Review with the Commissioner online at loudoun.gov/reaa by March 7, 2022. Thereafter, appeals may be made to the Board of Equalization until June 1.

Property owners may communicate with their respective appraiser whose name and contact information is listed on the assessment notice.

REMINDER: Public Comment Invited as Board Refers Three Draft Redistricting Plans for Review

Members of the public are now able to view and comment on three draft local redistricting plans that have been selected by the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors for further evaluation and refinement.


On January 18, 2022, the Board voted to move these three plans to the next phase of consideration in the county's local redistricting process.

Members of the public can review these plans through an [online viewer](#), which allows users to compare plans to one another and evaluate how each plan addresses the Board of Supervisors' adopted 2021 redistricting guidelines, which are available at [loudoun.gov/redistricting](#).

A [comment form](#) can be used to provide feedback on specific plans or submit general comments about the redistricting process.

Following the county staff's analysis, the Board is scheduled to review the three plans again at its February 15 business meeting and select a single redistricting plan in March that will be forwarded to a subsequent public hearing.

Loudoun County offers ongoing mental health education and substance abuse prevention programs. All programs are free, but registration is required, and seats are limited.

The schedule of upcoming classes for February 2022 is as follows:

Adverse Childhood Experiences Training

The [Adverse Childhood Experiences](#) training is a one-hour educational program that aims to raise awareness of Adverse Childhood Experiences, or ACEs. ACEs are potentially traumatic events that occur in childhood. ACEs are linked to chronic health problems, mental illness and substance use problems in adulthood.

- February 15: 6:00 - 7:30 p.m.

Mental Health First Aid

[Mental Health First Aid](#) offers training that teaches people how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental illness and substance use disorders. The training also teaches the skills that someone needs to reach out and provide initial help and support to someone who may be developing a mental health or substance use problem or experiencing a crisis.

The next trainings are:

- Adult Mental Health First Aid: February 16 & 17: 6:00 - 9:00 p.m. each day.
- Youth Mental Health First Aid: February 23 & 24: 1:00 - 4:00 p.m. each day

Opioid Overdose Reversal

Loudoun County offers local training sessions of [REVIVE!](#), the opioid overdose and naloxone education program for the Commonwealth of Virginia. Anyone who uses opioids or knows someone who is using opioids is encouraged to attend. The virtual sessions last about one hour.

Suicide Prevention Training

The [Question Persuade Refer](#) program offers training to help people recognize the warning signs of a suicide crisis and how to refer someone for professional help. The suicide prevention training teaches three simple steps that anyone can learn to help save a life from suicide; question, persuade and refer. The virtual training presentation lasts about one hour. Discussion and practice opportunities will follow the presentation.

Comments Sought on Revised Stormwater Management Plan for Reducing Pollutants

Loudoun County is seeking public comments on a revised draft plan for reducing pollutants entering the Chesapeake Bay.

The updated “Phase II Chesapeake Bay TMDL Action Plan” outlines ways that the county intends to meet requirements for reducing the quantity of pollutants entering the Chesapeake Bay via the county’s municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4). The county operates the MS4 under a permit from the state of Virginia and the permit requires the development and implementation of action plans for impaired waterways. TMDL refers to the allowed “Total Maximum Daily Load” of the pollutants allowed to enter a water body without violating water quality standards.

The revised plan provides an update on the actions that the county has achieved to date and outlines projects that are planned for the future.

The updated draft plan is posted online at loudoun.gov/stormwater. **The deadline to submit comments on the plan is Friday, February 18, 2022.** Comments can be directed to the Stormwater Management Program by [email](#) or by phone at [703-777-0117](tel:703-777-0117).

Loudoun Commissioner of the Revenue Robert S. Wertz Jr. is mailing notification of 2022 personal property filing requirements to all vehicle owners currently on the county's tax rolls. Personal property includes automobiles, trucks, motorcycles, campers, trailers, boats, motorhomes, aircraft, and mobile homes.

Residents will soon begin receiving notices in the mail with an account number and instructions that they will use to review and update their personal property tax records for the 2022 tax year. The online process allows residents to review and update information on the more than 375,000 vehicles now located in the county.

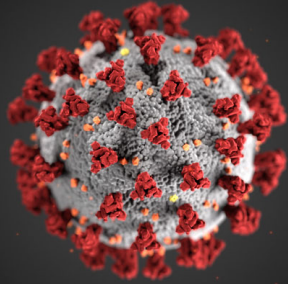
Residents can access their personal property information online at loudoun.gov/efile utilizing their social security or tax identification number, mailing address ZIP code and unique account number, which is displayed on the notice. Residents may receive more than one notice depending on how their property is owned or registered.

Residents should report corrections, an address change, the sale or disposal of a vehicle, or unusually high mileage as well as unrepaired body damage or serious mechanical defect since these factors may affect the property's valuation or the number of months a vehicle is taxed in the county.

The commissioner requests that all changes be submitted **by February 15, 2022**, to assist in establishing accurate assessments for the 2022 tax year.
