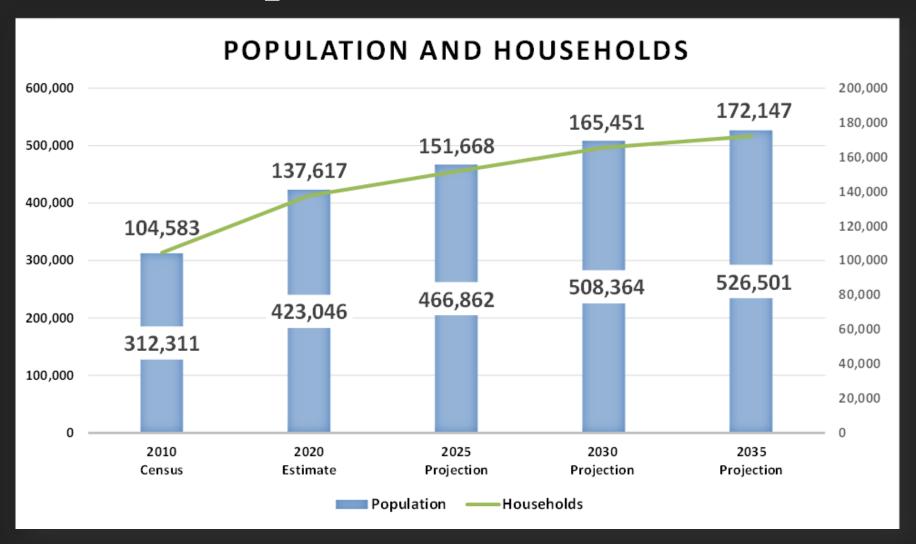

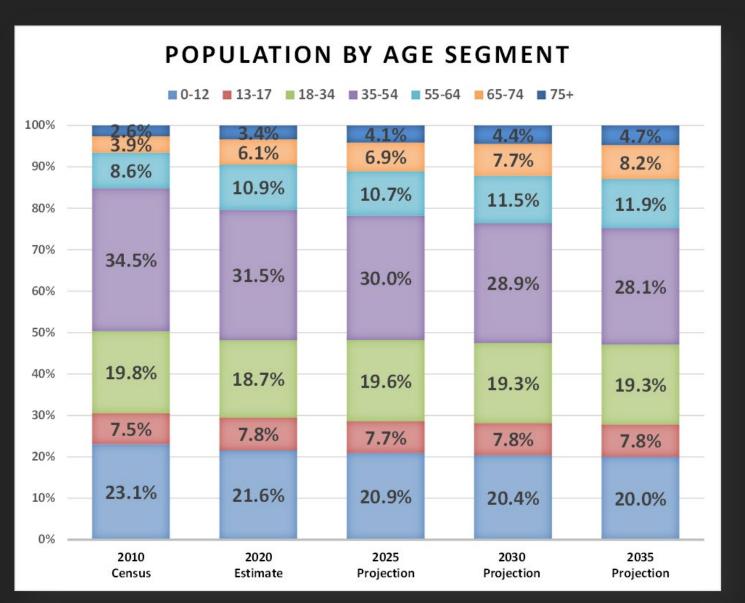


Population Growth

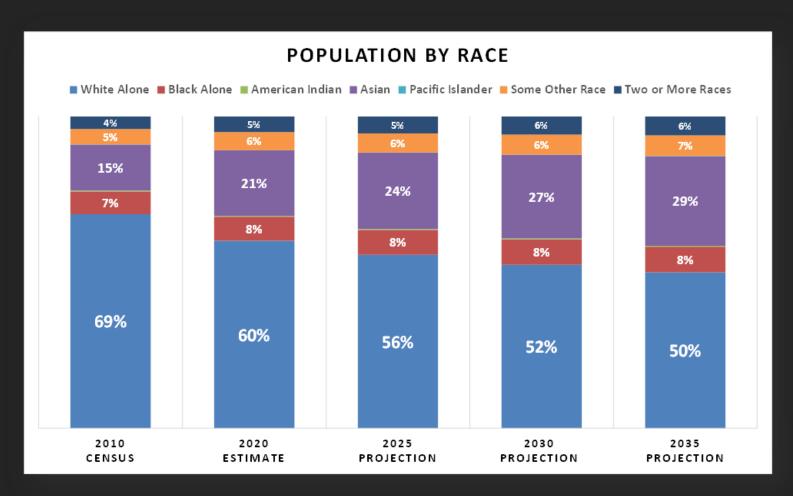


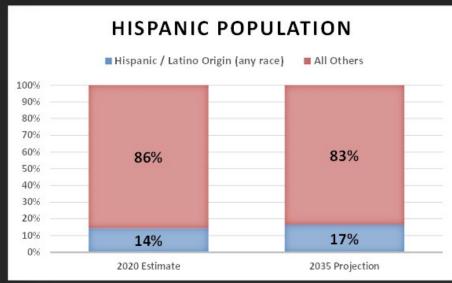

Level of Service Methodology

<u>Population based</u> standards are developed using a combination of local, regional and national resources, including:

- Capital Needs Assessment (CNA) Standards
- Population Growth
- Current Inventory and Condition Ratings
- National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA) guidelines

- Recreation participation rates
- Prioritization of Community Need
- Financial Sustainability

Level of Service Methodology

Population based standards are not developed for:

- Natural Area Park Acreage
- Trail Miles

Natural Area Park acquisition is based on resource location and opportunity to acquire this typology of park land rather than county population

<u>Trail Miles</u> is based on developing a connected network rather than county population
