

About The NCS™

The National Community Survey[™] (The NCS[™]) report is about the "livability" of Loudoun County. The phrase "livable community" is used here to evoke a place that is not simply habitable, but that is desirable. It is not only where people do live, but where they want to live.

Great communities are partnerships of the government, private sector, communitybased organizations and residents, all geographically connected. The NCS captures residents' opinions considering ten central facets of a community:

- Economy
- Mobility
- Community Design
- Utilities
- Safety
- Natural Environment
- Parks and Recreation
- Health and Wellness
- Education, Arts and Culture
- Inclusivity and Engagement





Overview of Results

Residents continue to rate the quality of life in Loudoun County highly.

About 9 in 10 Loudoun County residents gave excellent or good ratings to the overall quality of life in the County and Loudoun County as a place to live and to raise children. About 85% gave favorable marks to the overall image or reputation of the County, which was higher than the national average. At least 8 in 10 respondents would recommend living in Loudoun County to someone who asked and planned to remain in the County for the next five years. These ratings were similar to those observed in 2020 and to national benchmarks.

Economy garners strong ratings, though affordability in the County is an issue.

Ratings within the facet of Economy for Loudoun County tended to be exceptional and higher than the national averages. More than 8 in 10 residents gave excellent or good reviews to the overall economic health of the County and the overall quality of business and service establishments in the County (an increase since 2018), and about 8 in 10 were pleased with the variety of business and service establishments, shopping opportunities, and Loudoun County as a place to visit and to work. About 7 in 10 positively rated economic development and employment opportunities. All of these ratings were higher than the national benchmarks. However, similarly to 2018, only 2 in 10 residents gave favorable evaluations to cost of living and the availability of affordability quality housing. 81% of respondents thought it was essential or very important for Loudoun County to focus on cost of living/cost of housing in the next two years.

Community Design presents an opportunity for the County.

Respondents indicated the facet of Community Design as relatively higher in importance and lower in quality than the other facets of community livability. While ratings within this facet were similar to national averages, there were several changes observed between 2018 and 2020. Ratings increased for the overall design or layout of Loudoun County's residential and commercial areas (61% excellent or good), code enforcement (60%), and land use, planning, and zoning (43%), while decreases were seen for the overall appearance of the County (80%), public places where people want to spend time (62%), and the overall quality of new development in Loudoun County (55%).

COVID-19 has had a likely impact on 2020 ratings.

When interpreting this year's survey results, it is important to keep in mind that some ratings changes since 2018 may be explained at least in part by the coronavirus crisis. Examples of relevant ratings changes over time include opportunities to attend special events and festivals, cultural/arts/music activities, opportunities to participate in community matters, traffic flow on major streets, and ease of travel by car, among others.

Facets of Livability

Every jurisdiction must balance limited resources while meeting resident needs and striving to optimize community livability. To this end, it is helpful to know what aspects of the community are most important to residents and which they perceive as being of higher or lower quality. It is especially helpful to know when a facet of livability is considered of high importance but rated as lower quality, as this should be a top priority to address.

To help guide County staff and officials with decisions on future resource allocation, resident ratings of the importance of services were compared to their ratings of the quality of these services. To identify the services perceived by residents to have relatively lower quality at the same time as relatively higher importance, all services were ranked from highest perceived quality to lowest perceived quality and from highest perceived importance to lowest perceived importance. Some services were in the top half of both lists (higher quality and higher importance); some were in the top half of one list but the bottom half of the other (higher quality and lower importance or lower quality and higher importance); and some services were in the bottom half of both lists.

Services receiving quality ratings of excellent or good by 79% or more of respondents were considered of "higher quality" and those with ratings lower than 79% were considered to be of "lower quality." Services were classified as "more important" if they were rated as essential or very important by 79% or more of respondents. Services were rated as "less important" if they received a rating of less than 79%. This classification uses the median ratings for quality and importance to divide the services in half.

