Traveling With Pets

Make sure you have all the supplies and paperwork you need for a safe and happy trip!



Did you pack the necessities? For all animals make sure you have enough food, water and any medicine that they need. Identification such as a collar with tags, microchip number and rabies certification are important as well. Make an extra copy of this information, just in case!



What will your animal be traveling in? Crate, carrier or trailer - make sure it is secure and up to date on inspections if applicable. It is always a good idea to label your crate/carrier with your contact information and your pet's information as well.


Are you crossing state lines? Check Code sections 3.2-5902 which outlines requirements for a CVI (Certificate of Veterinary Inspection). If you are just passing through the state and your pet is properly confined/under control- no CVI is needed. If you are transporting for other purposes, such as breeding, a CVI may be needed.



Is your paperwork in order? Vet information and records and/or current Coggins tests for horses, RFID tags for bovine, sheep, goats and pigs along with tuberculosis or scrapie status are all important to have on hand.



Double check the specifics. Is your carrier approved by the specific airline? Is the hotel you are staying in pet friendly? If you are traveling internationally be sure to start the process early and work with your vet to ensure your pet
