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Loudoun County CHIP 2014 Annual Evaluation Report

December 29, 2014

Background: Loudoun County entered into the Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships (MAPP) strategic planning process in 2008 through the completion of four assessments to better identify the health needs of our community and to improve the health of those served by Loudoun County's governments, nonprofit organizations and businesses. The resulting data from these assessments were examined by the Loudoun County Health Department (LCHD) and Loudoun Health Council as part of MAPP's Action Cycle and the following four priority issues were identified in its January 2012 Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP), available at www.loudoun.gov/healthcheck:

- Increasing Access to and Timely Utilization of Health Care Services
- Ensuring a Safe, Healthy and Accessible Environment
- Improving Nutrition and Physical Activity
- Promoting Healthy Families in Healthy Communities

LCHD and the Health Council worked closely with the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors (BOS) and on July 3, 2012 the BOS endorsed the following Health Council initiatives beginning with state fiscal year 2013 (FY13), which constitute the county's improvement strategies:

- Educate Community on Steps Residents Can Take to Stay Safe From Lyme Disease
- Increase Awareness of the Importance of Drinking Safe Well Water
- Promote the Value of Children and Adults Receiving Preventive Health Services, With a Focus on Dental Health
- Reduce Gaps and Duplication of Services Among Safety Net Providers
- Promote Healthy Food Choices by Identifying and Increasing Available Community Resources

In July 2012, a work plan was developed to track the key proposed actions and activities, and to monitor progress in meeting performance measures developed in support of each CHIP initiative. This work plan was revised in October 2012 and forms the basis of annual progress reporting at the end of each calendar year, as the County works through its Improvement Plan Action Cycle. The first year of Loudoun's CHIP, reported as the Loudoun County CHIP 2012 Annual Evaluation Report (dated December 5, 2012), showed significant progress towards its implementation, with the Loudoun Health

Council particularly focused on successfully implementing the CHIP's initiatives and improvement strategies. The second year of Loudoun's CHIP (dated January 9, 2014) showed continued progress, particularly in support of Ensuring a Safe, Healthy and Accessible Environment (Issue 2) and in embarking on a new MAPP process.

Progress: The third year of Loudoun's CHIP has continued to show progress towards its implementation in several areas. Progress has been particularly strong in support of Improving Nutrition and Physical Activity (Issue 3), where the initiatives to promote healthy food choices and to increase awareness of childhood obesity have been aided by grants supporting the Loudoun Pediatric Obesity Coalition and expansion of SNAP availability at local farmers markets.

The initiative to reduce gaps and duplication of services among safety net providers has started to be addressed by the Loudoun Health Council and by key community safety net providers. County staff have presented information to the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors on the County's health care safety net.

Much of the effort this year has focused on completing the 2013 MAPP assessments, combining these results into a revised Community Health Assessment (CHA), available online at www.loudoun.gov/healthcheck, and beginning the process of revising the 2012 CHIP.

Assessment and Next Steps: During the third year of its Improvement Plan Action Cycle, Loudoun County has continued making significant progress towards addressing the CHIP's four priority issues and the Board of Supervisors five county improvement strategies. Progress has continued being particularly strong in working to coordinate amongst safety net providers, in addressing nutrition and physical activity, and in laying the groundwork for revising Loudoun County's CHIP.

The completion of Loudoun County's new MAPP process is expected to significantly impact the CHIP's four priority issues and its initiative/improvement strategies. The Loudoun Health Council and Health Department are reviewing the new CHA and will incorporate these changes into a revised 2015 CHIP.