The quadrants in the figure on the following page show which community facets were given higher or lower importance ratings (up-down) and which had higher or lower quality ratings (right-left). Services categorized as higher in importance and lower in quality may warrant further investigation to see if changes to their delivery are necessary.






FIGURE 6: GOVERNMENT PERFORMANCE AND SERVICES





Overall Design or Layout of Loudoun County's Residential and Commercial Areas




FIGURE 16: COMMUNITY DESIGN






FIGURE 19: UTILITES - SUMMARY




FIGURE 20: SAFETY IN LOUDOUN COUNTY






FIGURE 24: NATURAL ENVIRONMENT - SUMMARY




FIGURE 25: PARKS AND RECREATION





Overall Opportunities for Education, Culture, and the Arts In Loudoun County







FIGURE 31: EDUCATION, ARTS AND CULTURE - SUMMARY



FIGURE 34: RESIDENTS' PARTICIPATION LEVELS




FIGURE 35: RESIDENTS' PARTICIPATION IN LAST 12 MONTHS- SUMMARY




FIGURE 38: TYPE OF PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION USE

If your household has used any of these, please indicate for what reasons they were used.





FIGURE 39: HOUSEHOLD IMPACTS OF COVID-19

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About the Demographic Comparisons

The National Community Survey[™] (The NCS[™]) is a collaborative effort between National Research Center, Inc. (NRC) and the International City/County Management Association (ICMA). The survey and its administration are standardized to assure high quality research methods and directly comparable results across The NCS communities. Communities conducting The NCS can choose from a number of optional services to customize the reporting of survey results. Loudoun County's Comparisons by Demographic Subgroups is part of a larger project for the County and additional reports are available under separate cover. Understanding the Tables

For most of the questions, one number appears for each question. Responses have been summarized to show only the proportion of respondents giving a certain answer; for example, the percent of respondents who rated the quality of life as "excellent" or "good," or the percent of respondents who participated in an activity at least once. It should be noted that when a table that does include all responses (not a single number) for a question that only permitted a single response does not total to exactly 100%, it is due to the common practice of percentages being rounded to the nearest whole number.

The subgroup comparison tables contain the crosstabulations of survey questions by selected respondent characteristics. Chi-square or ANOVA tests of significance were applied to these breakdowns of survey questions. A "p-value" of 0.05 or less indicates that there is less than a 5% probability that differences observed between groups are due to chance; or in other words, a greater than 95% probability that the differences observed in the selected categories of the sample represent "real" differences among those populations. As subgroups vary in size and each group (and each comparison to another group) has a unique margin of error, statistical testing is used to determine whether differences between subgroups are statistically significant.

Each column in the following tables is labeled with a letter for each subgroup being compared. The "Overall" column, which shows the ratings for all respondents, also has a column designation of "(A)", but no statistical tests were done for the overall rating.

For each pair of subgroups ratings within a row (a single question item) that has a statistically significant difference, an uppercase letter denoting significance is shown in the cell with the larger column proportion. The letter denotes the subgroup with the smaller column proportion from which it is statistically different. Subgroups that have no uppercase letter denotation in their column and that are also not referred to in any other column were not statistically different.

For example, in Table 1 on the following page, respondents who had lived in Loudoun County for 11 years or more (C) or who had annual household income of \$100,000 or less (A) were less likely to recommend living in Loudoun County to someone who asked than residents who had lived in the County for 10 years or less (A and B) or who earned \$100,000 or more (B and C). In another example, residents who were white alone, not Hispanic (A) tended to give higher ratings to the overall quality of life in Loudoun County, and were more likely to remain in Loudoun County for the next five years, than residents who were Hispanic and/or another race (B).

