Loudoun to Enter Phase Two of 'Reopening' Today, June 12th

Northern Virginia, including Loudoun County, will enter Phase Two of the "Forward Virginia" reopening plan beginning today, June 12th.

Phase Two increases the number of people allowed to gather in groups from 10 to 50 people; allows restaurants, breweries, wineries, etc., to offer indoor service not exceeding 50% capacity; and a host of other changes.

County Parks & Recreation Opens Centers and Summer Programs

As Loudoun County enters [Phase Two of the Forward Virginia reopening plan](#), the Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Services (PRCS) is announcing plans for reopening aquatic, community, recreation and senior centers, pools and other amenities. Adult day centers and the Franklin Park Performing and Visual Arts Center will remain closed under Phase Two.



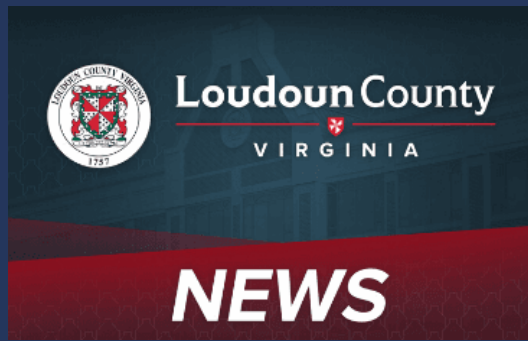
*****The following services and facilities will open with some restrictions and use limitations. Click the link below for more information:**

- Child care services and outdoor-only fitness programs at select community and recreation centers begin Monday, June 15.
- Athletic field allocations for affiliated sports leagues is underway, with fields opening June 15.
- Outdoor pools open June 19.
- All aquatic, community, recreation and senior centers open June 22.
- Summer camps and classes at centers and parks begin June 22.

Families registered in programs scheduled to start before June 22 will receive a refund. All PRCS programs will be modified in accordance with Phase Two guidelines, including enhanced cleaning and social distancing of 10 feet during recreational activities.

Loudoun Nonprofits & Faith-Based Organizations Encouraged to Apply for CARES Act Funding



Loudoun County is allocating \$2 million for eligible nonprofit and faith-based organizations affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The allocation is part of the federal funding made available to the county through the Commonwealth of Virginia from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act.

Based on a set list of criteria, the county will accept funding requests in three program categories:

- **Emergency Food Assistance Program**
- **COVID-19 Service Expansion Program**
- **Non-profit Service Interruption Fund**

Applications for funding requests will be available online Monday, June 15th at loudoun.gov/GrantOpportunities. The deadline to apply is 5:00 p.m., Friday, June 19, 2020.

Loudoun County Sheriff's Office Prescription Delivery Service

This is a friendly reminder that Loudoun County Sheriff's Office continues to conduct their prescription pick-up and delivery service throughout the County.

Sheriff Mike Chapman announced the prescription pick-up and delivery assistance program in April for the county's senior residents and those who are more vulnerable to Coronavirus (COVID-19).



Members of the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office, in coordination with the resident, or their family, as well as local pharmacies, pick-up prescription medications from Loudoun pharmacies and deliver the items to private residences in the county.

To participate residents must contact the LCSO at [703-777-1021](tel:703-777-1021) to request this service. Residents may call 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Deliveries will be made during normal business hours.

The service requires the resident to pre-pay for the prescription and confirm their pharmacy allows third-party pick-up for the medication. For health considerations, the LCSO cannot deliver to assisted living communities, care facilities, senior centers, or group homes.

State Corporation Commission Seeks Public Comment on Greenway Rate Hike Request



Toll Road Investors Partnership II, the company that owns the Dulles Greenway, seeks to implement a 6.0-6.8% toll rate increase each year over the next five years. In April, Loudoun County [announced its strong opposition to the proposed rate hike](#).

Loudoun County residents and businesses who want to offer comment on the proposed increase may do so by telephone during a State Corporation Commission (SCC) public hearing scheduled for Tuesday, June 30th at 10:00 am.

The hearing will be held remotely and the public can provide up to five minutes of comment by [signing up online](#), emailing sccinfo@scc.virginia.gov, or calling 804-371-9141. ***The deadline to sign up in time for the June 30th hearing is 5:00 pm Friday, June 26th.***

Beyond the June 30th public hearing, the public can provide written comments to the SCC by:

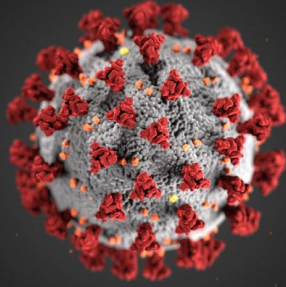
Prevention and Control.

The county continues to encourage everyone in the community to take steps to limit the spread of COVID-19, which include:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer only if soap and water are not available.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when coughing or sneezing.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
- Stay home when you are sick.
- Avoid contact with sick people.
- Avoid non-essential travel.
