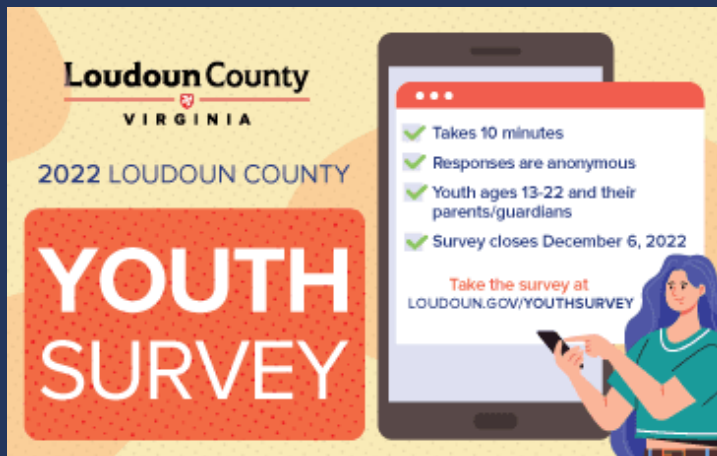

## Loudoun County Opens Survey of Youth & Parents to Help Young People Thrive



The Loudoun County Advisory Commission on Youth (ACOY) is conducting a survey to gather information that will help inform county leaders when making decisions about services and programs designed to meet the needs of young people in the community.

The survey is intended for youth in Loudoun County ages 13-22 and their parents or guardians. The survey consists of 25 questions and is expected to take about ten minutes to complete. The survey covers four topic areas:

- Activities and interests.
- Drug and alcohol use.
- Mental health and stress management.
- Online access and activity.

Responses are anonymous. Participants are not required to provide any individually identifying information such as their name, home address, birth date, IP address, etc.

The survey is open through Tuesday, December 6, 2022. Information gathered from the survey will be used to inform ACOY's "State of Loudoun Youth" annual report to the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors.

This survey was first opened in 2019 as part of the Board of Supervisors' initiatives involving youth, which, in part, aim to ensure there are effective programs and services available to help Loudoun's youth thrive. The survey is intended to be an annual feedback mechanism to help county leaders stay current on trends in youth behaviors, interests and needs.

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## Continue Making Your Voice Heard: Park View Renovation Project

I would like to acknowledge and thank all the students, parents, educators, and community members and leaders who have been involved in the ongoing fight regarding the state of Park View High School. Your efforts have not gone unnoticed and have



been instrumental in advocating for the Park View community and driving important conversations at the policy level.

Loudoun County Public Schools Superintendent, Dr. Scott Ziegler, recently mentioned that he submitted the Park View item as part of his budget requests for the upcoming budget season; however, the work needed to achieve the results that the community has called for repeatedly is not complete. The next step is to gather support of the Loudoun County School Board because the School Board still needs to approve the project and officially vote to include it into the School System's Capital Improvement Program. From there, the project would eventually make its way to the Board of Supervisors.

I call on the community to continue making their voices heard by signing up to speak during Public Comment periods at upcoming School Board meetings, as well as expressing your opinions and concerns to the full School Board in writing.

## **Sterling Offices of Loudoun Commissioner of the Revenue, Treasurer Moving**



The Sterling offices of the Loudoun County Commissioner of the Revenue and Treasurer are moving out of the county's Eastern Loudoun Service Center to another building that is located approximately one-half mile away in the same Sterling office park.

Beginning **Monday, November 14, 2022**, the two offices will provide services at **46000 Center Oak Plaza in Sterling**.

The offices of the Commissioner of the Revenue and Treasurer will offer the same in-person services at the new location as they offer at the current location, including — but not limited to — accepting tax payments and issuing business licenses.

The Commissioner of the Revenue's Office is responsible for assessing real estate and personal property and administering business license taxes. The office also administers the county's land use assessment program, tax relief for persons 65 or older or with disabilities, and tax exemptions for revitalized real estate, solar equipment, and surviving spouses of members of the armed forces killed in action. 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## Supervisors Adopt Public Input Procedures for Non-English Speakers

During its October 18, 2022, meeting, the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors adopted changes to the Rules of Order that formalized the procedures for the translation of public input by non-English speakers during board meetings. In addition, the Board authorized advance online sign-up for all public speakers.



