6. Live and/or work or own or operate a business in Loudoun County

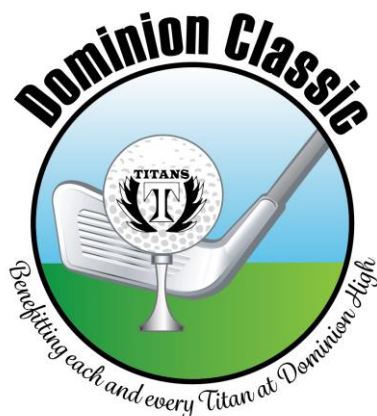

Construction Happening on Sterling Boulevard: Loudoun Water Main's Phase 2 - Progress Update



This Progress Schedule Update reports on construction activities that are related to Loudoun Water's Sterling Boulevard Water Main.

The Sterling Boulevard Water Main work is depicted in the two pictures to the left (see above). The left picture shows the limited construction area that is just south of W. Laurel Avenue on the west side of N. Sterling Boulevard. This construction includes the installation of water pipes and water supply valves inside an underground vault. The right picture shows the alignment in blue of the Sterling Boulevard Water Main. Construction activities include the installation of this water pipe and related piping fixtures. A general construction schedule, showing activities for each numbered area in the pictures, is provided within the table on the next page and will be updated monthly as minor changes to the construction schedule will occur.

The prime Contractor performing the work is Garney Companies, Inc. Pipe has been installed in areas 3, 4, 6, and 8 - approximately 2,400 feet of a total of 7,500 feet to install. Area 8 is planned for paving in May.

May will focus on installing the piping and vault in area 1, on boring pipe under the W&OD Trail (area 9), and on boring pipe under Greenthorpe Avenue (area 7). Additional work in May will either occur at the north and south edge of area 7 or within area 10.

Signs are posted and controls installed to route traffic around the construction. Efforts will be made to minimize traffic impacts as much as practical. Detours will be provided for pedestrian traffic in front of Sterling Middle School during construction across that property frontage this summer.

Please use caution when walking or operating vehicles in and around the area for your safety and safety of others. Full restorations of all affected areas, including paving and sidewalk work, will occur between September and November 2016.

May is Lyme Disease Awareness Month in Loudoun County

The Loudoun County Board of Supervisors has declared May as "Lyme Disease Awareness Month" in Loudoun. The proclamation coincides with the arrival of warm weather and the resulting increase in opportunities for tick-borne diseases.

The Board's proclamation points out that in 2015, 209 Lyme disease cases were reported in Loudoun County, an increase from 192 cases in 2014, but a decrease from the 219 cases in 2012 and 261 cases in 2011. The proclamation also notes that the Loudoun Lyme Disease Commission has worked to implement the 10-Point Plan to Mitigate Lyme Disease in Loudoun County adopted by the Board of Supervisors in 2012.

People can decrease their risk of acquiring Lyme and other tick-borne diseases when spending time in tick habitats by taking a bath or shower as soon as possible after coming indoors; conducting a tick check on themselves and their children upon return from potentially tick-infested areas and promptly removing any ticks; wearing light-colored clothing so that ticks are easier to see and remove; tucking pant legs into socks or boots; tucking shirts into pants; and wearing long-sleeved shirts buttoned to the wrist; and applying tick repellent to exposed areas of the body and to clothing that may come into contact with grass or brush.

Zika Response Plan--Health Department Encourages Public to Guard against Zika

The Board of Supervisors unanimously approved the Loudoun County Zika Virus Response Plan Tuesday. In addition, the Board appropriated a contingency fund of \$100,000 for mosquito abatement. The fund would be used for targeted mosquito control efforts that are recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) in some circumstances, such as confirmed instances in which mosquitoes in Loudoun County transmit Zika virus from an infected person to others within the community.

The Zika Response Plan provides Zika-related prevention, response and mitigation actions for the community. These steps include preparedness; public education and outreach, particularly to pregnant women; disease surveillance and testing; and mosquito control activities.

Simple steps to follow:

- **Prevent Mosquito Bites** - cover exposed skin and use EPA-registered insect repellent.

- **Eliminate Mosquito Breeding Sites Around Your Home** - Since Asian tiger mosquitoes reproduce in water, reduce amount of standing water in or around home.

Klancher was first appointed to the Loudoun County Planning Commission in January 2004 and served through 2016. His tenure included a three-year term as chairman. The Planning Commission provides recommendations to the Board of Supervisors on issues concerning land development ordinances, comprehensive planning, future land use policies, and the Capital Improvements Program. He had helped advise the Board on more than 750 land use applications. He will be greatly missed in Loudoun County. May he rest in peace.
