

Proposed Amendment to the Codified Ordinances of Loudoun County, Chapter 612, to Prohibit Private Ownership of Exotic and Venomous Animals

Public Information Session January 5, 2023

What is the proposal?

Prohibiting private ownership of certain exotic and venomous species of animals, including:

- Venomous snakes
- Hybrid canines
- Non-native species (e.g. koalas or kangaroos)
- Primates (e.g. baboons and marmosets)
- Other wild and/or venomous animals such as scorpions and armadillos









Exotic and venomous animals held in residential settings present a public safety risk

- Risk of escaping and inflicting harm
- Risk of zoonotic diseases
- Risk to first responders entering premises
- Risk to local ecosystems and wildlife



Proposed Exemptions

- Common pets, including ferrets, guinea pigs, hedgehogs, etc.
- Licensed exhibitors
 (e.g. zoos), rehabilitators, others
 with state or federal permits
- Lawfully obtained, nonvenomous reptiles and amphibians
- Lawfully obtained exotic birds and ratites (parrots, ostriches, emu)





Grandfather Clause

Residents currently possessing species prohibited under the proposed ordinance (but otherwise possessing and caring for them lawfully) may retain ownership for the life of that animal, if it is registered with Loudoun County Animal Services and housing is inspected.
