Aluminum Beverage Cans

- Aluminum beverage cans are accepted at the Loudoun County Recycling Drop-Off Centers (free)
- Check the yellow pages under "scrap metal."

Antifreeze

 Used antifreeze is accepted at the <u>Loudoun County Solid Waste Management Facility Recycling</u> <u>Center</u> (free).

Appliances

- If they are still operating, refer to yellow pages under "churches" and "thrift shops."
- If they are not working, appliances may be disposed of at the <u>Loudoun County Solid Waste</u> <u>Management Facility (for a fee)</u>.
- Disposal of Refrigerators, Freezers, Air Conditioners & Dehumidifiers
 - These appliances cannot be thrown away and contains a chemical coolant or refrigerant that is toxic and considered an ozone depleting substance.
 - The refrigerant must be removed by a certified technician using certified equipment prior to disposal.
 - Refrigerant-containing appliances may be brought to the <u>Loudoun County Solid Waste</u> <u>Management Facility (for a fee; surcharge also applies for removal of refrigerant)</u>.
 - \circ $\,$ Call your Town office or HOA and arrange to speak to the solid waste collector.
 - Arrange transport with the collector.
 - The refrigerant must be removed prior to disposal.
 - Call an appliance store or the manufacturer of the appliance for refrigerant removal services (for a fee).

Bags, Plastic Grocery

- Plastic grocery bags are accepted at most grocery stores.
- Washington Post newspaper delivery bags are also accepted at Giant, Safeway, and Shoppers Food Warehouse.

Batteries

- Automotive batteries are accepted at the <u>Loudoun County Solid Waste Management Facility</u> <u>Recycling Center</u> (free)
- You may also return a used auto battery to the place where you are purchasing a new battery.
- Rechargeable batteries are accepted at Home Depot store entrance. Visit the <u>Rechargeable</u> <u>Battery Recycling Corporation</u> for additional collection locations.
- Alkaline batteries (AA, AAA, C, D, etc.) are accepted at County Household Hazardous Waste Events for recycling (residents only), free of charge. Businesses may participate in the <u>Business</u> <u>Hazardous Waste Program</u> to recycle alkaline batteries for a fee. Other recycling services such as <u>Battery Solutions</u> and <u>Big Green Box</u> are available online for a fee. Visit <u>Call2Recycle</u> to set up your own collection program.
- Button batteries, such as those used in hearing aids and wrist watches may be returned for recycling at the Wal-Mart jewelry counter, or they may be brought to the County's <u>Household</u> <u>Hazardous Waste Collection Events</u> (if they are from a household). <u>Battery Warehouse</u> in Leesburg also accepts these for recycling at no charge.

Bicycles

• Web-search for "Bicycle Recycling" to look for donation or recycling options.

Books

- Hardcover and paperback books are accepted for recycling at each of the <u>Loudoun County</u> <u>Recycling Drop-Off Centers</u>.
- Books are accepted by many used book dealers. Refer to yellow pages under "book dealers used and rare."
- The Loudoun Library Foundation (703-779-2252) accepts used books.
- <u>Adopt-a-Library</u> is dedicated to encouraging and helping people recycle books.
- Pro Quo Books (410-663-0410) buys large quantities of used books, such as those remaining after library book sales.

Bottles & Cans

• Commingled glass bottles and jars, aluminum / steel cans, and plastic bottles are accepted at each of the Loudoun County Recycling Drop-Off Centers.



Cardboard

• Cardboard is accepted at all <u>Loudoun County Recycling Drop-Off Centers</u>. Please breakdown or cut apart large boxes and pieces of cardboard.

CDs & DVDs

- <u>Securis</u> (703-436-1967) in Chantilly recycles CDs and DVDs.

Cell Phones

- Used cell phones may be donated to the <u>Loudoun County Victim Witness Program</u> (703-777-0417).

Christmas / Holiday Lights

• <u>The LED Warehouse</u> recycles old Christmas / holiday lights.

Christmas Trees

Clothes

• <u>Planet Aid</u> containers are available at multiple locations for drop-off of clean clothes and usable shoes. Place items in a plastic bag, tie bag shut, and place inside the yellow drop box. Thrift shops, churches, and other charitable organizations may also accept lightly worn items.

Clothing Hangers, Wire

 Many dry cleaners will accept used wire coat hangers from customers. Consult the yellow pages under "cleaners."



Compact Fluorescent Lamps (CFLs)

- CFLs are the energy efficient light bulbs that screw into light sockets in table lamps and overhead lights.
- Take CFLs to any <u>Home Depot</u> Store customer service desk for recycling.
- Do not dispose with regular garbage because fluorescent lights contain mercury. The Department of General Services, Waste Management Division, has instructions online on how to clean up a broken CFL.
- CFLs may also be taken to the county's <u>Household Hazardous Waste Collection Events</u> (if they are from a household).