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About the Geographic Comparisons

The National Community Survey[™] (The NCS[™]) is a collaborative effort between National Research Center, Inc. (NRC) and the International City/County Management Association (ICMA). The survey and its administration are standardized to assure high quality research methods and directly comparable results across The NCS communities. Communities conducting The NCS can choose from a number of optional services to customize the reporting of survey results. Loudoun County's Comparisons by Geographic Subgroups is part of a larger project for the County and additional reports are available under separate cover. This report discusses differences in opinion of survey respondents by County District.

Eight districts were tracked for comparison and the number of completed surveys for each are in the figure below. The number of households selected to receive the survey in each District was proportionate to the total number of households in each District.



Understanding the Tables

For most of the questions, one number appears for each question. Responses have been summarized to show only the proportion of respondents giving a certain answer; for example, the percent of respondents who rated the quality of life as "excellent" or "good," or the percent of respondents who participated in an activity at least once. It should be noted that when a table that does include all responses (not a single number) for a question that only permitted a single response does not total to exactly 100%, it is due to the common practice of percentages being rounded to the nearest whole number.

The subgroup comparison tables contain the crosstabulations of survey questions by District. Chisquare or ANOVA tests of significance were applied to these breakdowns of survey questions. A "p-value" of 0.05 or less indicates that there is less than a 5% probability that differences observed between groups are due to chance; or in other words, a greater than 95% probability that the differences observed in the selected categories of the sample represent "real" differences among those populations. As subgroups vary in size and each group (and each comparison to another group) has a unique margin of error, statistical testing is used to determine whether differences between subgroups are statistically significant.

Each column in the following tables is labeled with a letter for each subgroup being compared. The "Overall" column, which shows the ratings for all respondents, also has a column designation of "(A)", but no statistical tests were done for the overall rating.

For each pair of subgroup ratings within a row (a single question item) that has a statistically significant difference, an uppercase letter denoting significance is shown in the cell with the larger column proportion. The letter denotes the subgroup with the smaller column proportion from which it is statistically different. Subgroups that have no uppercase letter denotation in their column and that are also not referred to in any other column were not statistically different.

For example, in Table 1 on the following page, respondents in Ashburn (B) were significantly more likely than those in all other districts (A, C, D, E, F, G, and H) to recommend living in Loudoun County to someone who asked, as denoted by the "A C D E F G H" listed in the cell of the ratings for Ashburn. As another example, in Table 2, residents in Catoctin (E) were significantly less likely than those in all other districts to give positive ratings to overall confidence in County government, as denoted by the "E" in each cell for all other districts.

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About Trends Over Time

The National Community Survey[™] (The NCS[™]) is a collaborative effort between National Research Center, Inc. (NRC) and the International City/County Management Association (ICMA). The survey and its administration are standardized to assure high quality research methods and directly comparable results across The NCS communities. The NCS captures residents' opinions considering ten central facets of a community:

- Economy
- Mobility
- Community Design
- Utilities
- Safety
- Natural Environment
- Parks and Recreation
- Health and Wellness
- Education, Arts and Culture
- Inclusivity and Engagement

This report discusses trends over time, comparing the 2020 ratings for Loudoun County to its previous survey results in 2018. Additional reports and technical appendices are available under separate cover.

Understanding the Tables

Trend data for Loudoun County represent important comparison data and should be examined for improvements or declines¹. Deviations from stable trends over time, especially, represent opportunities for understanding how local policies, programs or public information may have affected residents' opinions.

Meaningful differences between survey years have been noted within the following tables as being "higher" or "lower" if the differences are greater than five percentage points between the 2018 and 2020 surveys, otherwise the comparisons between 2018 and 2020 are noted as being "similar." Additionally, the benchmark comparisons for the current survey results are presented for reference.

