



## The Comp. Plan, Sanitation BMI, and the Annual Job Fair

Heading into June, the Board will look toward concluding discussions on the Comprehensive Plan at the June 20<sup>th</sup> Business meeting, after approximately 10 public hearings and work sessions over the last few months. My goal will continue to be establishing a blueprint that will not only sustainably guide the way Sterling and Loudoun County will look and feel over the next few years, but will lay the foundation for regularly revisiting and revamping the County's planning every 5 years as Loudoun continues to grow and evolve.



I am continuing to push for my Board Member Initiative to improve trash collection services in Sterling and the County overall. Last month, the Board unanimously passed my resolution to direct staff to prepare an information item exploring the creation and implementation of sanitary districts in Loudoun County. Sanitary districts, like trash services provided by a HOA, would be self-funded by payments from participants.

I held my annual job fair on Saturday, June 1st at the Claude Moore Recreation and Community Center. Thanks to a partnership with INMED Partnership and Crossroads Jobs, as well as the Loudoun County Workforce Resource Center, it went very well. Within a two-hour window, roughly 150 individuals attended and engaged with over 40 companies that were registered as vendors. ## Revive: Opioid Overdose Reversal Training

Loudoun County continues to host training sessions on how to recognize and respond to an opioid overdose. The next Revive! sessions are scheduled for:

- Thursday, June 27, 2019
- Thursday, July 25, 2019



All classes will be held from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. at the offices of the Loudoun County Department of Mental Health, Substance Abuse and Developmental Services (MHSADS) at 906 Trailview Boulevard, Leesburg, VA.

The free, one-hour training covers:

- Signs of opioid overdose.
- How to respond to an opioid overdose emergency with the administration of naloxone, a drug that can be used to treat narcotic overdoses in emergency situations.
- Any registered participant completing the training will be eligible to receive free naloxone nasal spray that evening from the Loudoun County Health Department.

The training is open to the public; however, classroom space is limited and advanced registration is required. Anyone who uses opioids or knows someone who is using opioids is encouraged to attend. Pre-registration is first come, first served.