Composting

- U.S. Environmental Protection Agency "Composting at Home"
- <u>Loudoun County Solid Waste Management Facility</u> Accepts leaves and grass clippings from Loudoun County residents and businesses for composting, fees apply.
- <u>Key City Compost</u> composting service providing residential and commercial collection of food waste in Loudoun County, fees apply.
- <u>Worm Works LLC</u> Loudoun-based composting service providing residential and commercial collection of food waste in Loudoun County, fees apply.

Computers, I-Phones, & Other Electronics

• For local recycling programs include, visit <u>Local Electronics Recycling Programs</u>.

Fluorescent Light Bulbs or Tubes

- Fluorescent light bulbs are the long narrow tubes that are typically found in commercial overhead lights.
- Visit <u>Know Toxics</u> for recycling options. Do not dispose with regular garbage because fluorescent lights contain mercury.
- The Division of Waste Management has instructions online on how to clean up a broken fluorescent bulb.
- Fluorescent light tubes may also be taken to the county's <u>Household Hazardous Waste</u> <u>Collection Events</u> (if they are from a household).

Furniture

• Furniture is accepted by churches and other charitable organizations.

Helium Tanks

- Helium Tanks can typically be returned to the place of purchase for recycling.
- Helium Tanks may be taken to the Loudoun County Solid Waste Management Facility (for a fee).
 - Must be empty and have valve and relief disc removed.
 - Place in scrap metal recycling area of the landfill.

Junk Mail

• Junk mail is accepted at all Loudoun County Recycling Drop-Off Centers.

Magazines

• Magazines are accepted with newspapers at all <u>Loudoun County Recycling Drop-OffCenters</u>.

Metal, Scrap

- Consult the local yellow pages for Scrap Metals.
- The <u>Loudoun County Solid Waste Management Facility</u> accepts scrap metal, appliances, etc for recycling (<u>for a fee</u>).

Motor Oil

- Used motor oil is accepted at the <u>Loudoun County Solid Waste Management Facility Recycling</u> <u>Center</u> (free).
 - Motor Oil, Engine Oil, Heating Oil, Hydraulic Oil, Kerosene, Lamp Oil, PowerSteering Fluid, and Transmission Fluid are accepted in the Motor Oil Tank.
- Some gasoline service stations accept used motor oil from customers (call first).



Paper, Office

• Office paper is accepted at all Loudoun County Recycling Drop-Off Centers.

Phone Books

• Phone books are accepted at each of the Loudoun County Recycling Drop-Off Centers.

Propane Tanks

- Propane tanks from 1 to 20 pounds (i.e. camp stove size to grill size) are accepted at the Loudoun County Solid Waste Management Facility (county landfill); <u>fees apply</u>.
- Have a larger than grill-size tank? Contact the supplier for return options or the Loudoun County Solid Waste Management Facility for assistance.

Pumpkins

• Visit Pumpkins for Pigs at https://pumpkinsforpigs.org/virginia/ for information on recycling pumpkins.

Smoke Detectors

- Smoke detectors may be thrown away in the trash or taken to the <u>Loudoun County Solid Waste</u> <u>Management Facility</u> (for a fee).
- Many manufacturers offer take-back programs.
- Contact information for many manufacturers can be found through JMAC Supply and their <u>Homeowner Smoke Detector Recycling Program</u>.

Styrofoam

- Styrofoam block is accepted through mail-back programs offered by the <u>Alliance of Foam</u> <u>Packaging Recyclers</u>.
- Styrofoam shipping peanuts are accepted at packing and shipping stores.
- Refer to yellow pages under "shipping masters."
- Styrofoam is not accepted at any of the county Recycling Drop-off Centers.



Televisions

- Televisions are accepted for recycling at the following locations:
 - <u>Securis</u> (Chantilly, VA) hosts monthly residential collection events on the second Saturday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., fees apply.
 - <u>C2 Management</u> (Berryville, VA) accepts televisions and other electronics for recycling, fees apply.
 - <u>Loudoun County Electronics Recycling Events</u> (Leesburg, VA) offered in spring and fall.
- Televisions are accepted for disposal at the <u>Loudoun County Solid Waste Management Facility</u> (for a fee).

Tires

- Tires are accepted at the Loudoun County Solid Waste Management Facility (for a fee)
 - Tires with rims are accepted, but an <u>additional fee</u> will be charged for the rim.
- Dispose of old tires at the place where new tires are purchased (for a fee call first).

Toner Cartridge

- Toner cartridges accepted at Staples and at U.S. Post Office locations. To set up a free toner cartridge collection program from your business, contact Enterprise PC Services in Herndon, Virginia (703-472-1232).
- Mail-back programs accept ink and toner cartridges: <u>Quill Ink Cartridge Recycling</u> and <u>Cartridges</u> for Kids.

VHS and Cassette Tapes

- VHS tapes are not considered hazardous and may be disposed as regular trash.
- If you want to recycle them contact <u>Green Disk</u> or by calling 800-305-3475.