Overall, ratings in Loudoun County for 2020 generally remained stable. Of the 106 items for which comparisons were available, 64 items were rated similarly in 2018 and 2020, 24 items showed a decrease in ratings and 18 showed an increase in ratings. **It is important to note that the COVID-19 pandemic of 2020 is likely to have effected residents' 2020 ratings; this context should be kept in mind while evaluating changes over time.** Notable trends over time included the following:

- Ratings increases were noted in 2020 for several aspects of Mobility, including traffic enforcement, traffic flow on major streets, ease of travel by car in the County, ease of public parking, and others. Rates of use of public transportation and carpooling declined from 2018 to 2020.
- Several ratings changes were noted in the facet of Community Design: ratings increased for land use, planning, and zoning, code enforcement, and the overall design or layout of Loudoun County's residential and commercial areas, while decreases were seen for the overall quality of new development in Loudoun County, the overall appearance of the County, and public places where people want to spend time.
- In Parks and Recreation, respondents' 2020 scores for availability of paths and walking trails increased substantially (17%), but decreased for County parks, recreation centers of facilities, and recreation programs or classes.
- Other declines from 2018 to 2020 were noted for various aspects of Education, Arts, and Culture (e.g., K-12 education and overall opportunities for education, culture, and the arts) and Inclusivity and Engagement (e.g., opportunities to participate in community matters and opportunities to volunteer).

¹ In 2020, The NCS survey was updated to include new and refreshed items. Consequently, some of the trends may be impacted due to wording modifications that could have potentially altered the meaning of the item for the respondent.

Appendix B: Benchmark Comparisons

Comparison Data

NRC's database of comparative resident opinion is comprised of resident perspectives gathered in surveys from over 600 communities whose residents evaluated the same kinds of topics on The National Community Survey. The comparison evaluations are from the most recent survey completed in each community; most communities conduct surveys every year or in alternating years. NRC adds the latest results quickly upon survey completion, keeping the benchmark data fresh and relevant. The communities in the database represent a wide geographic and population range. Loudoun County chose to have comparisons made to the entire database and a subset of similar jurisdictions from the database selected by County staff for having characteristics similar to those of Loudoun County.

Interpreting the Results

Ratings are compared when there are at least five communities in which a similar question was asked. Where comparisons are available, four columns are provided in the table. The first column is Loudoun County's "percent positive." The percent positive is the combination of the top two most positive response options (i.e., "excellent" and "good," "very safe" and "somewhat safe," etc.), or, in the case of resident behaviors/participation, the percent positive represents the proportion of respondents indicating "yes" or participating in an activity at least once a month. The second column is the rank assigned to Loudoun County's rating among communities where a similar question was asked. The third column is the number of communities that asked a similar question. The final column shows the comparison of Loudoun County's rating to the benchmark.

In that final column, Loudoun County's results are noted as being "higher" than the benchmark, "lower" than the benchmark or "similar" to the benchmark, meaning that the average rating given by Loudoun County residents is statistically similar to or different (greater or lesser) than the

benchmark. Being rated as "higher" or "lower" than the benchmark means that Loudoun County's average rating for a particular item was more than 10 points different than the benchmark. If a rating was "much higher" or "much lower," then Loudoun County's average rating was more than 20 points different when compared to the benchmark.

Appendix C: Detailed Survey Methods

The National Community Survey[™] (The NCS[™]), conducted by National Research Center, Inc., was developed to provide communities an accurate, affordable and easy way to assess and interpret resident opinion about important local topics. Standardization of common questions and survey methods provide the rigor to assure valid results, and each community has enough flexibility to construct a customized version of The NCS.

Results offer insight into residents' perspectives about the community as a whole, including local amenities, services, public trust, resident participation and other aspects of the community in order to support budgeting, land use and strategic planning and communication with residents. Resident demographic characteristics permit comparison to the Census as well as comparison of results for different subgroups of residents. Loudoun County funded this research. Please contact Megan Cox of the Loudoun County Program Evaluation & Research Department at megan.cox@loudoun.gov if you have any questions about the survey.

