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GENERAL INFORMATION

Loudoun County provides a partial real estate tax exemption to property owners for substantially rehabilitating, renovating or replacing a residential structure in designated areas. The exemption provided is intended to help prevent the deterioration and abandonment of older residential properties.

Properties must be situated within one of the following designated Residential Revitalization Districts:

- 1. Broad Run Sugarland District parcels which begin with Loudoun County Tax Map Numbers 63, 81, 82, and 95.
- 2. Dulles Arcola District parcels which begin with Loudoun County Tax Map Numbers 91, 100, and 101.
- 3. Mercer District parcels which begin with Loudoun County Tax Map Numbers 53, 54, 55, 70, 71, 72, and 89.

Loudoun County Tax Map Numbers can be ascertained by entering the property address online at www.Loudoun.gov/parceldatabase.

If the property qualifies for the exemption, then the real estate tax exemption shall become effective beginning January 1st of the next calendar year after the request for inspection is received by the Office of the Commissioner of the Revenue.

The use of the property as of the date of the application may not change to a non-residential use.

The property owner must be current in payment of all taxes, assessments, and other fees due to the County.

Loudoun County's Department of Housing offers 0-4 percent interest rate loans to qualified owners for revitalization of a primary residence in the County. Visit www.loudoun.gov/housing for more information.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Contact the residential real estate division of the Office of the Commissioner of the Revenue at 703-777-0260 or realestate@loudoun.gov to confirm whether the proposed improvements would meet the qualifications of the exemption.
- 2. Obtain all necessary building permits, if applicable.
- 3. Complete and submit a separate application for each structure **PRIOR** to beginning the proposed rehabilitation work designated by the building permits.
- 4. An inspection of the property by the Office of the Commissioner of the Revenue must occur after the completed application is received and **PRIOR** to beginning the work.
- 5. Submit the \$50.00 processing fee payable to the County of Loudoun with each application.
- 6. Complete all work within 12 months from the date the initial building permit is issued.
- 7. Submit a written request after the rehabilitation work is complete to the Office of the Commissioner of the Revenue to inspect the structure to determine exemption.