In an effort to ensure each speaker who appears before the Board has equal time while also assuring that members of the Board and the public can understand input from non-English speakers, the Board opted to continue the practice of providing consecutive interpretation. The consecutive interpretation process relies on an interpreter who is either present in the meeting room or participating in the meeting virtually and translates spoken words into English in real time. The Board's updated rules indicate that the additional time required for translations will not count against a speaker's total allotted time for public input or count against the total time allowed for public input.

The Board [evaluated a number of translation options](#), how peer jurisdictions in the region manage public input by non-English speakers, and feedback from the public before choosing to maintain the existing practice of consecutive interpretation. Members of the public may provide input to the Board of Supervisors any time by email and phone, as well as in person or virtually during Board meetings.

Any member of the public who would like to request an interpreter to be present at a Board meeting to translate their public input may do so at least 48 hours in advance of a meeting. Procuring an interpreter for less frequently spoken languages may require additional time.

The Board of Supervisors encourages residents to sign up to speak in advance of meetings. On October 18, the Board also approved a new online method for



advance sign-up. In the coming weeks, the county will post an online form for residents who wish to speak at an upcoming Board meeting. The form will be easily translated into more than 100 languages using the county's website tools. Residents may also call to sign up to speak.

## Loudoun County Energy Strategy Update



During its October 18, 2022, meeting, the Board of Supervisors reviewed ongoing efforts to update and implement the Loudoun County Energy Strategy. The plan seeks to contribute to Virginia's statewide goal of reducing greenhouse gas emissions to net zero by 2045.

The Board considered detailed information, such as the sources of most greenhouse gas emissions in Loudoun, including sources associated with commercial entities, transportation and residential properties. Staff also provided a potential framework for action centered on energy efficient projects, renewable energy development and stimulating communitywide action.

Proposed actions the Board could consider in the coming years include on-site solar located on county-owned property, geothermal heating and cooling, energy retrofits on county-owned buildings, zero emission by county fleet vehicles, and solid waste diversion from the Loudoun County landfill through expanded recycling and composting. To inform their work, the members of the Board also discussed ideas for engaging the broader community, including the data center industry, the Loudoun County Chamber of Commerce and homeowners associations. In addition, the county supports a focus on energy equity.

Research provided by the county's consultant demonstrated that if all the quantitative and qualitative actions were adopted by 2045, the county could potentially reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 60 percent from 2018 levels. The final draft Energy Strategy update is expected to be presented to the Board of Supervisors by the end of the year.

## **Board to Consider Amendments Related to Airport Impact Overlay District November 9**

At its November 9, 2022, public hearing, the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors will consider proposed changes to the county's [Comprehensive Plan, Zoning Ordinance](#) and zoning map that would amend the county's policies and zoning regulations pertaining to land

development in areas where airport noise impacts are known to occur. Loudoun County is mailing more than 47,000 [letters \(PDF\)](#) and [informational flyers \(PDF\)](#) to potentially impacted property owners to inform them of the upcoming public hearing. Residents who live in the vicinity of Dulles International Airport can expect to begin receiving the notices in their mailboxes in the coming days.

The Airport Impact Overlay District (AIOD) is a zoning designation that includes properties where airport noise at specified levels is anticipated. Properties within the AIOD are subject to certain land use regulations. The current overlay district



was implemented by the Board of Supervisors in the early 1990s to prevent residential development in areas that would be affected by aircraft noise and to mitigate impacts to prospective homebuyers.

### **Next Steps**

Following the Board of Supervisors' public hearing, the Board will consider any action it may take to update the county's comprehensive plan policies and zoning regulations. The Board may choose to adopt or decline to adopt the proposed updates. The Board may also choose to forward the discussion on the proposed updates to a future meeting for additional work and discussion.

Loudoun County offers ongoing mental health education and substance abuse prevention programs. All programs are free, but registration is required, and seats are limited.