Survey Validity

The question of survey validity has two parts: 1) how can a community be confident that the results from those who completed the questionnaire are representative of the results that would have been obtained had the survey been administered to the entire population? and 2) how closely do the perspectives recorded on the survey reflect what residents really believe or do?

To answer the first question, the best survey research practices were used for the resources spent to ensure that the results from the survey respondents reflect the opinions of residents in the entire community. These practices include:

- Using a mail-out/mail-back methodology, which typically gets a higher response rate than phone for the same dollars spent. A higher response rate lessens the worry that those who did not respond are different than those who did respond.
- Selecting households at random within the community to receive the survey to ensure that the households selected to receive the survey are representative of the larger community.
- Over-sampling multi-family housing units to improve response from hard-to-reach, lower income or younger apartment dwellers.
- Selecting the respondent within the household using an unbiased sampling procedure; in this case, the "birthday method." The cover letter included an instruction requesting that the respondent in the household be the adult (18 years old or older) who most recently had a birthday, irrespective of year of birth.
- Contacting potential respondents three times to encourage response from people who may have different opinions or habits than those who would respond with only a single prompt.
- Inviting response in a compelling manner (using appropriate letterhead/logos and a signature of a visible leader) to appeal to recipients' sense of civic responsibility.
- Providing a pre-addressed, postage-paid return envelope.
- Offering the survey in Spanish or other language when requested by a given community.
- Weighting the results to reflect the demographics of the population.

The answer to the second question about how closely the perspectives recorded on the survey reflect what residents really believe or do is more complex. Resident responses to surveys are influenced by a variety of factors. For questions about service quality, residents' expectations for service quality play a role as well as the "objective" quality of the service provided, the way the resident perceives the entire community (that is, the context in which the service is provided), the scale on which the resident is asked to record his or her opinion and, of course, the opinion, itself, that a resident holds about the service. Similarly a resident's report of certain behaviors is colored by what he or she believes is the socially desirable response (e.g., reporting tolerant behaviors toward "oppressed groups," likelihood of voting for a tax increase for services to poor people, use of alternative modes of travel to work besides the single occupancy vehicle), his or her memory of the actual behavior (if it is not a question speculating about future actions, like a vote), his or her confidence that he or she can be honest without suffering any negative consequences (thus the need for anonymity) as well as the actual behavior itself.

How closely survey results come to recording the way a person really feels or behaves often is measured by the coincidence of reported behavior with observed current behavior (e.g., driving habits), reported intentions to behave with observed future behavior (e.g., voting choices) or reported opinions about current community quality with objective characteristics of the community (e.g., feelings of safety correlated with rates of crime). There is a body of scientific literature that has investigated the relationship between reported behaviors and actual behaviors. Well-conducted surveys, by and large, do capture true respondent behaviors or intentions to act with great accuracy. Predictions of voting outcomes tend to be quite accurate using survey research, as do reported behaviors that are not about highly sensitive issues (e.g., family abuse or other illegal or morally sanctioned activities). For self-reports about highly sensitive issues, statistical adjustments can be made to correct for the respondents' tendency to report what they think the "correct" response should be.

Research on the correlation of resident opinion about service quality and "objective" ratings of service quality vary, with some showing stronger relationships than others. NRC's own research has demonstrated that residents who report the lowest ratings of street repair live in communities with objectively worse street conditions than those who report high ratings of street repair (based on road quality, delay in street repair, number of road repair employees). Similarly, the lowest rated fire services appear to be "objectively" worse than the highest rated fire services (expenditures per capita, response time, "professional" status of firefighters, breadth of services and training provided). Resident opinion commonly reflects objective performance data but is an important measure on its own. NRC principals have written, "If you collect trash three times a day but residents think that your trash haul is lousy, you still have a problem."

