



- Scientific and Defensible Method to Understand Community Needs
- Administered by Mail/Phone/Web
- Methodology Allows High Return Rate (25%-35%)
- Total of 907 Completed Surveys, 95%
 Level of Confidence with a Margin of Error of +/- 3.5% (Goal was 800)
- Equitable Distribution Across Sub-park Planning Areas






Park Visitation and Condition



by percentage of respondents that have used parks (without "don't know")



by percentage of respondents that visited parks (without "not provided")








Program Participation and Quality





 The National Benchmark for Program Participation is 32%.





by percentage of respondents that participated in programs (without "not provided")


















Estimated Number of Households Whose Needs for Programs Are Partly Met or Not Met

by number of households based on an estimated 139,982 households in Loudoun County, VA










Estimated Number of Households Whose Needs for Facilities Are Partly Met or Not Met

by number of households based on an estimated 139,982 households in Loudoun County, VA







by percentage of respondents using a scale of 1 to 5, where 5 means your needs are "Very Supportive" and 1 means "Not Supportive"



Needs Analysis Methodology

- Quantitative Data Includes the Local Demographics, Recreation Trends, Statistically Valid Survey and the Online Survey.
- Qualitative Data Includes Community Input via Stakeholder Interviews, Staff Input, Virtual Community Meeting, the Project Website, and Planning Team Observations.



Needs Analysis Methodology (continued)

- A Weighted Scoring System is Used to Determine the Priorities for Facilities and Programs and Services.
- The Results of the Priority Ranking are Tabulated into Three Categories: High Priority, Medium Priority, and Low Priority.