The schedule of upcoming classes for November and

December 2022 is as follows:

### **Adverse Childhood Experiences Training**

The [Adverse Childhood Experiences](#) training is a one-hour educational program that aims to raise awareness of Adverse Childhood Experiences, or ACEs. ACEs are potentially traumatic events that occur in childhood. ACEs are linked to chronic health problems, mental illness and substance use problems in adulthood.

- November 16, 2022, 6:00 – 7:30 p.m.
- December 7, 2022, 6:00 – 7:30 p.m.

### **Mental Health First Aid**

[Mental Health First Aid](#) offers training that teaches people how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental illness and substance use disorders. The training also teaches the skills that someone needs to reach out and provide initial help and support to someone who may be developing a mental health or substance use problem or experiencing a crisis. There are two versions of the program, a general adult program and a program for adults who interact with youth. The trainings are usually held over a two-day period, with the class lasting for about three hours each day.

The next training of Adult Mental Health First Aid will be held:

- November 14 & 15, 2022, 9:00 a.m. – 1:30 p.m. each day. The in-person training will be at the Loudoun County Department of Mental Health, Substance Abuse and Developmental Services office at 21641 Ridgetop Circle, Sterling, Lucketts Room.
- December 15 & 16, 2022, 9:00 a.m. – 1:30 p.m. each day. The in-person training will be at the Loudoun County Department of Mental Health, Substance Abuse and Developmental Services office at 906 Trailview Boulevard SE, Leesburg, Aspen Room.

The next training of Youth Mental Health First Aid will be held:

- December 8 & 9, 2022, 9:00 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. each day. The in-person training will be at the Loudoun County Department of Mental Health, Substance Abuse and Developmental Services office at 21641 Ridgetop Circle, Sterling, Lucketts Room.

### **Opioid Overdose Reversal**

[REVIVE!](#) is the opioid overdose and naloxone education program for the Commonwealth of Virginia. The training is free and anyone who uses opioids or knows someone who is using opioids is encouraged to attend a training. Loudoun County offers two versions of the program - Rapid REVIVE! and Virtual REVIVE!

The virtual training presentation lasts about one hour. Discussion and practice opportunities will follow the presentation.

There is a limit of five items per vehicle. Fees will be charged for televisions, computer monitors, and hard drive destruction services (upon request). Only credit cards will be accepted; no cash, no checks.

### **Items Accepted**

- Typical electronics that will be accepted: Televisions, desktop computers, computer monitors, laptops, servers, mainframes, circuit boards, hard drives, modems, printers, fax machines,

scanners, copiers, network cables, power cables, extension cords, electrical wire, holiday lights, uninterruptible power supply (UPS), surge protectors, answering machines, microwave ovens, calculators, iPhones, smartphones, desk phones, pagers, stereo and video receivers, DVR/CD/DVD/VHS players, video game consoles, cables, stereo speakers, radios, small household appliances such as vacuum cleaners, toaster ovens, coffee makers, blenders, hair dryers, curling irons and clothes irons.

#### Number of Items Accepted

- There is a limit of five items per vehicle. A 12" x 12" x 12" box or equivalent size container filled with smaller items such as computer mice, cables, phones, cameras, etc. will be considered one item.

#### Items Not Accepted

- Electronics that will not be accepted include household appliances such as refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners, stoves, washers and dryers, fluorescent light bulbs, smoke alarms, mercury thermostats, household batteries and vehicle batteries, ballasts, light bulbs, smoke detectors, equipment that contains chemicals, asbestos, radioactive components, or liquid fuels, microwave glass plates, PCBs, aerosols and equipment that contains mercury.

#### Hard Drive Destruction

- On-site and off-site hard drive destruction will be provided upon request for a fee.

#### Fees: Credit Card Payment Only; No Cash or Checks

- \$10 per television (Does not include console or projection TVs).
- \$50 per console television or projection TV (Console TVs include any with wooden console or paneling).
- \$10 per computer monitor (Does not include laptop computers).
- \$4.50 per computer hard drive for on-site shredding upon request (Hard drive must be removed from computer prior to event.)
- \$20 per computer hard drive for on-site shredding upon request (If hard drive is not removed from computer prior to the event).
- \$10 per hard drive for off-site shredding (iphones and tablets only), upon request.