Selecting Survey Recipients

"Sampling" refers to the method by which households were chosen to receive the survey. All households within Loudoun County were eligible to participate in the survey. A list of all households within the zip codes serving Loudoun County was purchased from Go-Dog Direct based on updated listings from the United States Postal Service. Since some of the zip codes that serve Loudoun County households may also serve addresses that lie outside of the community, the exact geographic location of each housing unit was compared to community boundaries using the most current municipal boundary file (updated on a quarterly basis) and addresses located outside of Loudoun County boundaries were removed from consideration. Each address identified as being within County boundaries was further identified as being within one of the eight County Districts.




Figure 1: Location of Survey Recipients

To choose the 3,000 survey recipients, a systematic sampling method was applied to the list of households previously screened for geographic location. Systematic sampling is a procedure whereby a complete list of all possible households is culled, selecting every *Nth* one, giving each eligible household a known probability of selection, until the appropriate number of households is selected. Multi-family housing units were selected at a higher rate as residents of this type of housing typically respond at lower rates to surveys than do those in single-family housing units. Figure 1 displays a map of the households selected to receive the survey. In general, because of the random sampling techniques used, the displayed sampling density will closely mirror the overall housing unit density (which may be different from the population density). While the theory of probability assumes no bias in selection, there may be some minor variations in practice (meaning, an area with only 15% of the housing units might be selected at an actual rate that is slightly above or below that).

An individual within each household was selected using the birthday method. The birthday method selects a person within the household by asking the "person whose birthday has most recently passed" to complete the questionnaire. The underlying assumption in this method is that day of birth has no relationship to the way people respond to surveys. This instruction was contained in the cover letter accompanying the questionnaire.

In addition to the scientific, random selection of households, a link to an online "opt-in" survey was publicized and posted to the Loudoun County website. This opt-in survey was identical to the scientific survey and open to all County residents.

Survey Administration and Response

Selected households received three mailings, one week apart, beginning on December 20, 2020. The first mailing was a prenotification postcard announcing the upcoming survey. The next mailing contained a letter from the County Administrator inviting the household to participate, a questionnaire and a postage-paid return envelope. The final mailing contained a reminder letter, another survey and a postage-paid return envelope. The second cover letter asked those who had not completed the survey to do so and those who had already done so to refrain from turning in another survey. The survey was available in English. Both cover letters included a URL through which the residents selected for the mail survey could choose to respond online rather than by mail. The cover letters also contained paragraphs in Spanish instructing participants to complete the Spanish version of the survey online. Loudoun County chose to augment their administration of The NCS with several additional services, including demographic and geographic subgroup comparisons and custom benchmark comparisons. The results of these additional services have been provided under separate cover. Completed surveys were collected over the following seven weeks. The online "opt-in" survey became available to all residents on January 18, 2021 and remained open for two weeks.

About 1% of the 3,000 surveys mailed were returned because the housing unit was vacant or the postal service was unable to deliver the survey as addressed. Of the remaining 2,971 households that received the survey, 556 completed the survey, providing an overall response rate of 19%. Of the 556 completed surveys, 243 were completed online, and two of the online responses were completed in Spanish. Additionally, responses were tracked by geographic subarea; response rates by District ranged from 15% to 26%. The response rates were calculated using AAPOR's response rate #2¹ for mailed surveys of unnamed persons. Additionally, 912 residents completed the online opt-in survey, providing a grand total of 1,468 completed surveys.

Confidence Intervals

It is customary to describe the precision of estimates made from surveys by a "level of confidence" and accompanying "confidence interval" (or margin of error). A traditional level of confidence, and the one used here, is 95%. The 95% confidence interval can be any size and quantifies the sampling error or imprecision of the survey results because some residents' opinions are relied on to estimate all residents' opinions.²

² A 95% confidence interval indicates that for every 100 random samples of this many residents, 95 of the confidence intervals created will include the "true" population response. This theory is applied in practice to mean that the "true" perspective of the target population lies within the confidence interval created for a single survey. For example, if 75% of residents rate a service as "excellent" or "good," then the 4% margin of error (for the 95% confidence interval) indicates that the range of likely responses for the entire community is between 71% and 79%. This source of uncertainty is called sampling error. In addition to sampling error, other sources of error may affect any survey, including the non-response of residents with opinions different from survey responders. Though standardized on The NCS, on other surveys, differences in question wording, order, translation and data entry, as examples, can lead to somewhat varying results.

The margin of error for the Loudoun County survey is no greater than plus or minus three³ percentage points around any given percent reported for all respondents (1,468 completed surveys).

For subgroups of responses, the margin of error increases because the number of respondents for the subgroup is smaller.

Survey Processing (Data Entry)

Upon receipt, completed surveys were assigned a unique identification number. Additionally, each survey was reviewed and "cleaned" as necessary. For example, a question may have asked a respondent to pick two items out of a list of five, but the respondent checked three; in this case, NRC would use protocols to randomly choose two of the three selected items for inclusion in the dataset.

All surveys then were entered twice into an electronic dataset; any discrepancies were resolved in comparison to the original survey form. Range checks as well as other forms of quality control were also performed.

NRC uses Polco, an online public engagement tool designed primarily for local governments, to collect online survey data. The Polco platform includes many features of online survey tools, but also includes elements tailored to the civic environment. For example, like NRC's mailed surveys, surveys on Polco are presented with the County name, logo (or other image) and a description, so residents understand who is asking for input and why. Optionally, Polco can also verify respondents with local public data to ensure respondents are residents or voters. More generally, an advantage of online programming and data gathering is that it allows for more rigid control of the data format, making extensive data cleaning unnecessary.

Survey Data Weighting

Upon completion of data collection for both the scientific (probability) and nonscientific open participation online opt-in (non-probability) surveys, data were compared in order to determine whether it was appropriate to combine, or blend, both datasets together. In the case of Loudoun County, characteristics of respondents to the non-probability survey were similar to the probability survey, in both respondent trait and opinion, indicating that the two datasets could be blended. This decision reflects a growing trend in survey research toward integration of traditional scientific probability survey respondents and non-probability survey respondents (opt-in).

The demographic characteristics of the survey respondents were compared to those found in the 2010 Census and American Community Survey estimates for adults in Loudoun County. The primary objective of weighting survey data is to make the survey respondents reflective of the

³ Although this has become the traditional way to describe survey research precision, when opt-in results are blended with scientific results, assumptions about randomness of responses are not the same as when results come only from the random sample. Consequently other terms sometimes are used in place of "confidence interval" or "margin of error," such as "credibility intervals." We hew to the traditional way of describing sample-driven uncertainty while we work with the industry to sort out the best ways to describe these new approaches.

larger population of the community. Both survey datasets were weighted independently and then combined into one final dataset. The characteristics used for weighting were housing tenure (rent or own), housing unit type (attached or detached), race, ethnicity, and sex and age. A further adjustment was made such that the scientific and opt-in data were each represented equally in the final dataset. No adjustments were made for design effects. The results of the weighting scheme are presented in the following table.

Survey Data Analysis and Reporting

The survey dataset was analyzed using the Statistical Package for the Social Sciences (SPSS). For the most part, the percentages presented in the reports represent the "percent positive." The percent positive is the combination of the top two most positive response options (i.e., "excellent" and "good," "very safe" and "somewhat safe," "essential" and "very important," etc.), or, in the case of resident behaviors/participation, the percent positive represents the proportion of respondents indicating "yes" or participating in an activity at least once a month.

On many of the questions in the survey respondents may answer "don't know." The proportion of respondents giving this reply is shown in the full set of responses included in Appendix A. However, these responses have been removed from the analyses presented in the reports. In other words, the tables and graphs display the responses from respondents who had an opinion about a specific item. When a table for a question that only permitted a single response does not total to exactly 100%, it is due to the common practice of percentages being rounded to the nearest whole number.
